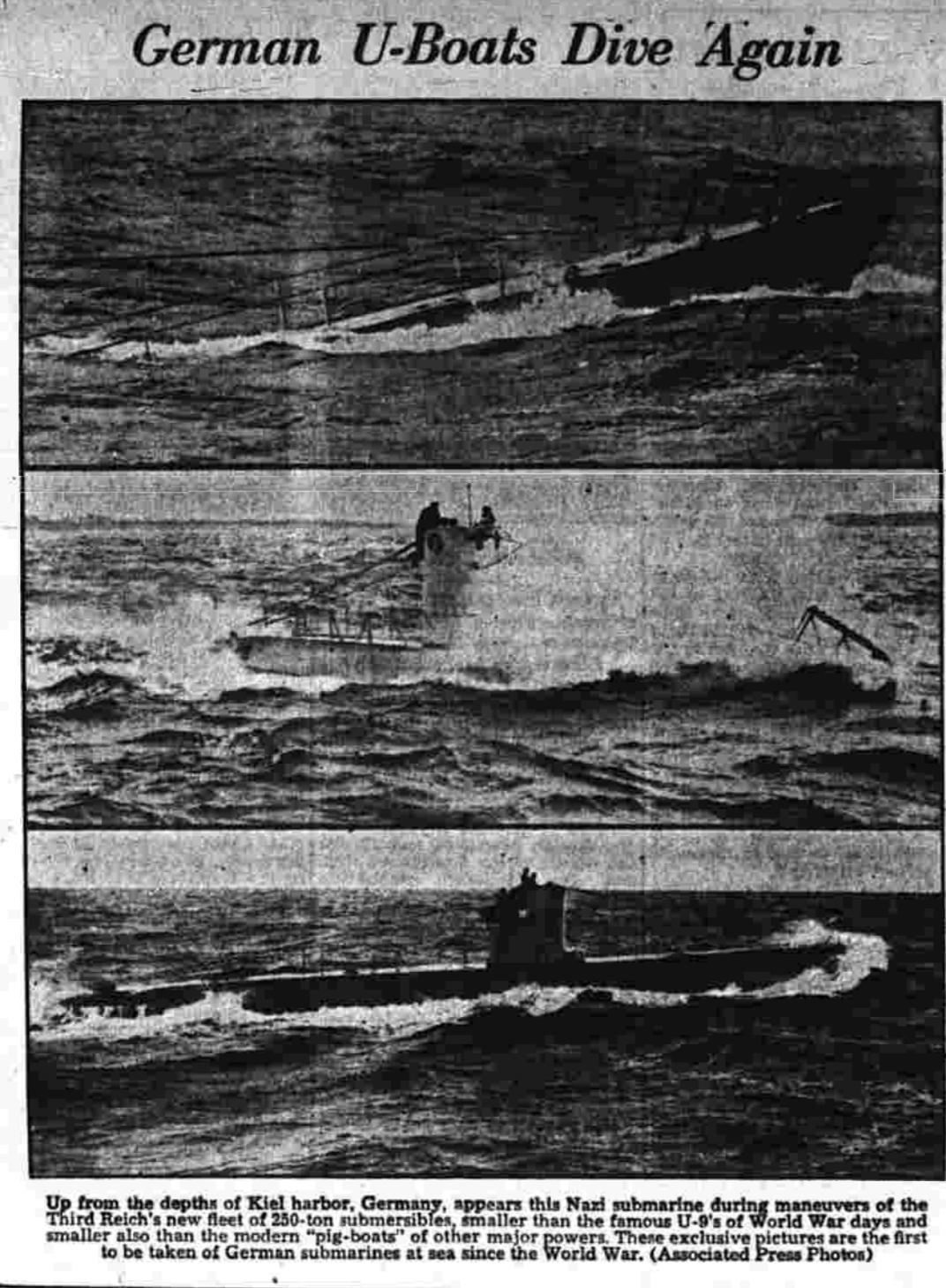

### Reading And Writing

The "Provincial Lady" has been to Russia, and in spite of innumerable exasperations, she emerged with a manuscript, same having been tucked between an elastic belt and her spine so that the always deliberate Russian customs officials would not find it.

This has been published as "Visit the Soviets," and although it is almost wholly lacking in statistics and the provincial lady was only a few months in Russia, it seems to sum up the situation rather well. E. M. Deland is a trained observer, a fair person, and what is extremely important, is a book and not a magazine. It is a book of information and degree of evasion which seems to leave most writers on Russia quite cold. Quite dull, too, for that matter.

Miss Deland began to write a Russian experience with a stay on a collective farm, really a commune in itself. It bore the unexpected name of the Seattle collective farm, and was written by some people who called themselves Americans. At the time Miss Deland was there, there were no real Americans on the farm, those who used that name being exclusively foreigners who had been for a time in the United States some of whom had become citizens of this country.

After leaving the farm she explored the more conventional centers and penetrated the south—in fact, she left Russia by boat from Odessa. She left behind it and her husband. She had wanted to speak her mind about things, and she had been invited to do it. The Russians with whom she could make contact would neither listen nor argue, a criticism of the regime, however kind, always was evaded by some remark of some of the cut and dried formulas from which she could not escape.

Miss Deland was not pleased with what she saw. It seemed to her rather a hard country. Freedom of thought and action, she had been impressed her more, was there an understanding of freedom. A dogmatic, but not a just, dirty, rather rude and silly prejudice with whom she seemed to sum up her impressions.

### The Family Doctor

MEASLES RARELY SPREAD BY INDIRECT CONTACT, AS EXPOSURE HARMES VIRUS

Measles is spread mostly through direct contact of persons who have not had the disease, with those who have it. The substance that carries the infection apparently is present in the secretion of the nose and of the throat.

We do not happen to know definitely the cause of measles. We do know, however, that it is infectious. This can be shown in various ways. For example, injection of the blood of one who does not have the disease will cause the second person to contract the disease. However, nose and mouth secretions of those who have the disease may be used to produce the disease in others.

Measles apparently is the only animal who ordinarily has measles, but experimental measles can be produced in monkeys. The virus of measles probably is some substance or organism so small that it cannot be seen with even the highest powered microscope.

We know from studies made by investigators that the virus which carries measles is injured by exposure to air and sunlight. For this reason, measles seldom is transmitted from a sick person to another by a third person or an animal. In other words, should a visitor get over the virus on his hands or his clothing, the virus may die during the time spent in going from one person to another. For this reason, doctors and nurses who care for measles victims may visit other patients without danger of transmitting the disease, provided reasonable precautions are taken.

This, it is wise to wash the hands thoroughly after visiting a patient. For the same reason, bed linen should be washed and bed room should be put on a clean gown before leaving the room and remove the gown after leaving. The bedding, and other materials used in caring for a child sick with measles should be boiled before they are again used.

There are some strange things about measles that make it different from diphtheria or scarlet fever. Few adults are likely to catch these last-named diseases, yet an adult may catch measles from a child; he has not already had the disease.

Measles is particularly virulent when it is introduced into a population in which there has been no measles for a long time. For example, the measles virus was introduced on record occurred in the Faroe Islands in 1926. The islanders, 6000 had the measles in six months.

In 1770, measles broke out on the Sandwich Islands. There were 150,000 people, and 40,000 of them died in four months. Severity of the infection was partly to the intensity with which measles was a population in which there is no immunity.

It has been suggested, however, that the cause of the deaths were due to the fact that so many children were sick at the same time that there were not enough with people to care for them. Indeed, it is said that some died of starvation and many others from lack of attention of care.
