Two Vice Presidents Died During Madison's Terms **ROTH** of the vice presidents who were elected with Presi-dent James Madison died in of-fice. George Clinton, who became

vice president during the administration of Jefferson, held the office until his death in 1812. Elbridge Gerry, elected in 1812, served only two years.

Both men were noted among the first American statesmen Clinton served during the French and Indian war and was made a brigadier general during the Revolution. He was the first gov-Clinton jealously guarded the the Federal Constitution. This attitude contributed largely to his failure to achieve the Presidency. Elbridge Gerry achieved distinction as a statesman in the Massachusetts legislature, as govspecial envoy to France. 
