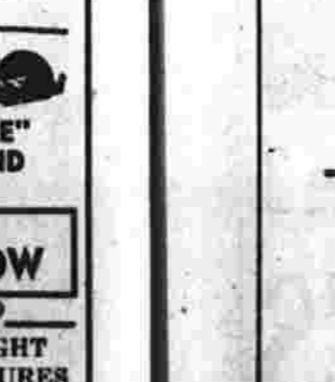

The three new proposals made by our negotiators in Korea, concerning the repatriation of prisoners, represent an attempt on our part to force the Communists to face facts on the table.

All three proposals are alike in respect—proving that the Communists who have started objections to returning to their own original side of the war shall be released in a sort of neutral zone, without hindrance from either side, as to which direction they wish to take.

The first proposal would let the prisoners make their own decision by questioning or interviewing or receiving by anybody. The second proposal would have the prisoners interviewed without representation by representatives of neutral countries.

The third proposal would have the prisoners brought to this neutral zone, all checked out against the official lists of prisoners, and all given a normal ceremony, however, those prisoners who wish to return to the side to which they had been detained would be allowed to do so.

This third proposal compares most favorably with the proposals that all prisoners would be released to the Communists while

Kennan's Irritating Poise

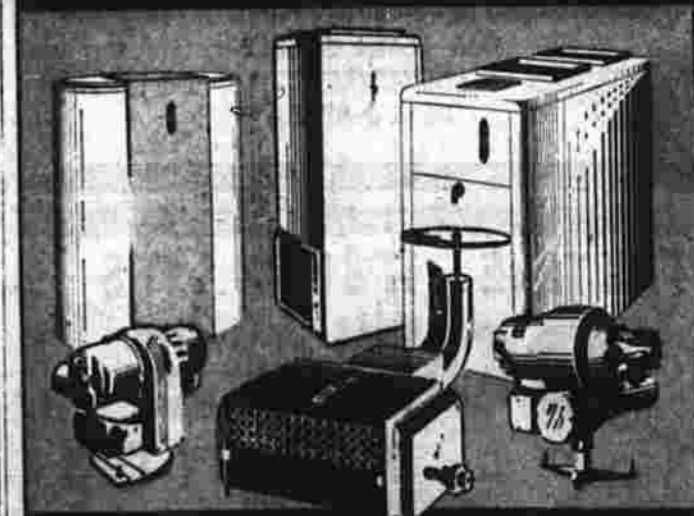

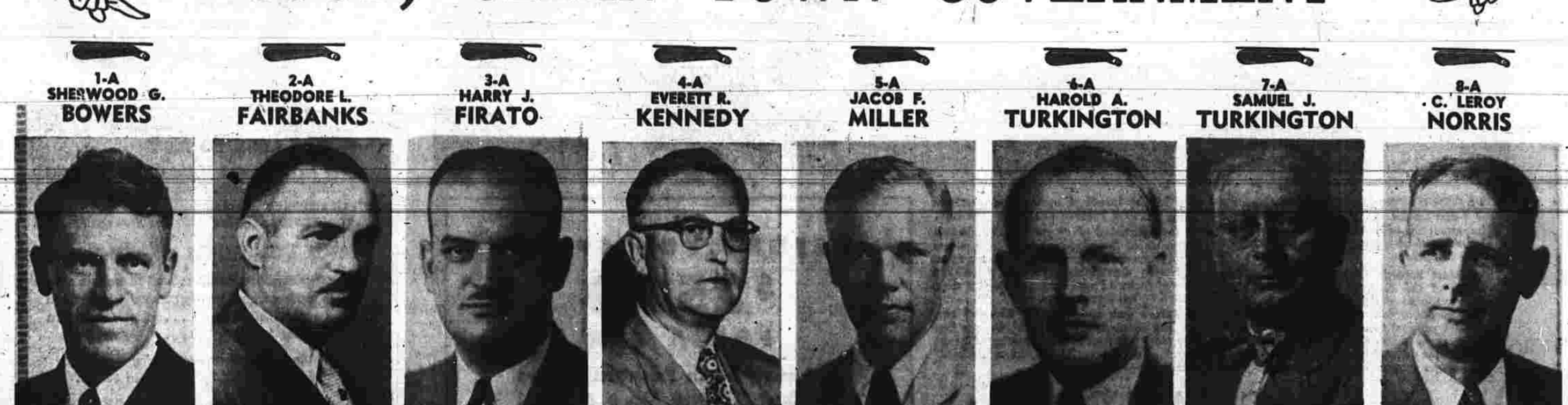
