

**BRITAIN NAMED AS PARTICIPANT IN SOVIET PLOT**

**Ivanoff Asserts He Agreed To Give Forests As A Reward For British Aid In Overthrow of Soviet Union**

Moscow, March 3.—(AP)—Nikolai Zucharin, first on the list of 21 defendants in Moscow's greatest treason trial, today heard a co-defendant accuse him of plotting dismemberment of the Soviet Union on behalf of Britain and planning the death of Nikolai Lenin, once his close associate. The trial's second day was Britain's day in the role of the foreign power with which the accused confessed to or were charged with treasonable dealings.

Bucharin, former editor of official Soviet newspapers, confessed to plotting against the Soviet Union with Joseph Stalin, and asked that he be held responsible for everything it involved.

"You will be, without your special request," tartly rejoined the prosecutor, Andrei J. Vishinsky.

Plot Against Archangev  
Another of the 21 Soviet leaders on trial for their lives, Vladimir I. Ivanoff, once chief of the timber industry, declared Bucharin had instructed him to organize a revolt against the Soviet regime, and to take the Archangel region, in northern European Russia. It was Ivanoff who also told of the plot to kill Lenin. In 1918, he said, Bucharin talked about "removing Lenin."

"How?" asked Vishinsky.  
"Up to physical destruction," Ivanoff answered.

Bucharin confessed that he had planned, with Aleksis I. Rykoff, former premier and No. 2 on the list of accused, an illegal counter-revolutionary rightist organization as far back as 1925. But he denied he knew anything about anything for foreign powers.

"Yes, but I knew nothing about connections with their secret services," Bucharin replied.

Forests As Reward  
Ivanoff testified he had plotted to turn Russia's northern forests over to English magnates as compensation for British aid in the overthrow of the Soviet regime.

Ivanoff said that since 1934 he had acted for the British intelligence service on orders of Bucharin's rightist center. The number of concessions were to be granted to British firms, Ivanoff said, under plans drawn by his predecessor, Lobov.

Another defendant, A. P. Rosenzweig, as co-conspirator for foreign trade, "sold the lumber to England on a tremendous loss to prove the center had power," the witness testified. It was a sort of device on account.

**DOUGHTON PREDICTS A NEW BUSINESS ERA IF TAX BILL PASSES**

Congressman in Opening Debate Says Trade Will Be Stimulated and Encouraged; Burden Divided.

Washington, March 3.—(AP)—Frank L. Doughton, 52-year-old deputy collector of internal revenue, was slain in a narrow alleyway outside the Federal building here today. Deputy Marshal Howard Brown said Bartholomew was killed by a pistol bullet which entered the left side of his head.

**WAR REFERENDUM**  
 The United States Senate has  
 before it a proposed amendment to  
 the Constitution considerably more  
 completely framed than the much  
 more modest resolution which  
 like that proposed measure, calls for  
 a referendum to the people of the  
 country before the United States  
 shall enter upon a war overseas  
 except under very special conditions.

The Senate measure was introduced  
 by Senator William Borah of  
 Idaho with eleven other senators,  
 all from the West or Midwest—  
 except Senator Clark of Missouri  
 who is from the East. The measure  
 is a geographical group. Besides  
 Clark they are Borah, Capper, Don-  
 ner, Pranger, Hitchcock, Landon,  
 Murray, Nye, Shipstead and Wheel-  
 er.

The text of the amendment is as  
 follows:

Section 1. Except in case of  
 attack by armed force actual or  
 immediately threatened, upon the  
 territory, or possessions, or by non-Amer-  
 ican citizens, no national guard or  
 in the Western Hemisphere any  
 people shall have the sole power  
 to declare war or engage in warfare  
 overseas, unless the Congress, by a  
 national crisis to exist in con-  
 junction with this article, shall  
 by concurrent resolution, passed by  
 a majority of two-thirds of each  
 house, have declared that there  
 are four causes for such a  
 declaration.

Section 2. Congress shall have  
 the sole power of declaring war  
 in this section.

Section 3. This article shall be  
 operative when ratified as an  
 amendment to the Constitution  
 by a majority of three-fourths of  
 the States, as provided in the Con-  
 stitution.

The proponents of this amendment  
 claim for it that it has met most  
 of the objections to the Ludlow resolu-  
 tion and all objections that are  
 commonly made are seriously  
 answered. Obviously it care-  
 fully avoids any appearance of  
 weakening the Monroe doctrine. Al-  
 though it puts both in the proposal  
 including the words "or engage in  
 warfare" after "declare war," the  
 absence of which makes the Ludlow  
 proposal so faulty, is not a serious  
 objection. It is not a small fraction of  
 the only kind of people who would  
 be concerned so far as the  
 customers for food, castles and  
 great houses and the like. It is not  
 a small fraction of the only kind of

 as the price of junk and silver-  
 gilt decorated picture frames ought  
 soon to be going to light.

There are other things to be  
 considered. There are a number of  
 people in the country who in approx-  
 imately as big wages as Earl Hearst,  
 who would not be called a patriot  
 of a President. Yet that is one part  
 that does not seem to be any  
 way of a President—and this amend-  
 ment would avoid it. It might  
 prevent a President from making  
 starting a foreign war by the act  
 of ordering ships fired, but it  
 would prevent him from making  
 a situation where the other fellow  
 would shoot first and we would  
 shoot to shoot back.

There is another point in this  
 business which may or may not be  
 worth considering. Suppose there  
 should come a time when a war  
 referendum were to be called. Sup-  
 pose that it were worth a billion  
 dollars, or five or ten billion, to  
 some foreign power to keep us out  
 of that war. Would that be the  
 point of attack through the  
 voters—possibly the employ-  
 ment of such enormous amounts of  
 money as would make the situation  
 national election we ever had  
 look like a church bingo game compared  
 to the trick operations? It would  
 be a billion dollars would buy ten

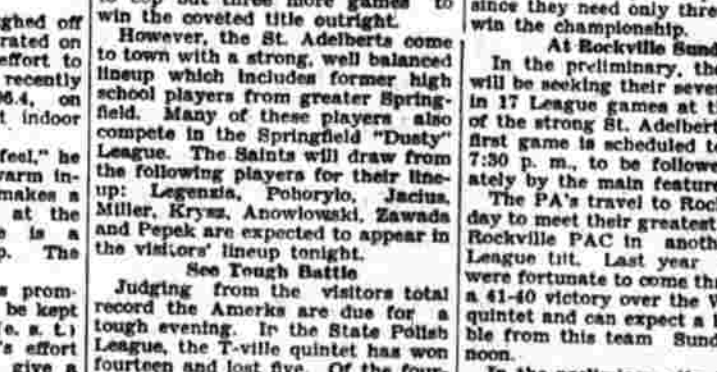

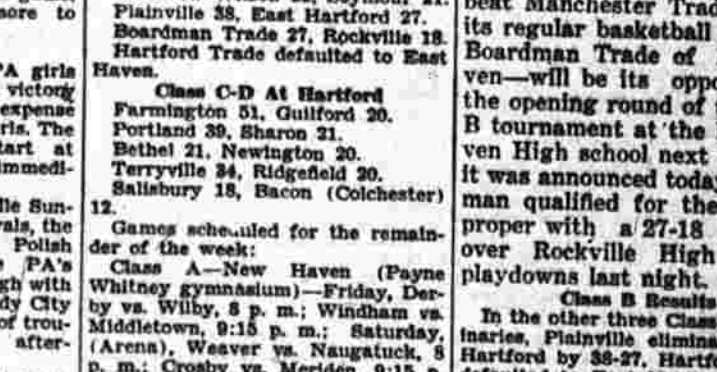
