McCarthy's term runs through 1952. Liberty to Kenneth C. J. Critchfield, Democratic national chairman, the Rhode Island senator seemed likely to escape any serious criticism in Senate consideration of his appointment.

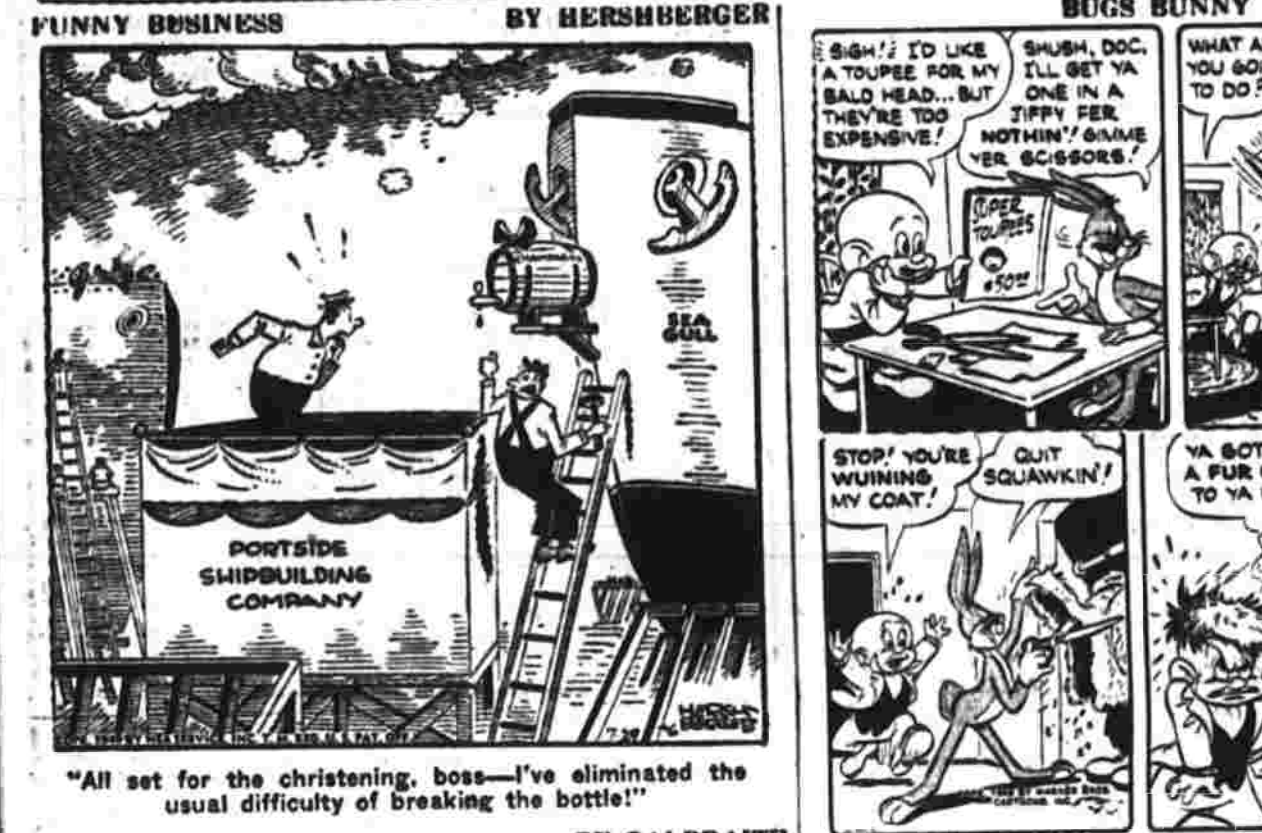
