### Steel Divider Ordered For Merritt Parkway

Manchester, May 23 (AP)—The construction of steel barriers designed to prevent automobile accident fatalities at seven locations on the Merritt Parkway, was announced yesterday by Gov. E. R. Duff.

but barriers will prevent cars from doing this. The Governor also announced that he has asked the State Highway Safety Coordinating Committee to make a special study of the accident problem on the Merritt Parkway to determine what improvements are needed to light of today's traffic volume.

The study will be started this week and will deal with all phases of highway safety, enforcement and engineering. The committee is composed of representatives of the State Safety Commission, the Department of Motor Vehicles, the State Highway Department, the Department of Education and the

State Police Department. James H. Williams, director of the State Safety Commission, is chairman. The seven barriers planned for the Merritt Parkway will range in length from 100 to 2,000 feet and will cover an aggregate distance of 2 miles. The barriers will be two feet high and constructed of double-faced steel rails fastened to steel concrete or wooden posts. The main effect of the rail is to act as a deflector, reducing the damage to an automobile and turning it back into the lane it was proceeding on.

The barriers are to be placed at the following locations: 1. Greenwich-Vicinity of Pound Hill Road interchange—on a four degree curve. 2. Greenwich-Vicinity of Lake Avenue interchange on a combination 4 degree curve and 4 to 5 per cent grade. 3. Stamford-Vicinity of Route 104 interchange—on a 4 degree curve and a 5 per cent grade. 4. Stamford-Vicinity of Stamford Avenue interchange—on a 2 degree curve and a 4 per cent grade. 5. New Canaan—Vicinity of

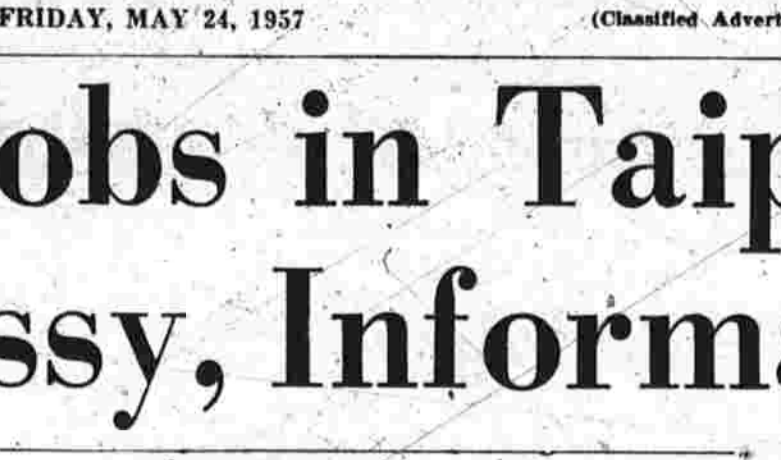
