## German Report Armies Sweep Forward; Soviet Forces Batter at Panzer Columns

### Wonder If Knox Hints at Change in Policy at Sea

Direct Language Used in Speech to Governors At Boston Gives Rise To Belief Definite Revision Contemplated In Existing Strategy.

Washington, July 1.—(P)—Secretary Knox's call for immediate use of the United States Navy "to clear the Atlantic of the German menace" led the capital to wonder today whether he was hinting at an important change in administration policy toward Nazi sea activities. The direct language the Navy secretary used in his speech at Boston last night gave rise to the belief in some quarters that a definite revision was contemplated in existing naval strategy.

### Navy Drops 28 Employes Not Trusted

San Francisco, July 1.—(P)—Twenty-eight skilled civil service workers who Naval spokesmen said "could not be trusted to work around military secrets" have been discharged from Mare Island Navy Yard.

Rear Admiral John W. Green, commandant of the 12th Naval District, said the dismissals were recommended by Naval Intelligence officers after thorough investigations were "purely precautionary."

### Go Across 2 Rivers, Chase Fleeing Units; Admit Giving Ground

#### German Penetration to Area of Bobruisk Admitted by Russians; Fierce Fighting Is Reported at Several Points Along Main, Central Portion, Northern Sector of Front.

Moscow, July 1.—(P)—German penetration to the area of Bobruisk, 90 miles southeast of Minsk, was acknowledged today as Red Army forces battered at Nazi Panzer columns which stretched eastward, like the fingers of a gigantic hand, from the Dvina river to the Carpathians. Fierce fighting was reported at several points along this main, central portion and the northern sector of a front extending from the Arctic to the Black Sea.

#### British Ship Losses Now Under 1917

Cambridge, Mass., July 1.—(P)—An article in The Harvard Business Review today said that British shipping "will have to be greatly reduced before the supply situation which existed early in 1918 will be reached."

#### Communique Reports 'Unusually Bloody Losses' for Soviet Armies Desperately Trying To Break Nazi Vise West of Minsk; No Mention Is Made of Occupation of City.

Berlin, July 1.—(P)—German armies, sweeping forward toward Leningrad, Moscow and into the Ukraine, have reached and crossed the Dvina river in the north, the Berezina in the center and are pursuing fleeing Russian units around Lwow in the south, the high command declared today. A communique from the Fuehrer's headquarters reported "unusually bloody losses" for Soviet armies attempting desperately in waves of eight to twelve tanks supported by the heaviest tanks to break a German vise west of Minsk.

Dallas, Texas, July 1.—(P)—Gov. W. Lee O'Daniel forged into a lead of 77 in the race for United States Senate from Texas today with an estimated 200-300 ballots to be counted. 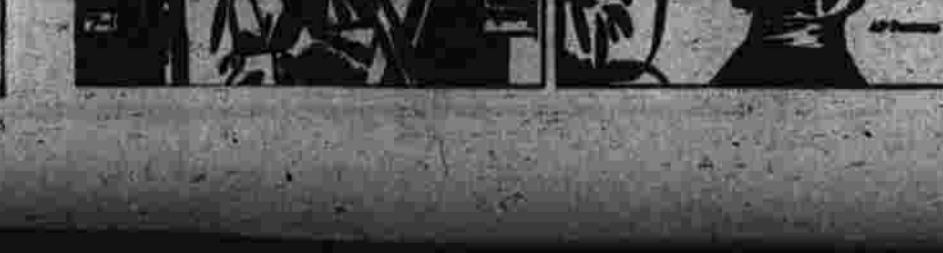
