The Papa Of the TV Comics

NEW YORK (AP) — Don't believe that story about millionaire socialite Bruce Wayne's father being murdered by vicious criminals. Everybody in television knows that "Batman's" real father is the veteran film and television executive who put the show on the air.

His name is William Dozier and he is fiercely protective about the season's most talked-about series, but he does find it isn't all laughing on the way to the bank.

"I know now how Joan Fontaine, to whom I was once married, felt when she was invariably told by new acquaintances how much they had loved her in 'Rebecca' as if it were the only thing she ever made," he said. "Nobody remembers anything else I've done, either."

He was in New York to talk about some of his other projects, including two new ones for next season, "The Tammy Grimes Show" and "The Green Hornet." But the conversation kept jumping over to "Batman."

"Yes, Batman does drive fast," he said, "but he usually abides by the rules of the road except when in pursuit of criminals or hurrying to the scene of a crime. Then he functions as a law officer and must cut corners and occasionally cross the center line. But he has spoken to Robin about the importance of fastening seat belts."

As for the hapless Gotham City police department, Dozier says that not a single complaint has been lodged about the hand-wringing police chief who apparently never leaves the side of his commissioner.

"The Green Hornet," taken from an old radio series, will have a central character who will not be as bizarre as Batman.

"He could pass for an ordinary person," said Dozier, "except that at the peak of a caper he will be wearing a midnight green topcoat and a very small mask."

Aside from that tiny idiosyncrasy, it will be a crime show in the classic form with each week's dastardly villain snuffed out at each episode's end.

In addition to receiving a cut from the profits of Batman merchandise — totaling a record smashing \$50 million this year and expected to go to \$75 million next — Dozier has an extra bonanza of \$200 a week from the show.

A Funny Foursome for the Summer

NEW YORK (NEA) — Stop knocking summer television. It is offering regular warm weather employment to four funny men—Johnny Wayne, Frank Shuster, Dan Rowan and Dick Martin, better known when their names are linked to form a pair of comedy teams.

Rowan and Martin handle "The Dean Martin Summer Show" on NBC. It's not being called "The Rowan and Martin Show" or "Dino Presents Rowan and Martin" (Dean's choice) because, contractually, NBC has the right to use Dean Martin's name all year long.

"Wayne and Shuster Take an Affectionate Look At—" is the name of the Canadian comics' CBS show, which has moved into the "Trials of O'Brien time slot.

Rowan and Martin even split up now and then, so Dick Martin can work alone. He played Lucille Ball's friend in several episodes of her series one year, and he appears in Doris Day's film, "The Glass Bottom Boat."

They don't have problems such as those in the old Betty Grable-Dan Dailey movies, where one partner has to tell the other he isn't wanted. "Besides," Dan Rowan smiled, "I always remember that the one who goes to the top always winds up in the Bowerly, a bum."

"I never thought of that," Dick Martin said. There are several regular features Rowan and Martin will use: An improvisation, a spy routine in which they meet on a street corner to sing their assignment ("I Take Him Out to the Ball Game"), a salute to the

Big Band era, and a regular cast composed of Dom DeLuise, Laine Kazan, Wise D'Orso, Les Brown and Judi Rolin.

"We only used three guests all season," Martin said. "We have tried to keep that wonderful ad lib quality Dean has on his show. His looks like a big party. We don't have all that 'Whoopie!' he's got going, but ours is like a junior party."

"We have taped all 12 shows," Rowan said, "and we think the average is pretty high. There are a couple that, if you had something else to do, you could miss. There are a couple I would insist on your seeing. We are not ashamed of any. So, you

see, you'll have to watch them all."

Wayne and Shuster's show, in which they take a look at the comedy talents of people like Hope and Crosby (their premiere program), Jack Benny, W. C. Fields, the Marx Brothers, Mae West, already has had a successful run in their native Canada, as well as Australia, New Zealand and Hong Kong.

"We have a very good Chinese Nielsen," Johnny Wayne says.

"The key to the show," Wayne says, "is the word affection. We are against the current put-down style in which everyone has feet of clay and, if you believe in justice, you're Batman and you stink and are to be laughed at. This is an unabashedly sentimental look at some guys we think are great."

It took Johnny and Frank about a month to put together each of the shows. First they screened all the available film material.

Then, when they decided what clips to use, they sat down to write the script.

"We are not smartly unformed guides for this filmed material," Johnny said. "We're not trying to be critics."

"The original concept of the show was 50 per cent us and 50 per cent those we honor," Frank said.

"But we got it to 90 per cent them and 10 per cent us," Johnny said. "And we're leaving the country and going back to Canada before the show is on, so we can claim political asylum."

Rowan and Martin are an urbane and attractive pair who somehow always make this viewer think they are going to be — any minute now — funnier than they actually turn out to be. But they are pleasant and amusing, and they have some vital assistance in Dom de Luise, who is most effective in sketches.

They have some attractive young talent in the show. There is a striking young singer named Laine Kazan who looks a lot like Barbra Streisand. And a very pretty very young singer, Julie Rolin, with a fine soprano voice.

One of the gimmicks of the show is its informality. The actors themselves shove the scenery and props into position. A regular feature will be an "improvisation," when the three comedians and a guest — Thursday night it was Tom Smothers — ad lib their way through a subject picked on the spur of the moment.

The subject Thursday night was psychiatry and, without anyone telling a single psychiatrist joke, the bit built up amusingly. But it could just as easily turn into a resounding bomb.

At the same time on ABC, a documentary was encountering slow going making a case for extra sensory perception.

"The Baffling World of ESP" was earnest about the subject, ran into a real stone wall because it turned out to be a subject much easier to discuss than to illustrate.

Result was that it was largely a talk show with parapsychologists, psychologists, physicists and even mediums discussing such subjects as telepathy and empathy and dreams.

There were tantalizing bits, too. One was a fil purporting to show a British medium getting "in touch" with the deceased father of a woman he had never met before. Another showed experiments in a Brooklyn hospital involving thought projection and dreams.

The documentary, in general, suffered from an excess of talk and what was really a lack of visual documentation.
