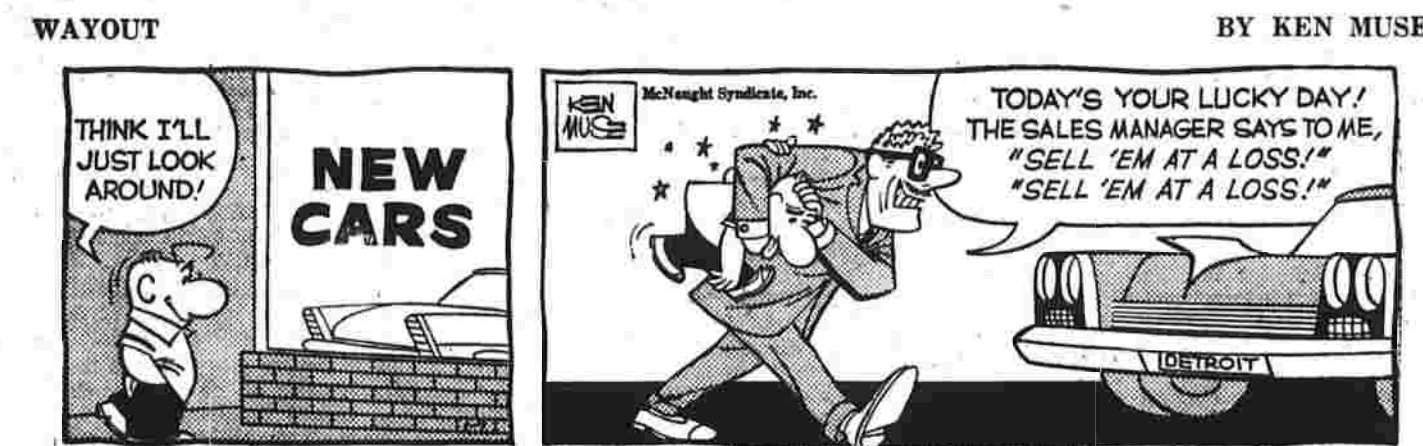

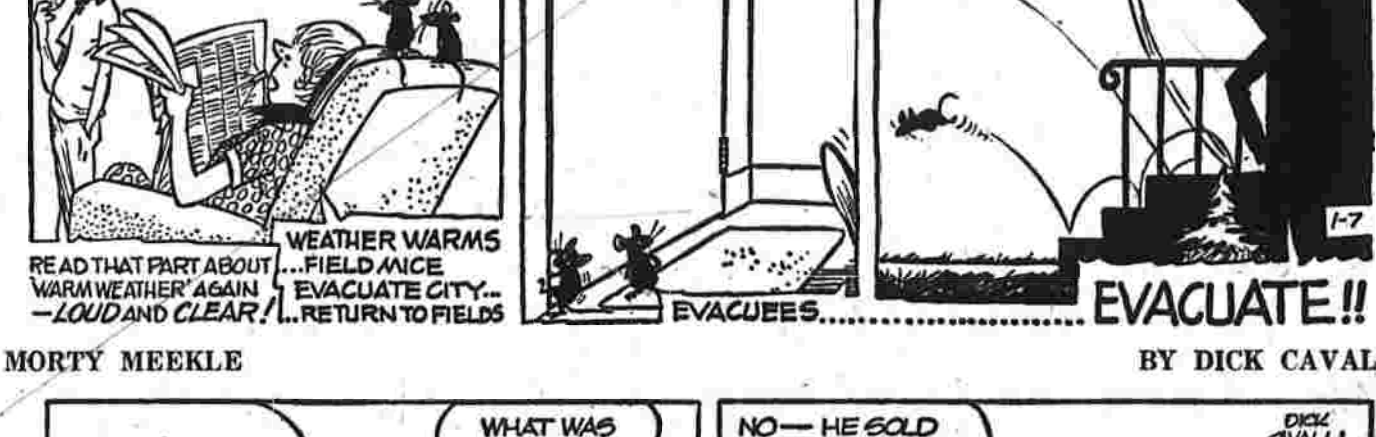
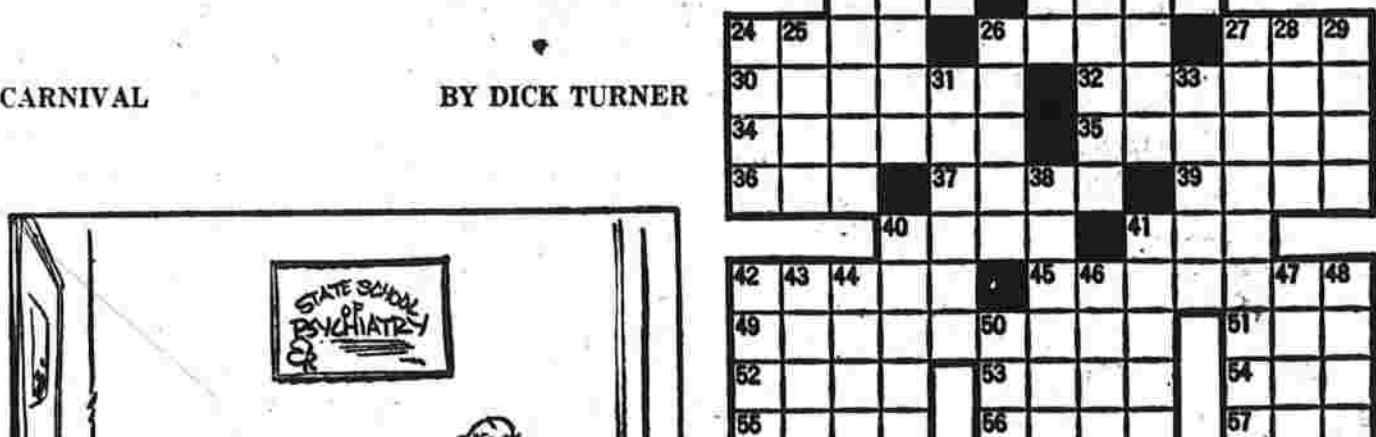

Million Dollar Nose

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Don Adams, the flat-voiced sleuth of "Get Smart," is the kind of a comedian who draws laughs from his wife even when he's deadly serious.

Recently he telephoned his wife from a hospital and told her: "Darling, there's been an accident. I've broken my nose."

Mrs. Adams burst out laughing. When her husband grew indignant she explained that her alarm over his mention of an "accident" was so relieved by news of the broken nose that she felt impelled to laugh.

The accident to Adams was no joke to NBC and Talent Associates, which has an investment of millions riding on the comedian. Like only a few other stars — Lucille Ball, Andy Griffith, Jim Nabors — Adams is virtually irreplaceable in his television series, since his personality is so firmly imprinted on it.

Fortunately for all concerned, Adams is recovering from the accident, with no apparent damage to his face or to his inimitable voice.

How did it happen?

"We were rehearsing a fight scene on a building that was under construction," he said. "I had gone through my scene a couple of times, then I stepped back while a couple of actors rehearsed their fight."

"I wanted to figure out where I would stand, and I turned around to see the position of a girder. I walked right into a punch. All at once the stars and rockets started going off and I couldn't feel a thing on my nose because it was so shattered. The pain was in my eye, and I was convinced that was where he hit me."

Adams asked an assistant director to lead him off the set so the rest of the company wouldn't become alarmed. He was still convinced he had been hit in the eye until he looked into a mirror. "I had to laugh," he recalled ruefully. "I had never seen a nose in such ridiculous condition."

The comic was taken from the studio to a nearby hospital and a plastic surgeon was summoned. A one-hour operation put the nose back together, and Adams remained hospitalized for eight days. Production on the series was suspended indefinitely.

After it appeared that Adams' face would be unmarked, network officials had another concern.

"Will his voice be the same?" they asked his doctor.

"I don't know," was the reply. He had corrected a deviated septum which was believed to give Adams his highly identifiable voice.

"They needn't have worried," says the comic, "because I can do that voice in any case. What few people realize is that I only use that voice three or four times in the show, just to point up punch lines. I did the voice throughout the first four shows but then I decided it was too grating on most people."

His nose is still bandaged, but he expects to be back in his J. Maxwell Smart form by the time the series resumes filming next week.

NEW YORK (AP) — ABC, still happy over the extraordinarily large audience it received for its "Bridge on the River Kwai" broadcast last fall, now has acquired rights for two broadcasts of what it hopes is another blockbuster. Cliff Robertson Begs for a Part

NEW YORK (AP) — A busy, popular actor rarely admits he begged for a bit part in a television series. Cliff Robertson, who played young John F. Kennedy in the movie "PT 109," boasts about it.

A few months ago Robertson treated his daughter Stephanie, 7, to a visit to the "Batman" set. On the way home she looked her father over thoughtfully and remarked: "I never knew you knew such important people."

"I went to see Bill Dozier, the 'Batman' producer the next day," said Robertson. "I said I had a problem. 'Yes, I know,' Dozier answered. 'You want a cameo role in the show.'"

"I looked surprised, and then he said that almost all actors with young children had the same problem. Anyway he worked out a little something—it took about a day—so I could impress my child. I don't quite know when I will be seen—briefly—in an episode."

Robertson, in his early 40s, is primarily interested in his booming film career, and works in television only as an occasional performer who can pick his spots and material.

Robertson has been doing well for about 10 years, but he says that "the Kennedy thing was just great for me because it focused national attention and generated a lot of publicity."

"Whether you like it or not, publicity certainly helps a performer get the kind of roles he wants."

CBS, in its second annual current events quiz for television viewers, Tuesday night propounded about 30 questions

on last year's news that ranged broadly from Vietnam to the Warren report to the moon's surface.

As usual the test was given in advance to a typical national sample with the usual discouraging result—79 per cent flunked.

NBS rolled up a substantial lead in the national Nielsen ratings released Tuesday with an average of 20.4 over CBS's 18.6 and ABC's 16.4.

Most popular programs during the two weeks ending Dec. 18 were NBC's "Bonanza," CBS's rerun of "A Charlie Brown Christmas," NBC's Danny Thomas special, CBS's
