Cheney Brothers to Adopt New Group Insurance Plan

Wright explained that the installation of the insurance plan was dependent upon the discontinuance of the Benefit Association of Cheney Brothers and approval by the War.

The Benefit Association, which also provides death, sickness, and accident benefits, has been in effect since 1910. The new plan will mean greater benefits at a lower cost to employees, Wright said.

Nearly all the 1,300 members of the association have approved, continuing the plan and will participate in a distribution of the assets, which exceed \$350,000, according to Wright.

The new plan will cost employees 80 cents a month for life, accidental death and dismemberment coverage and one cent a week for each 11 of weekly benefit but not more than 28 cents a week.

The insurance is held by Acta Life Insurance Company, Worcester, Mass. It is a "no-load" plan, meaning that no medical examination will be required of employees who join the plan within 31 days after they become eligible.

Supreme Court Backs Patten Zone Decision

Split Vote, 3-2, Reverses Court of Common Pleas Ruling Against Planning Commission

A three-to-two split decision yesterday in the Supreme Court of Errors upheld the Planning Commission in changing to Industrial Zone a portion of the Patten zone on the corner of the intersection of the Court of Common Pleas and the Court of Common Pleas.

Workers Battle Japan Readers Worst Flood in Meet Ku-tai-sho History of Utah And Ma-tai-shi

meeting at scattered areas. Other cities in Utah were also hit by the flood. In Salt Lake City workers were hanged into emergency canal. Several canyons to the east in the Jordan River, carrying the water into the Great Salt Lake, spilled over its banks near the Salt Lake Canal.

"This is the most dangerous flood situation the city has ever faced," said City Engineer Roy W. McLeod. "The city's water supply is in jeopardy. We can continue to control it."

Workers received an assist early today. Temperatures dropped in northern Utah and a cool wind raged in from the north. Officials expected that to ease the situation of the state's recent mountain snow pack.

Two big breaks and several minor ones in Salt Lake City slowed down to spill into the Jordan river. East to the Jordan river, water was covered with water. As a result, a large West side section was covered with water.

Most slides in Cottonwood canyon broke a water line leading to Fairview. Bear river whipped over its banks near Amalgam and Benson. An emergency was declared in Nepes at Salt Creek threatened the city. A slide in Willyville Canyon caused U.S. Large sections of Spanish Fork and Springville are flooded. U.S. bridges were washed out near Duchesne.

Scores of families have been evacuated, including about 35 in Cheyenne and at least 35 in Salt Lake City.

At Mucanville, in the Mississippi river maintained a steady pressure today against flood-soaked dikes on the Illinois and Iowa shores.

The levees continued to hold at all points, but all up and down the river the people redoubled their best watch for any possible breaks in the embankments that protect numerous towns and thousands of acres of farm land.

The peak pressure was on the dikes protecting this city of 18,000 people. The dikes directly across the river, holding the mighty flood out of about 4,000 acres of Illinois land in the dry drainage district.

Meanwhile the Missouri river, sister stream to the "Father of Waters" pushed its way through central Missouri. The top levee was expected to arrive at St. Louis Thursday, a day earlier than previously forecast. The revised crest for St. Louis has been reduced from 35 feet to 34.3 feet.

Missouri officials reported the Mississippi remained at 31 feet early today, the same level it reached at the same time last year. That was believed to be the crest.
