(Continued from Page One) But reports from Holland, Belgium, the English coast, Denmark and North Germany were that the assaults had generally died down through the three day assault. The hours of crisis were believed over.

In Holland, sea warnings were replaced by warnings against strong winds and the air force emergency was cancelled. The British Army and Air Force restored Christmas leave to thousands of servicemen alerted to fight possible floods.

The War Office said "the immediate danger has passed and there is little fear of a recurrence of surge conditions during the next 24 hours."

The giant lion Queen Elizabeth's delayed 24 hours by the storm, finally left on high tide for New York.

To speed handling of returns, Internal Revenue has put a quarter inch and strip on instruction booklet going to those who made less than \$10,000. A yellow stripe appears on booklets going to \$10,000 plus individuals. Several other changes are to distinguish special occupational groups, such as farmers.

Tax forms for making returns are placed inside the 15-page booklet which are folded and addressed for mailing. There is no distinguishing stripe in connection with the returns themselves.

Officials said there wasn't time this year, after complaints started coming in, to drop this identifying system even if it had been felt desirable to do so. But the guessing in some informed quarters was that the stripe system would be dropped next year.

### Police Foil Jersey Plot To Kill Union Official

Hackensack, N. J., Dec. 24 (AP)—An alleged plot to assassinate a union official has been foiled by police who nabbed men they called the hired killer and his two conspirators.

Tipped off by the slaying plot by undisclosed source, a coroner of police headquarters near the Monticello home of the union leader yesterday arrested James E. Cobb, alias Frank Green, 35, of Tampa, Fla., on a charge of conspiracy to commit murder.

Planned To Ambush Hall  
Police said he was to ambush Paul Hall, 40, secretary-treasurer of the 75,000-member seafarers' union (AFSA). Cobb was arraigned early today on charges of conspiracy, attempt to commit a homicidal act, and carrying a concealed weapon.

Two others, said to have had a hand in the plot, were arraigned as co-conspirators. Arraigned after an all-night investigation were Carmen Priore, 33-year-old salesman of the Hotel Harrgrove, New York, and Edward Taffe, of West Milford, N. J.

Bergen County Prosecutor Guy Calais said Cobb admitted he was going to kill Hall by the first of the year for \$15,000.

Detectives were working today on the many angles in the case, seeking the man or men who put up the money for the alleged slaying plot.

Hall, as secretary-treasurer, is the top man in the Seafarers' Union, at a salary of \$28,000 a year. He is now running for reelection in the year in an election which started Nov. 15 and ends Jan. 15.

Hill rival for the post, Ray White of Tampa, was arrested at his home on an open charge of the request of authorities here. White, who has been president of the AFL central trades and labor assembly in Tampa, denied any connection with the case.

Hill also was a leading figure in the AFL's recent unsuccessful attempt to wrest New York dock representation rights from the International Longshoremen's Assn. (ILA).

The ILA was ousted from the AFL after state and federal probes turned up testimony of money-graft and racketeering in the old union.

However, the ILA retained its waterfront leadership in a vote of nonmembers conducted by the National Labor Relations Board.

Since then, the AFL has all but abandoned efforts to build up strength in the dock area.

Texas Attorney General... A former attorney for Hall's union was questioned in New York.

1. That he had already received \$2,000 in advance and was to get the remainder after he had killed Hall.

2. That he wanted to back out of the plot but was threatened with death himself if he did not complete his job.

3. That he knew his victim by sight, having worked with him nine years ago in Baltimore.

Calais said a new, unused 12-gauge shotgun was found in Cobb's 1954 Chevrolet automobile with Georgia license plates.

In Tampa, Detective Sgt. A. Y. Myers said questioning developed that White had known Cobb, a former seaman, who had done odd jobs around White's home there.

White Active in Politics  
White long has been active in Tampa political affairs. In 1951, he led forces supporting the candidacy of Clair Pittman against Curtis Hixon, who won and is still mayor. It was in this campaign that the International Typographical union printing label with counterfeiting the union printing label. White, 27, is tall, slim and dark-haired. He makes a good appearance and is an effective speaker. He told police and reporters he knew nothing about the alleged plot.

Beynon said he would seek to bring White before a circuit judge later today and place a more specific charge against the Tampa union leader.

"We have got to determine the venue in this investigation," Beynon explained. He said this meant police here and in New Jersey would have to decide whether the alleged plot was concocted here or in New Jersey.

The officer also said it has not been determined whether to take White to New Jersey to confront Cobb or whether Cobb will be brought here.

Officers here said neither White nor Cobb has a police record.

New York, Dec. 24 (AP)—Three former employees were left a total of \$175,000 according to the will of Charlotte Rogers Stillman, 76, who died Dec. 12.

The will of Miss Stillman, sister of the late Mrs. Mary Stillman, was filed in Surrogate's court, Miss Stillman left \$50,000 outright and the residuary portion of her estate, expected to total several millions, to Riverside Church in Manhattan.

Requests to employees were made by Frank H. Hardy, caretaker of her country home at Waterford, Conn., \$75,000; John Schneider, of Manhattan, chauffeur in the Stillman family for 39 years, \$20,000; and Eda Louise Johnson, her secretary, of Manhattan, \$50,000.

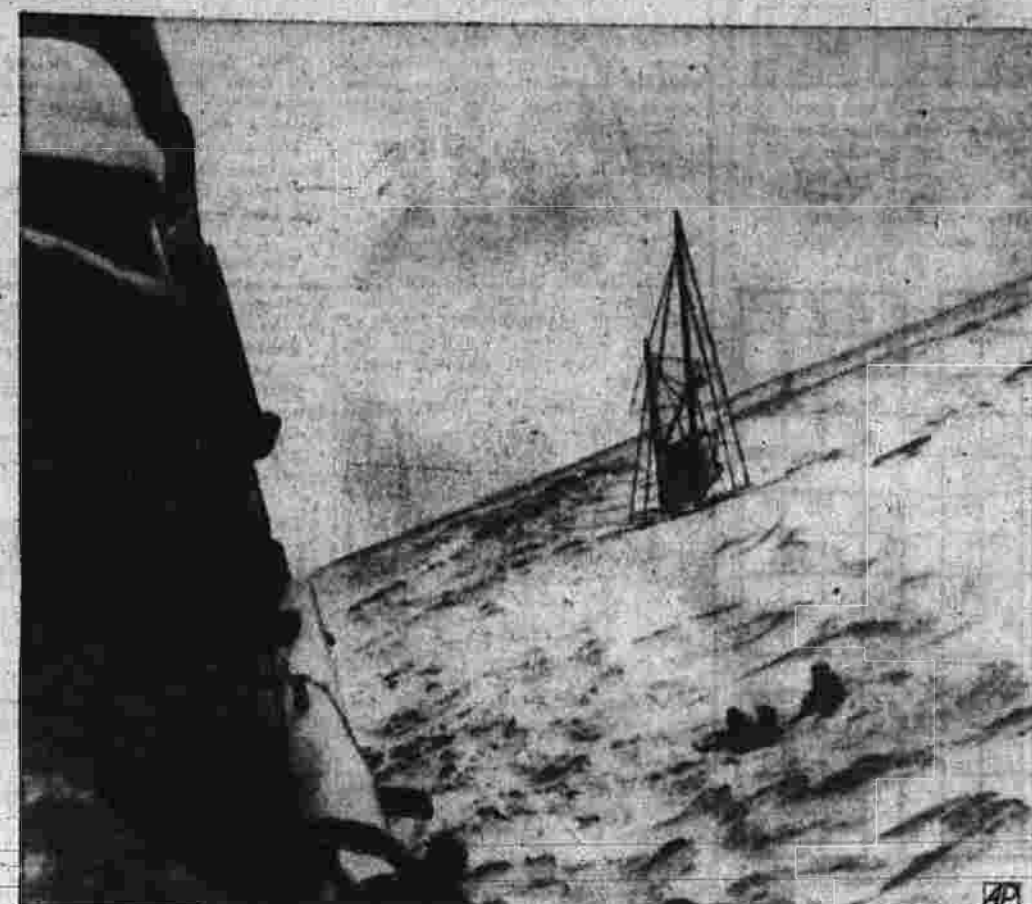

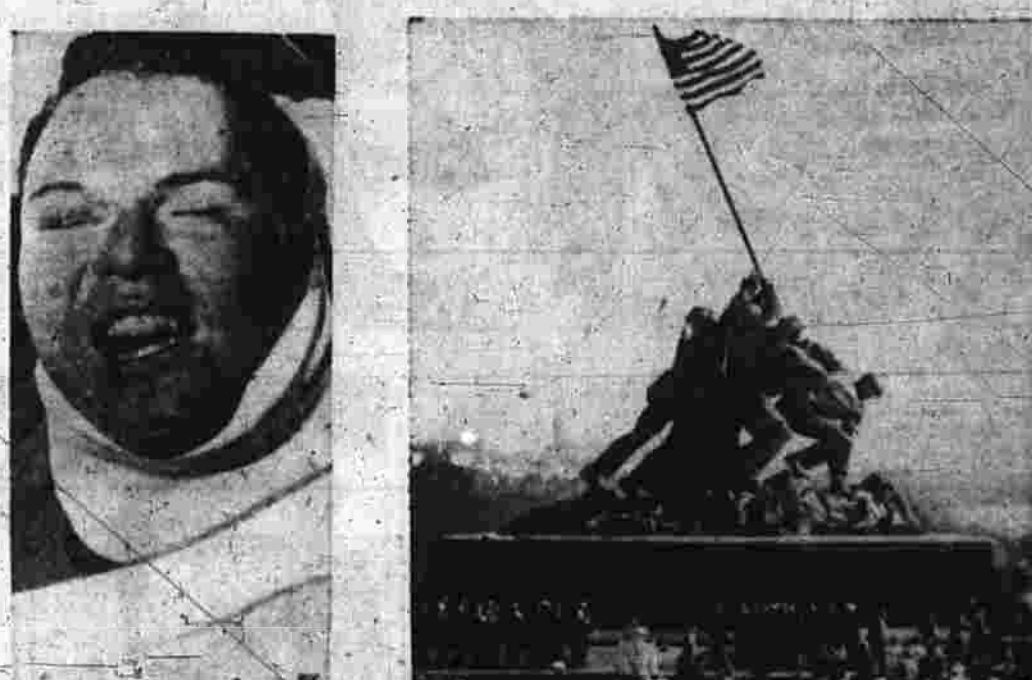
