Committees Send Assembly 60 Bills For Action Today

Unfavorable Reports on Most of Measures; Par- san Fight Looms on Thanksgiving Date; Resolution Adopted Pays Tribute to Cheney

State Capitol, Hartford, March 4.—(P)—Legislative committees, making their first sizeable dig into their pile of bills, sent to the General Assembly today more than 60 bills for action, most of them with unfavorable reports. Included among the measures was announced today by the House and Senate as legislators began their ninth week of work was a proposal for a \$3,000,000 bond issue to extend the state's parks and forests system, another permitting the playing of bingo on Sundays under local option, and a third allowing grocery stores to remain open on Sundays. All were reported unfavorably and placed on the calendars for possible action tomorrow.

A partisan fight over Thanksgiving Day loomed when the Republican-controlled House Judiciary Committee reported favorably on a bill to change the date of the holiday on the traditional last Thursday of November. The predominantly Democratic Senate Committee has turned down the proposal.

Confirm Malloy Reappointment
In the midst of receiving committee reports, both Houses confirmed the nomination of J. J. Malloy for reappointment as judge of the Common Pleas court for Hartford for four years beginning March 5. The Senate confirmed the appointment, made recently by Gov. Robert A. Hurley, 31 to 0, and the House 223 to 22.

The Senate closed a brief session by adopting a resolution in tribute to Col. William C. Cheney, Manchester silk manufacturer, who died during the war and the following in his memory.

Offered by Sheen
Republican Leader William J. Sheen, a fellow townsman, offered the resolution and told the Senate that in Colonel Cheney's death "Connecticut loses one of its most valuable citizens."

Sheen particularly lauded Cheney's work in a director of the State Prison board, saying that his activities were characterized by "unselfish and wholehearted service to the people of the state."

The House adopted and sent to the Senate a resolution congratulating Vermont on the 100th anniversary.

Nazis' Raiders Bomb Cardiff Docks, Plants

Also Attack Newcastle
And Airfields North of
London; British At-
tack Western Reich.

Berlin, March 4.—(P)—German raiders heavily bombed docks and factories at Cardiff, Wales, last night, and attacked the port of Newcastle and airfields north of London, the German high command reported today.

British planes were said to have dropped several explosives and a large number of incendiaries in several places in western Germany, killing and injuring some civilians and damaging houses.

The daily war bulletin credited a German combat plane with sinking a 3,000-ton ship off the south coast of England yesterday and said another merchant vessel was "stopped with a heavy attack" by a German plane.

The high command said other bombers, operating west of the Hebrides, sank an 8,000-ton merchant ship.

Attack For Five Hours
German planes swept over Cardiff in waves for five hours, informed German radio today.

German reconnaissance pilots reported today they had sighted a number of fire-scarred districts.

Japan Sets Time Limit For France to Reply

Foreign Minister Is Be-
lieved to Have Told
Ambassador 'Final An-
swer' Expected Soon.

Tokyo, March 4.—(P)—Domel, Japanese news agency, indicated today that Japan for the second time in a week had set a time limit for a reply by France to proposals for settlement of her Indo-China border dispute with Thailand. The news agency said Foreign Minister Yosuke Matsuoka was believed to have told French Ambassador Charles Arsene Henry that a "final answer" was expected by Wednesday noon (10 p. m. c.s.t. today).

If France's answer is received, the news agency suggested that the fifth conference of delegates to the Japan-Soviet peace conference would be held "Wednesday night to decide final details."

Meet For 46 Minutes
Matsuoka and the ambassador met for 46 minutes today to discuss a modified plan advanced by Japan for settlement of the dispute.

Authoritative sources said the Japanese failed to reach an agreement with the French envoy set for tomorrow because of the necessity of communicating orders to Thai and Indo-China troops before the armistice date Friday.

Observers believed the French still were attempting to obtain additional concessions. The outcome of the peace negotiations here therefore appeared to depend on whether the Japanese would be willing further to modify their proposals.

Reports to Emperor
Domel, Japanese news agency, said that Navy Minister Admiral Kotoh Oikawa reported to Emperor Hirohito on the state of affairs under his jurisdiction. Details of his 45-minute interview with the emperor were not disclosed, but the meeting possibly was connected with the Japanese-mediated peace negotiations.

Details Given on Convoy Of Canadian Troopships

London, March 4.—(P)—Lifting the secrecy which cloaks the navy's operations, the British Navy today permitted publication of the details of how several liners loaded with Canadian troops were being safely to England through the waters patrolled by German U-boats and planes.

With such headlines as "An-Other Big Canadian Army Arrives," newspapers enlarged upon the details of the operation.

Repeatedly crews had to chop the decks free of snow and ice in order to keep their guns free for action.

Occasionally, destroyers of the escort dashed off to investigate distant ships.

Nye Attacks Britain As Great Aggressor; Will Break Relations

Earle Instructs Ameri- can Legation to Begin Preparing to Take Over Custody of Brit- ish Property in Bul- garia; Special Train Ordered for Tomor- row, But May Wait.

Sofia, Bulgaria, March 4.—(P)—British Minister George W. Rendel informed United States Minister George H. Earle today that Britain was breaking relations with Bulgaria tomorrow and Earle instructed the American legation in Sofia to start preparing to take over custody of British property throughout the country. A special train had been ordered for tomorrow, but Earle was informed it might be delayed a day or two depending on when Rendel can finish preparations for leaving.

Nazi troop movements into Bulgaria and toward her Turkish and Greek frontiers continued to swell in volume here.

Planes At Emergency Airport
As Nazi reports sifted through the capital the R. A. F. was photographing the country in preparation for bombing, more than 100 small pursuit planes were lined up at a new emergency airport here.

Expect Break With Bulgaria In 24 Hours

British Will Not Necess- arily Declare War Action Seen Playing Into German Hands.

London, March 4.—(P)—An authoritative source asserted today Britain might break off diplomatic relations with Bulgaria "within the next 24 hours."

The source said the break would "not necessarily be followed by a declaration of war," but added that it has always been the British policy "to seek out and hit the Germans" where ever possible.

Britain, it was said, regards Bulgaria as having "played a part in aggression on this earth."

Work On Plan To Speed Aid
British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden, Gen. Sir John G. Dill, Chief of the Imperial General Staff, and the Athens government were reported today working out a plan to speed substantial aid to Greece, which was being attacked by Germany.

Informed sources indicated that British officials at Ankara, who had been given virtual authority to give aid to Greece, were expected to leave for the Middle East.

Commenting on the situation, The Times declared that should Germany attack Greece, "the British would be bound to support Greece, as in the air, would be indispensable."

Nazis Deliver Hitler's Note

Special Message Sent To Inonu at Ankara By German Mission.

Istanbul, March 4.—(P)—A German mission arrived by air at Ankara today and almost immediately delivered to Turkish President Ismet Inonu what was believed to be a special message from Adolf Hitler.

The German mission, accompanied by Franz von Papen, German ambassador to Turkey, met Inonu and Sukru Saracoglu, Turkish foreign minister, at noon and remained a half hour with them.

Silence on Contents
Neither the Germans nor the Turks would discuss the meeting. Speculation about the message ranged from belief it was a demand that Germany does not intend to attack Turkey to belief it was a promise of German aid in order to keep Turkey out of the war.

The Nazi mission, numbering five men, landed at Ankara this morning after having been given special permission by the Turkish government to fly over Turkey. It was understood to have come directly from Berlin.

Reports in the Balkans yesterday that a Nazi mission would go to Turkey included German Foreign Minister Joachim von Ribbentrop as its likely chief. The source, however, scoffed at the reports of a special mission, saying that Germany had an ambassador in Ankara.

British Seize 2 Strongholds

Capture Iccia Baidoa, Buloburi in Italian Somaliland Advance.

Nairobi, Kenya Colony, Feb. 4.—(P)—British imperial forces have captured two more Italian Somaliland strongholds in a drive northward toward the southeast frontier of Ethiopia, an official announcement said today.

A communiqué issued here said the main column of British troops, who thus far have captured some 10,000 Italian-occupied Iccia Baidoa and Buloburi.

Iccia Baidoa is about 170 miles northwest of captured Mogadiscio, Somaliland capital, and Buloburi is some 170 miles due north of Mogadiscio, on the same Webebe Shabelle valley route used by the Fascists in conquering Ethiopia in 1938.

A subtle East command announcement issued at Cairo said that advance forces had thrust beyond these two towns to the vicinity of the Ethiopian frontier; Iccia Baidoa is about halfway between Mogadiscio and the Ethiopian border.

"Our 1,600 More Prisoners
"Our 1,600 more prisoners is progressing satisfactorily," the Cairo announcement said. It added that the daily communiqué made no mention of ground operations in Somalia.

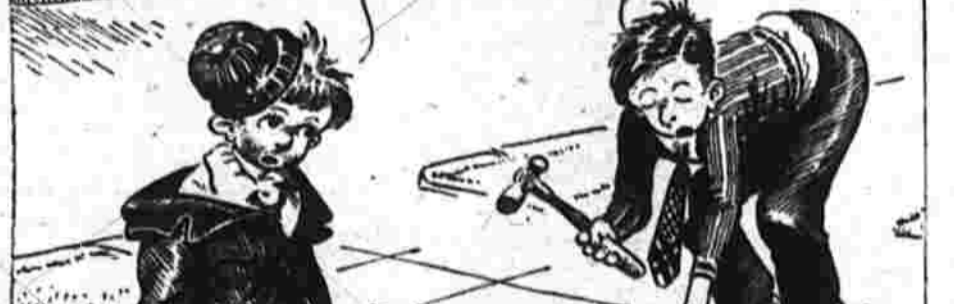

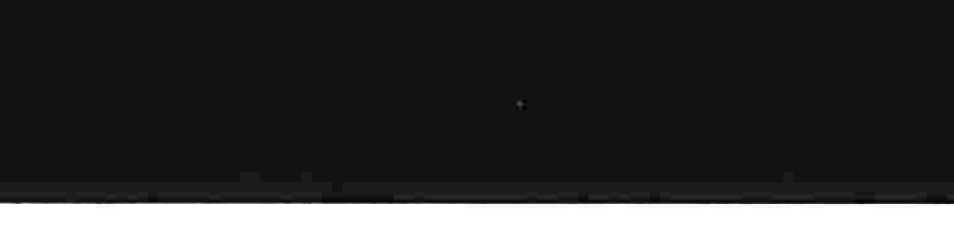
