Taipei, Formosa, May 24 (AP)-Chiang Kai-shek rushed three divisions of troops into Taipei to stamp out wild anti-American rioting. The rioters threw stones at U.S. Ambassador Karl Rankin and Chinese Foreign Minister George Yeh when they went to inspect the wrecked American embassy. One stone hit the

Taipei, Formosa, May 24 (P)-Chinese mobs on an anti-American rampage wrecked the U.S. Embassy today and deroyed the U.S. Information Agency building. Later a mob of 20,000 or more besieged police headquarters, demanding the release of agitators seized in the anti-American riots.

Tonight martial law was declared and three divisions of Chiang Kai-shek's troops poured into this tropical capital to at one stage. At least nine were injured by mob action. The riots were the outgrowth of a U.S. court-martial's
