That won't happen in Paris, For the four ministers met yesterda and agreed they'd tackle some of the treaties, approved at the con-ference, at a Foreign Minister's meeting in New York early in No-

so all the talk you've heard s far doesn't mean anything is real-ly finished. The talk helped shape what will be done.

The reason there's been so much talk at the Paris conference is that the diplomats argue every foot of the way, compromising a little here, yielding a little there, stand-ing firm here. here'll be plenty of battle when the Big Four ministers meet.
