Tolland Insurance Study Committee Questioned on Its Progress

The Insurance Study Committee report presented during last night's Board of Selectmen meeting shows the committee still has a long way to go before the details are completed, despite its existing for two years.

The anticipated report of the Comprehensive Study Committee for the use of Town Buildings was changed at the last minute before presentation to the Selectmen last night, after committee chairman Clyde Johnson consulted with Board of Finance Chairman Howard Wolfanger before the meeting.

The report as prepared was withdrawn until reviewed by the committee Thursday night, and both Johnson and Wolfanger pushed for the renovation of the first floor of the jail building only.

They estimated that the cost of installing a heating system and the renovation of the first floor would be \$250,000. Wolfanger is designated to receive two rooms on the first floor as offices since his election as judge of probate.

The other two rooms are earmarked for the first selectman, but Thifault pointed to an anticipated budget deficit by the Board of Education which might run as high as \$50,000.

MIDDLEFIELD (AP) — This town's citizens voted Tuesday night to pay \$14,034 in bills incurred because of the abortive Powder Ridge Music Festival here last summer.

Allano to Ask That Committees Write All Bills

HARTFORD (AP) — State Sen. Charles T. Allano, D-Sturfield, president pro tem of the Senate, said Tuesday he will push in the next legislative session for a requirement that all bills be written by committees rather than by individual legislators.

Instead of the 5,000 to 6,000 bills usually filed, this method could mean the drafting of between 1,000 and 1,500, the number usually acted on by an assembly," Allano said.

He said the proposed rule would not inhibit lawmakers from filing, but they would file only a general statement of purpose. The detailed bill would be drafted by the appropriate committee following a public hearing on the subject.

In other areas of possible streamlining, Allano said he would also favor a drastic reduction in the number of legislative committees. During the last session there were more than 30 committees in action. This was cut to 19 during the interim period.

Allano said he would like to see between 15 and 20 committees at the most.

Meadowbrook Program Outlined

Members of the Board of Education and interested guests were taken on a guided tour of Meadowbrook School's continuing education program last week...

"No Pets Allowed"

When the Scotts rented a new apartment, they took it for granted that their dog Rover would be as welcome as they were. But soon after they moved in, the landlord called their attention to the "No Pets Allowed" clause in their lease.

Unwilling to give up either the dog or the apartment, the Scotts determined to fight. In a court hearing, they offered this argument to the judge:

"Rover happens to be a quiet, well-behaved animal who never bothers a soul and never does any damage. Of course, if he should cause trouble, we would gladly take full responsibility. But in the meantime, enforcing this no-pets rule against us would be arbitrary and unfair."

Nevertheless, the court held they would have to abide by the rule or move out. The judge said a landlord may reasonably be concerned not only about noise, and not only about damage, but also about the likelihood that other tenants might want to keep pets too.

Generally speaking, the law gives a landlord broad discretion with regard to pets on the premises. In fact, even if no restrictions are spelled out in the lease, he may still be able to take legal action.

This, another landlord won an eviction order against an elderly woman who harbored no less than 23 cats in her small apartment. Even though pets were not mentioned in the lease, the court said 23 cats were simply a matter of common sense—23 cats too many.

On the other hand, a landlord may lose his enforcement rights by "going easy" on a tenant for a substantial period. In one case, a landlord tried to evict a tenant after permitting him to keep a parrot for almost four years.

In these circumstances, the landlord was held to have waived the rights he had under the lease. The court said that, even though the lease plainly said "No Pets Allowed," the landlord's inaction spoke louder than words.

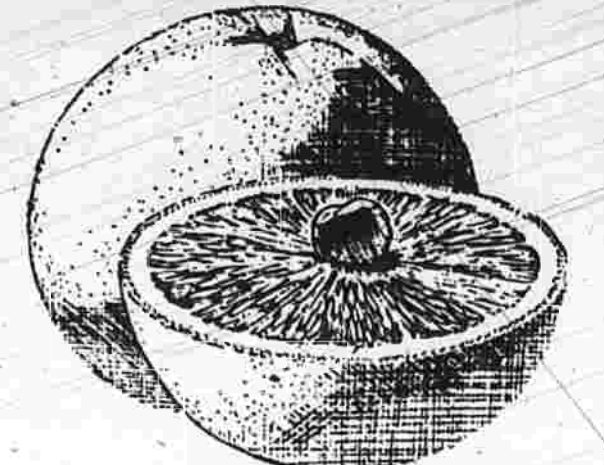

Can of Paint Can Brighten Ladies' Day

Time was when a woman could get a tremendous lift during a spell of dreary weather by buying a new hat. In this halcyon era, she may get her psychological upswing by buying a can of paint.

Paint can provide cheerful inspiration in a jiffy, and a paint project can be great therapy for people who have time on their hands. Flat surfaces can be done easily with a roller. Moldings, borders and furniture can come alive with a paint brush of color.

Here are some suggestions: A string of closet doors in a long hallway—must they be white? Why not paint them a vivid color to match the rug, an accent in the rug or the wall draperies. Consider painting the door moldings in an accent color or white. Deep colors—royal shades and blues—can be lovely. The refreshing new pastels—deep yellow, pink, green—can be good choices.

Is there a dull looking wood floor in the children's room or another room of the house? Why not treat it to a new coat of finish. It is just as easy to care for a dark red floor as an ugly brown-stained one. The color can be beautiful. Give it a shiny, plastic-looking finish, if this appeals to you.

For example, a Martha Washington chamber sewing table that was to become an end table was stripped of paint and sandpaper to produce a matte finish; whereas a shiny finished and unsanded coffee table permitted Mink color paint to be used on both pieces, but the color effect was completely different. Before sanding a piece, consider whether you would like the creamy finish.

Old white metal cabinets in the kitchen may be treated to a sunshine color such as yellow or a warm shade such as bitter-sweet—an orange-red. (Use a shiny finish.) Bitter-sweet is simply great with white, especially white plastic. If you happen to have counter tops of the material, a good color scheme is bitter-sweet upper and lower cabinets and white appliances—washing machine, dial washer, refrigerator, stove, whatever. (It would be a nuisance to paint these, if the look were preferable.)

Dye your curtains to match the bitter-sweet, and if you happen to have white kitchen floor or a terrazo-style vinyl, it will complement it even more.

Large houseplants can be used as beautiful decorative accents by painting willow wastebaskets and using them as outer containers. In a room with yellow and orange throw rugs, one would paint the basket plant holders in streaked effects of yellow and white with dots of green. These plants in baskets may be used on floors at sunny windows.

If the baskets have lids such as those willow baskets have that are shipped with fruit, remove the lids and use it under the basket to protect floor or rug from plant moisture. (Be sure to measure the widest part of the clay pot before you buy the outer container.)

Social Security CHICAGO (AP)—Social security benefits of around \$1,000 a month or more are possible if legislation pending in Congress is approved. Commerce Clearing House, a tax authority service, said there have been many liberalizations in benefits since 1935 when the Social Security Act was first passed. 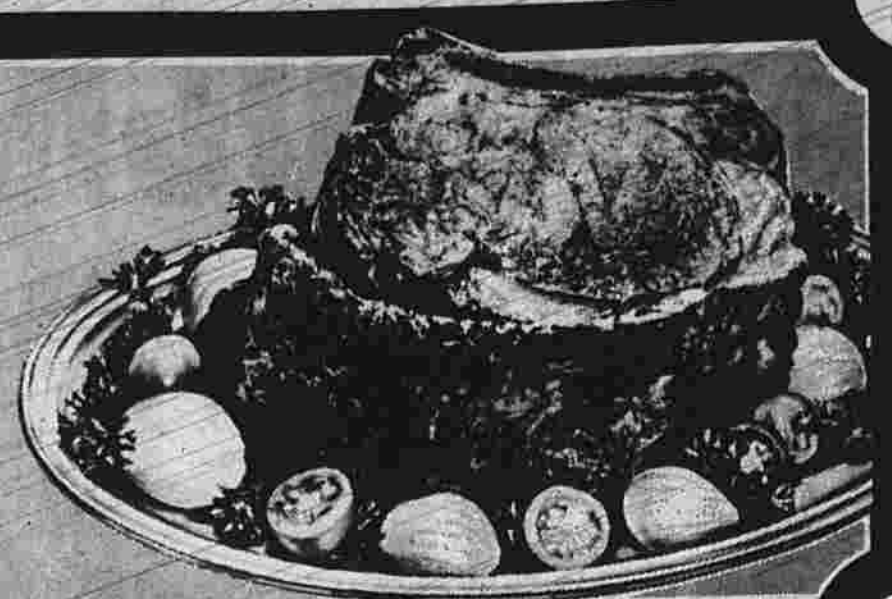

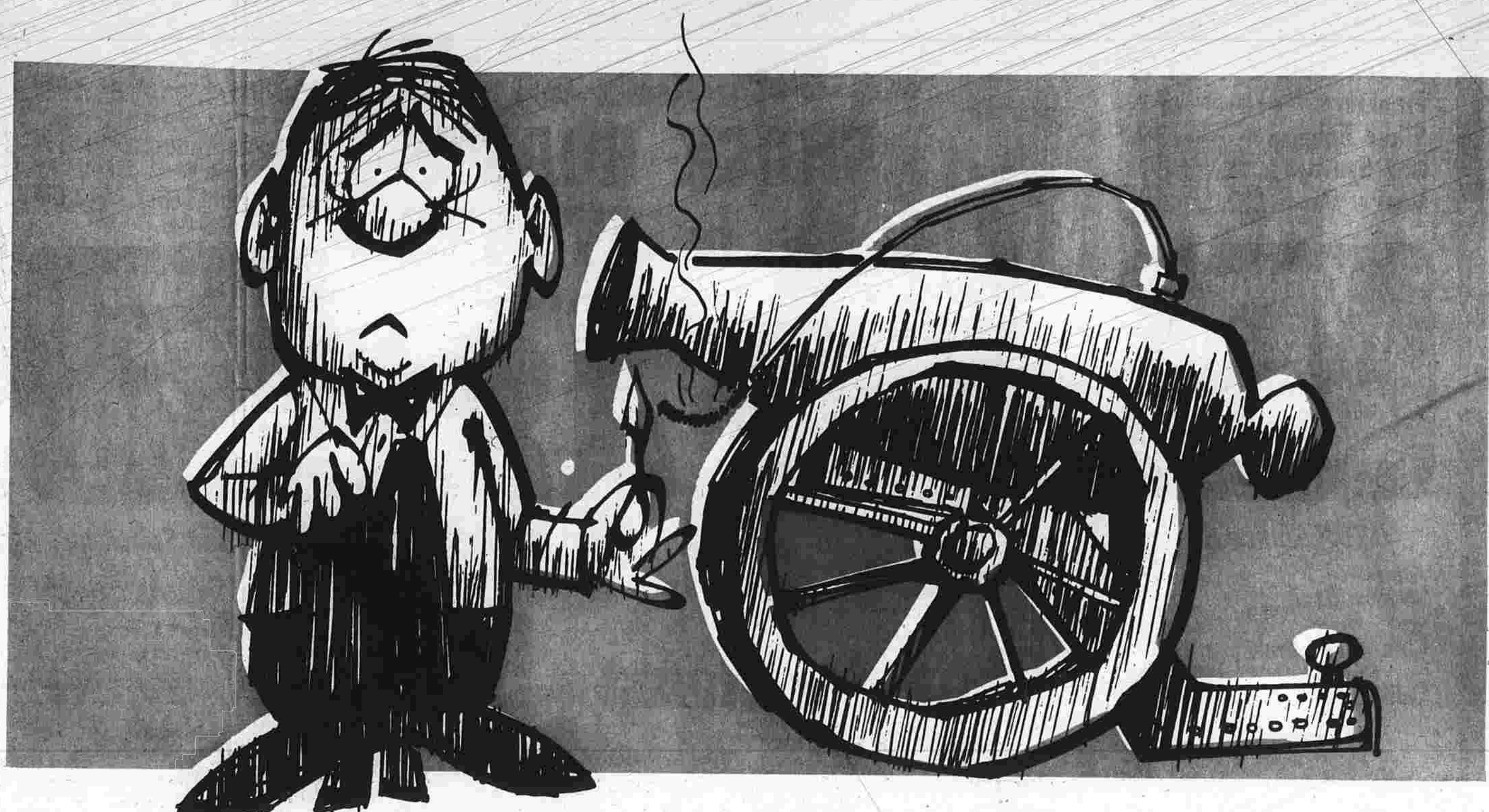

Leaders Fill Cathedral; Pay De Gaulle Tribute

PARIS (AP) — France today paid tribute to Charles de Gaulle, the leader of the Free French, in the magnificence of Notre Dame Cathedral, yet with the simplicity he ordained, world leaders joined thousands of Parisians at an austere Mass conducted with the Magnificat.

De Gaulle's body was not at this church of Our Lady, where the tall general once celebrated the liberation of Paris from the legions of Adolf Hitler.

Great crowds had gathered at the village of Colombey les Deux Eglises, but a simple burial in a country churchyard replaced the military pomp that De Gaulle had rejected for the final ritual.

Thousands scores of world leaders, including President Nixon, made the Notre Dame service the greatest such gathering since the funeral of Dwight D. Eisenhower 19 months ago. And the bells of cathedrals and churches all over France sounded a requiem.
