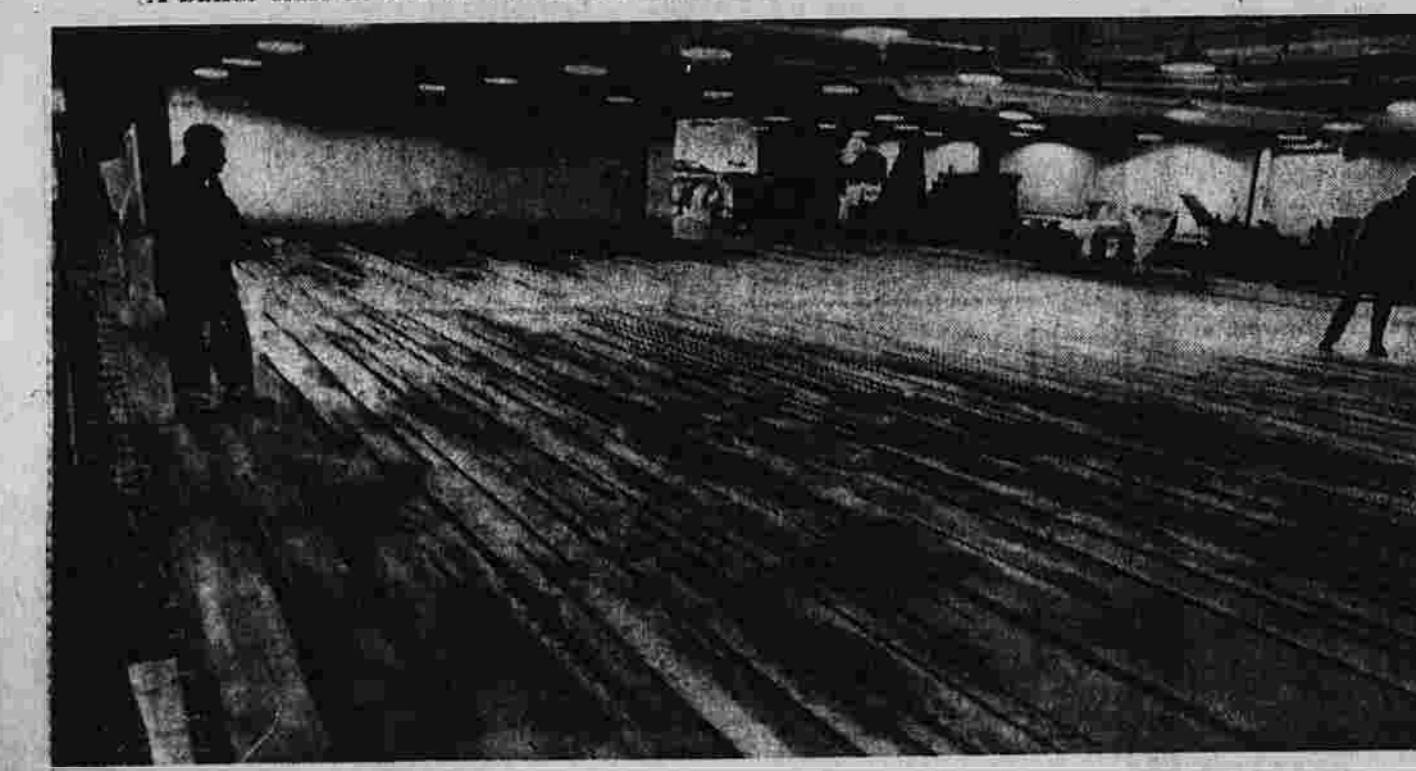

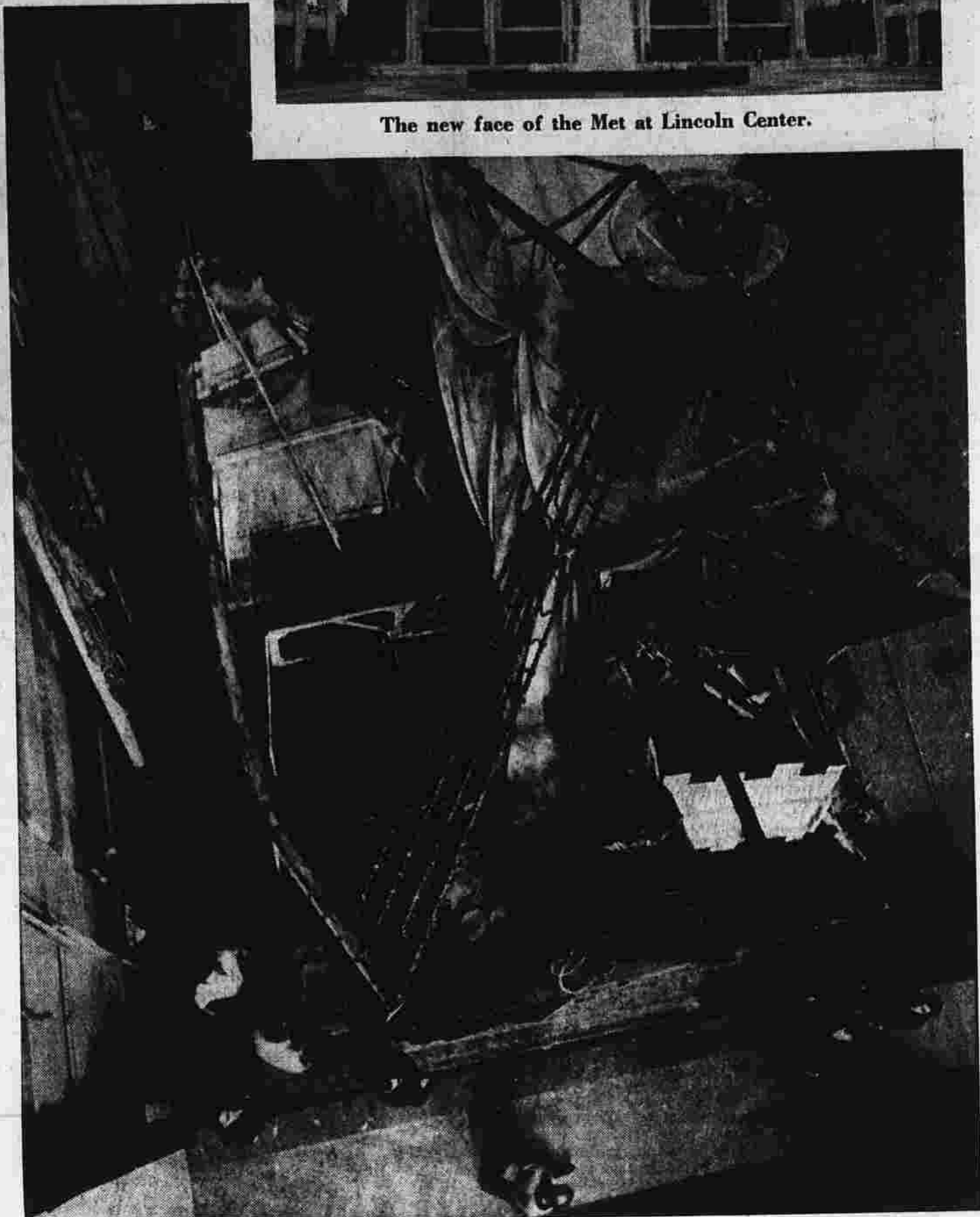

Like to go backstage at the Met? Of course you would. You can see the front of the house by buying a ticket, but getting backstage is a different matter, so through the kindness of Francis Robinson, assistant manager of the great institution, The Herald is able to give you some glimpse of things never seen at performance.

Production facilities at the Met are tremendous. Back of the proscenium there is a T-shaped area 14 feet deep and 234 feet wide. A Piper Cub could land and take off here. The space is all put to good use even though the sets are only about 60 feet wide as a rule, and perhaps 45 feet deep.

Perhaps one third of the entire area shows in the photo at the top left of this page. On the left you can see part of the 86 foot turntable which is part of a stage wagon comprising the bottom of the "T" and toward the upper center you can see part of another stage wagon forming one of the arms of the "T". A third stage wagon is beneath your feet when you stand where we were to take the picture.

Four fair sized houses could be accommodated on any one of the stage wagons which vary in size from 48 by 60 to 60 by 60 feet. Four complete sets can be completely erected on stage at any one time and moved into place on the wagons which are completely motorized.

The floor of the main stage (treated as one or individually) is then lowered until the floor of the stage wagon is even with the stage apron, and huge sets are changed in a matter of moments. During performance the auxiliary areas are normally separated from the main stage by fire curtains, but for something really spectacular, the full depth may be employed.

Most operas require wigs and "coaching" rooms where individuals may get up in their scheduled later in the season. A rehearsal took place a little later so that Dr. Herbert Graf could ascertain whether the wigs and hair stylist at Lincoln Center were perfectly adapted to his needs before the scenery was completed and painted.

A little earlier, stage hands had been "striking" a "La Gioconda" set and if you look at the upper right picture you'll see half the ship used in Act II descending to storage via an elevator. "Hanging staves" and drop curtains are lowered by a different elevator 74 feet long.

The size of one of these drops can be seen in the photo, bottom left. Here scenic artists are laying out masts, spars and ship rigging on a drop for still another production. Later these will be painted in on a "main bridge".

But enough for now about the stage. Volumes could be written about it and probably have been. The intricate lighting with all its "bunches," "spots," "transmitters" and so on, are controlled from a master console whose complexity is unbelievable and is computer programmed. This is situated back of the auditorium so that the effects can be judged as seen by the audience rather than as viewed from onstage, the usual custom.

On the stage level are 14 dressing rooms for principals which can accommodate three people each. All have a piano, a chaise longue, several chairs, double make-up tables and baths. Also on this level is a large dressing room for female choristers. Choristers and supernumeraries dress one flight up, while musicians and stage hands find their dressing rooms a flight down. Incidentally, the depth underneath the stage is 44 feet. This is really the cutting room; there are rooms as well for designers, fabric stores and so on. And all this is duplicated in a tailoring establishment for men's costumes.

Hundreds of costumes are needed for each production, and the number for an entire season runs into the thousands. All carefully researched for period, design, material, and new production of "Elektra" decoration.

Here's where wigs are made.

### Impeachment Letter Tabled In Stamford

STAMFORD (AP) — A letter calling for the impeachment of Mayor Thomas C. Mayers over the scattered site housing issue was quietly tabled Monday night by the steering committee of the city's Board of Representatives.

The letter was sent by Michael Sallis, former public relations representative of a coalition of 22 neighborhood groups opposing the mayor's plan to build low-income housing units on scattered housing sites throughout the city. Sallis called for the impeachment of Mayers, who is also the Republican candidate for state comptroller, because Mayers had labeled the housing proposal a "moral issue."

His letter, sent to George Russell, president of the Board of Representatives, was referred to the steering committee at the board's Oct. 2 meeting. The steering committee voted Monday night not to put the matter on the board's agenda. Mayers suggested a compromise low-income housing program on the board's agenda. Samples from the plan include the down-zoning of sites near old neighborhoods, as his original plan did.

Test Launch Delayed by Faulty Data

The launching of an Atlas-Centaur rocket in a test flight was postponed today when faulty temperature data came from a radio channel in the second stage.

The trouble developed as the countdown reached five minutes. No new launching date was set immediately.

The radio channel transmits temperatures recorded on the chambers of two liquid hydrogen engines.

A space agency spokesman said that a land line connected to the rocket on the pad relayed proper data but that the radio channel did not. Without the temperature information, ground stations would not be able to evaluate performance of the second stage during flight.

Main goal of the test flight will be the first double ignition of high-powered hydrogen engines in space.

Preparations continued here for the launching Wednesday of a satellite by the Communications Satellite Corp.

Success of the Atlas-Centaur double ignition will qualify the rocket for unmanned lunar and planetary flights.

After being propelled through the atmosphere, the Centaur upper stage was to fire itself into a 100-mile-high loop over the Gulf of Mexico.

Atlas-Centaur are scheduled to launch a probe toward Venus next year and two vehicles toward Mars in 1969.
