CHICAGO (AP)—Racial violence wracked a tidy all-white neighborhood yesterday for the second time when Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who was felled by a rock, said the eruption was fostered by the worst hate he has ever seen.

Police arrested 39 white persons, including 29 women. Hospitalized 28 persons were brought in with injuries, including two persons on stretchers, an unconscious man, a young girl with a fractured skull, and a flying glass and three policemen.

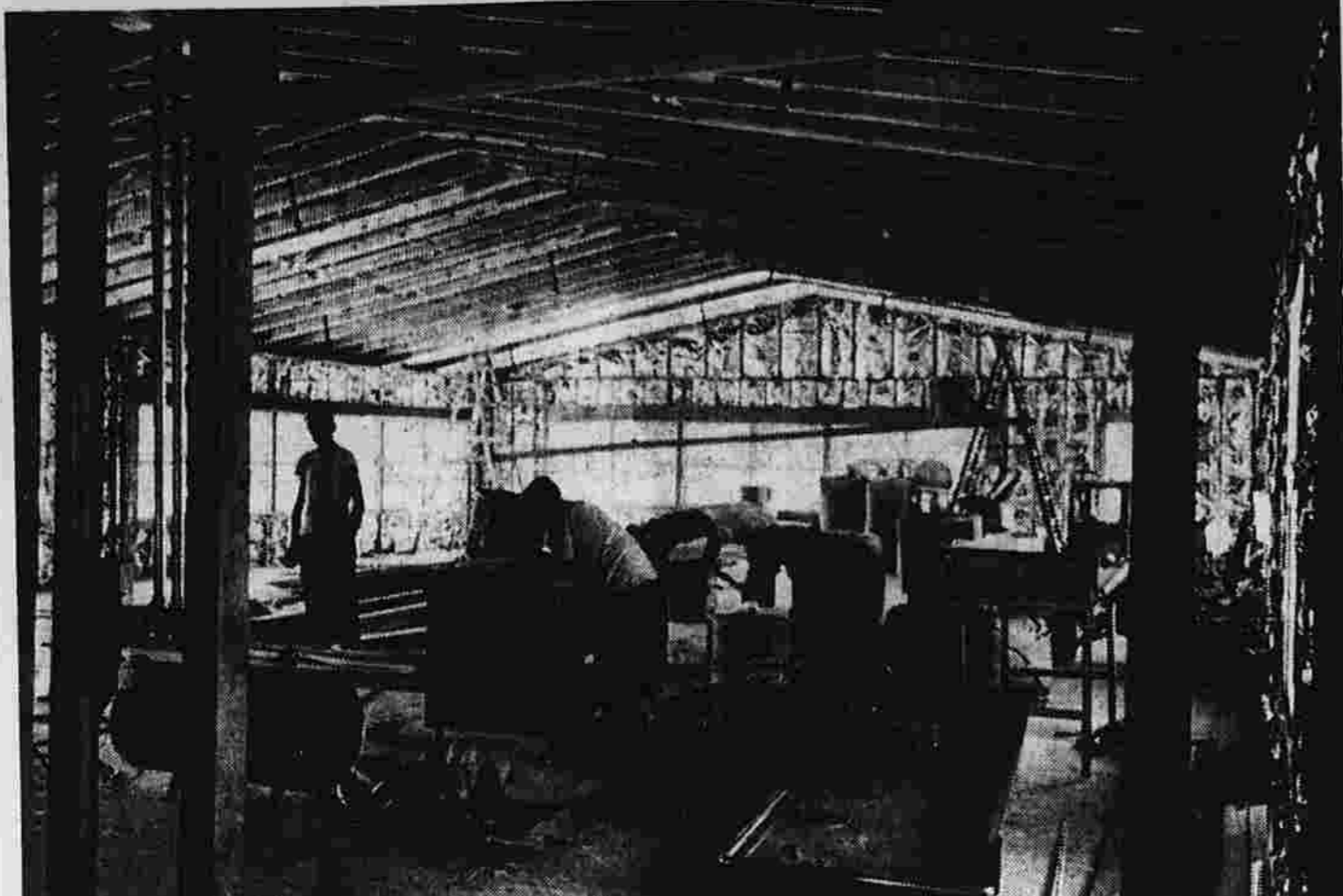

BUILDS SYSTEM

An experimental oxygen-producing system, designed for future manned spacecraft on flights lasting more than six months, will be built by Hamilton Standard for the U. S. Air Force.

The system will reclaim oxygen from carbon dioxide, the waste gas exhaled by humans, so it can be rebreathed by space crewmen. Its design is based on the results of a six-month study which Hamilton Standard completed recently for the Air Force Flight Dynamics Laboratory.

The atmosphere regeneration system will remove up to three pounds of carbon dioxide a day from the cabin compartment's air flow, maintaining the gas concentration at a safe level.

Designed to work under weightless as well as earth-gravity conditions, it will handle an atmosphere composed of 50 per cent oxygen, 50 per cent nitrogen at seven pounds per square inch, or half the earth's atmospheric pressure at sea level.

The company is developing an alternate method of reclaiming oxygen in a separate space lift support program.

NEWS AT ROGERS

Rogers Corporation recently broke ground for a 10,000-square foot addition to its headquarters building which is to be located in the area of its present plant in Rogers.

The new addition will house executive, marketing, personnel and purchasing offices. The present administration building will be occupied by the firm's financial department and an associated data processing installation.

Construction of the new facility is part of a planned expansion program which already has seen manufacturing additions at the firm's Killingly, Manchester and Willimantic divisions. A new office addition is currently under construction at the Manchester plant.

The company has recently entered into an agreement with

Westinghouse Electric Corp. by which Rogers will acquire patents, processes and special manufacturing equipment for Westinghouse's positron flat wiring and flexible circuit system.

The positron system provides a method by which wiring and circuit connections are made resistant to extremely high temperatures and other hostile environmental conditions in aerospace electronics.

The agreement calls for closing later this month.

Hollywood Cameras Are Rolling--for TV

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — This may be vacation-time for most of that nation, but not at the film studios, where next season's products are rolling down the assembly lines.

Only a few years ago many of the larger studios, MGM among them, were ignoring television in the belief that it would go away.

At the moment there are 89 television programs being created in this film capital.

Although the trade paper, the Hollywood Reporter, notes that there are 62 motion picture features currently before the cameras, only 20 of them are being filmed here. The rest are being shot in Spain, Hong Kong, England, France, Italy and New York.

Little sister television has become the largest consumer of Hollywood talent — so big, in fact, that there is a shortage of space and equipment to handle all the activity.

All studios are reporting peak

production. MGM has five motion pictures and seven television series in production and is using all 90 of its sound stages and its three back lots.

This reporter, fresh off a plane from New York and a month's vacation, will spend the next few weeks looking over the new television product, visiting the studios and sets and talking to the writers, producers, directors and stars.

A couple of seasons back ABC inaugurated the system of launching the new season in seven days starting the Monday after Labor Day. NBC and CBS followed suit, with the result that last fall viewers were confronted in seven days with an enormous smorgasbord of television fare but were able to sample only a portion.

The system failed to please the audience and it was not very satisfactory to the networks because they had to wait for

Dropping an Image

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — It has been a few months since Richard Chamberlain abandoned his bedside manner as Dr. Kildare, but the earnest young medic continues to haunt him.

"And will continue for some time to come," he admits.

After all, the NBC series has been on the network for five years and will continue to return itself to death in the late summer. Now Chamberlain is faced with the challenge that comes to all stars of television series: Establishing his own identity.

As a first move in the campaign, Chamberlain embarked on a four-week tour of summer theaters in the Noel Coward comedy, "Private Lives." The results?

"Mixed," the actor admitted. "The audiences laughed all the way, but it was tough playing an intimate comedy in theaters seating up to 4,000 people."

"While the audiences seemed to like the show, I could sense the resistance to my appearing as something besides Kildare. During the early part of the play, there would be an undercurrent of comment as people said things like, 'But his hair isn't blond!' or, 'He doesn't sound the same on TV.'"

"After the performances there would be an autograph line, which was kind of a drag, but it did give me a cross-section of opinion. Men would say, 'I bet you're glad you don't have to play that goodie-goodie any more,' while women comment-

ed, 'Why did you change your hair?'"

The hair is part of his escape plan. He changed from his good-guy blond to a shade somewhat darker than his natural brown.

Chamberlain realizes, of course, that it will take more than a change of hair shade to create himself in a new image. He's reading scripts in search of a movie to aid the campaign.

He made two movies under his MGM contract, which still extends a year and a half. Neither advanced his film career.

"Twilight of Honor" drew scant attention, "deservedly so." He had a better opinion of "Joy in the Morning," but opined that MGM failed to sell it properly.

"What I need right now is a topflight movie with big names, so that I don't have to carry the whole load myself," said Chamberlain. "I'll just sit and wait until I find one."

Bickford, at 75, Joins a Series

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — When Charles Bickford was a young stock company actor, an old man passed him on the street one day, carrying a shabby suitcase.

"He'd been an actor 50 years and taught me everything I knew," Bickford recalls. "Everything he owned was in that suitcase. I made up my mind that wouldn't happen to me."

Result: Counting the value of his investments, Bickford is a millionaire, owning three companies that employ nearly 100 persons.

And at 75 he's still working hard! Launching his first television series as the ranch owner in NBC's weekly 90-minute "The Virginian." He succeeds Lee J. Cobb in the show, filming for its fifth year.

"Retire? Why should I? There are things I want to do," growled the screen veteran, a rebellious Irishman who has scrapped with movie moguls over contracts.

"I've been everywhere, seen practically everything. I don't have to work, but I would miss it if I didn't."

"I think it's tragic to see business executives forced to retire,

wandering around like lost souls! Waiting to die. That's pretty horrible. I expect to be around for a long time yet."

Bickford is a Cambridge, Mass., native who was a logger, hobo, barker, roach exterminator and vaudeville performer on route to Broadway and then movie stardom.

He is also an author whose book about incidents in his ca-

(Continued from Page One) works launching their new shows and returning series in one hectic week starting Sept. 12.

However, at the end of July, ABC suddenly announced it would have "advance premieres" of 12 of its 16 new programs a week earlier — starting the day after Labor Day. The move obviously will give new ABC shows exposure to viewers while the two rival networks are still showing reruns. At this writing, neither NBC nor CBS have pushed up their opening dates.

Getting there first is considered to be a big advantage, so presumably there will be counter-moves. But there is no place to go but into the pre-Labor Day period when audiences are down and interest in television is a low point.

The maneuvering is part of the bitter internetwork ratings race. There is little chance that the networks will ever go back to their old habit of earmarking a week each for starting the fall schedules. The networks whose weeks came second and third always felt it was a handicap.
