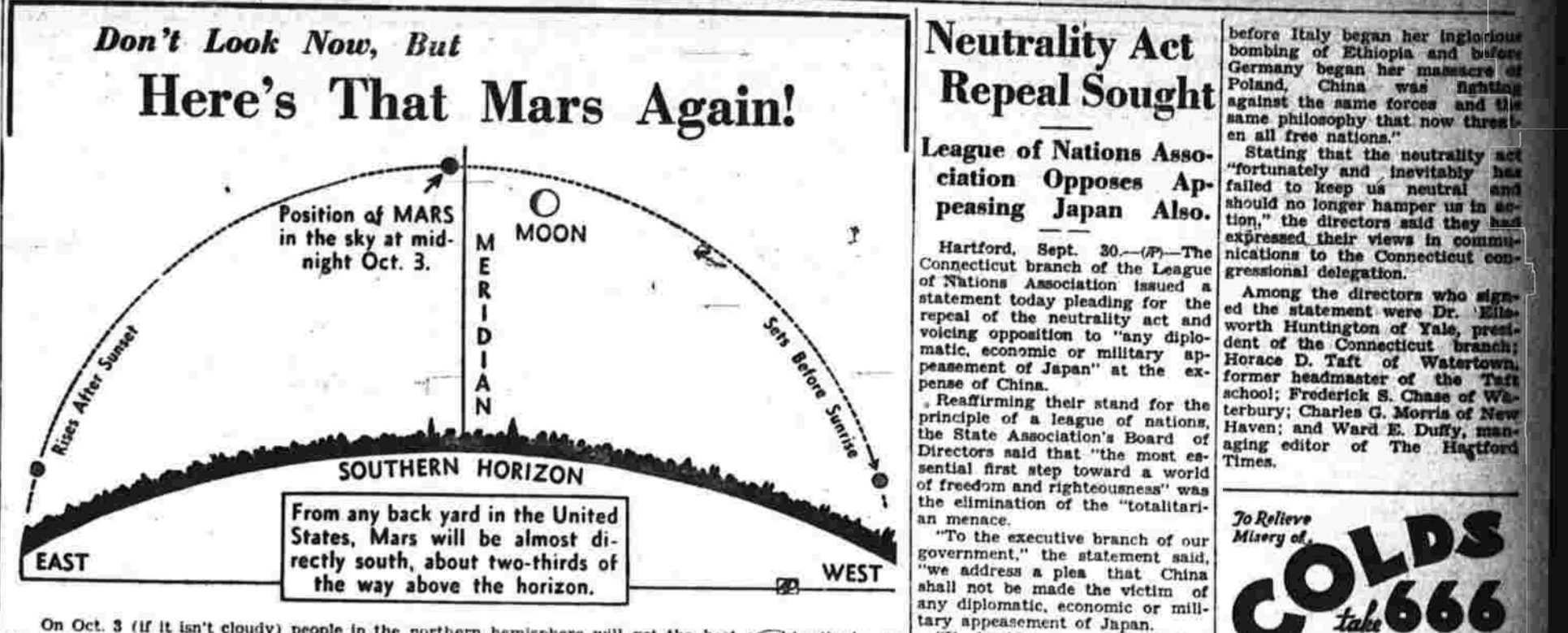

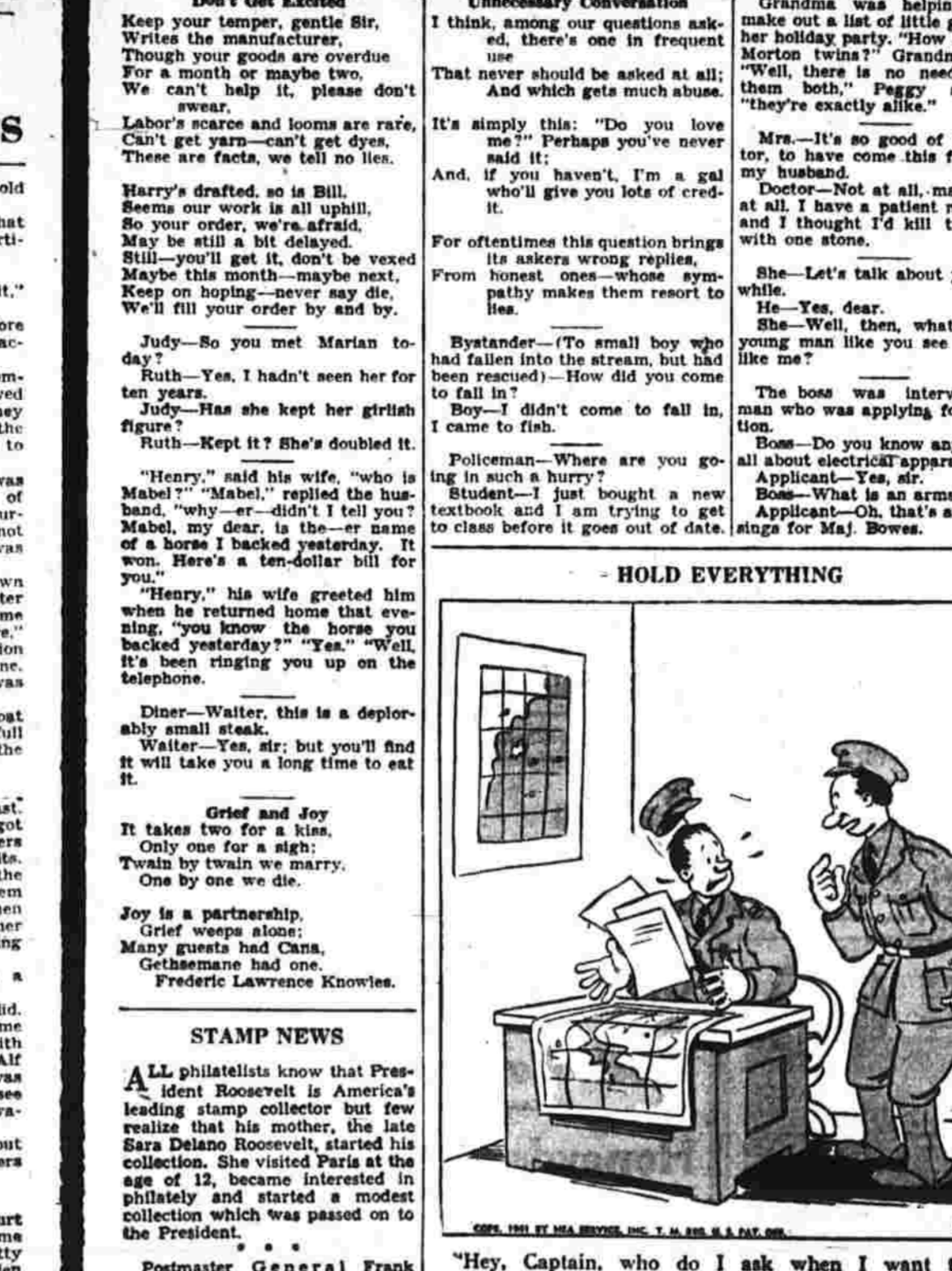

White With Frost There was no frost in the higher elevations, notably Columbia, Manchester's temperature at 5:30 this morning in the section west of town and its lowest point, was 31 degrees.

Lower temperatures were recorded from Glastonbury where 28 degrees was recorded and the Blue Hills section of Hartford where 30 degrees was reported.

Recurrent frosts will destroy many flower gardens which escaped destruction last night by being covered with cloth or paper. Late crops such as grapes, celery, cauliflower, cabbage, carrots, beets, require freezing temperatures far below that recorded today to suffer damage.
