Torn and twisted as if a tornado had ploughed down its main street, the city of Winsted began digging itself out of its own ruins and burying its dead today.

Three persons were known to have died in the devastation of the flood Friday. 





Jones Battles Salmon Brook To Aid Rescue Operations

While the rest of us here in Manchester were alogging around on our somewhat near normal rounds yesterday, one fellow townsman was bobbing around in a light boat up in East Granby, helping to rescue people marooned on rooftops by the rampaging Salmon Brook.

He was Robert A. Jones, 85 Henry St., who had a full day, it seems. While trying to get seven members of one family off a roof in a residential area there called Granbrook Park, he and his helper were thrown in the water when the boat swamped.

He and The other survivors are probably lucky to be alive, but he doesn't want to be called a hero. So we'll let him tell his story in his matter-of-fact way.

Jones, a regional fisheries biologist for the State Fish and Game Department, keeps a small, 80 pound aluminum boat and outboard motor mounted on a pickup truck at home. This is part of his official equipment.


