New Broad St. School Now Seen Necessary

Supt. Illing Makes Preliminary Report on Accommodations for Next Year in Town

A preliminary report on enrollments and school accommodations for next year shows that the 18-room Verplanck school, now under construction on Olcott street, will be completed by four rooms shy of the number of school rooms needed to service that area, Superintendent of Schools Arthur H. Illing told the Board of Education last night.

In making his survey, said Mr. Illing, he included the 12-room Princeton street school which is also under construction.

The survey, which Mr. Illing pointed out is final and not subject to revision, "clearly demonstrates that the construction of the Broad street school is a necessity." The report shows a total school enrollment in 1950-51 of 5,900 as against the present enrollment of 5,564, an increase of 336.

Filled When Completed

Twelve additional rooms are needed to provide for this increase, said Mr. Illing. Chairman Charles S. House pointed out that the Broad street school would be filled to capacity upon completion, and he stated that because of this the

architects are now working on a preliminary sketch which will make the Broad street school a 15-room plant.

Mr. Illing stated that the most crowded situation is found at the Hollister street school where, according to the survey, six additional rooms will be needed. The completion of the Broad street plant would immediately relieve that situation, he said.

Besides the four rooms needed at the Verplanck school and the six needed at Hollister, the survey shows that the Robertson and Barnard schools need one additional room each.

Times to Keep to Standard

Mr. Illing stated that he has tried, throughout the survey, to adhere to the "my more than 50 pupils to a room" standard agreed upon by the board as being most favorable to the children and teachers. He added that the "20" standard was not always possible. For example, Grade 1 at the Highland Park school shows a total of 53 pupils, and the nine rooms of the Green school average 34.2 pupils per room.

Development of the southern part of town was brought out when Chairman House disclosed that the board has received a request from residents of the South end street school area for further consideration of school building needs there. House said that he conferred with him and Mr. Illing prior to last night's meeting.

South School Area

The South school has two classrooms containing Grades 1 to 1V with 45 pupils, and the 12-room school which is housed in the area showed that there are 110 children from kindergarten to Grade IV in the area, and suggested the possibility of converting a basement room into a classroom. Board members agreed to look into the survey further and also make visits to the South school at their convenience. It was pointed out that the Board of Education would have to approve any conversion of the basement room into a classroom.

Proposed Turned Down

The board turned down a proposal by McKinley Brothers Real Estate Agency concerning the purchase or rent of the site of the street army for school purposes.
