

Air Space Plan Being Weighed At Crash Hour

A 15-minute mission. Aboard the dual-control plane were an instructor and a student pilot, the latter sitting toward the rear under a hood. The cockpit was filled with instruments with no outside vision. The instructor was not hooded.

Some 15 minutes later, the Civil Aeronautics Authority in Los Angeles got its last report from the pilot over the Mojave Desert community of Daggett, Calif.

At 8:28, the F100 reported to its base from over Las Vegas and was given permission by Nelles to make its "let down" (descent) on instrument.

About two minutes later, at 8:30, the plane met and its autopilot thundered in the clear desert sky.

Just after the collision, Nelles reported that the instructor called "Mayday." Other words came in radio, but they were garbled and unintelligible.

A frantic call also was received from the stricken airliner. The pilot said: "United Air Lines 78 (flight number) Mayday. Mid-air collision over Las Vegas, 78." No more was heard.

Watched 4-Mile Plunge

From Las Vegas, many observed the airliner in its 4-mile dive.

"One wing of the DC7 burst into flames just before it crashed," said Jeff Marston Sr., who had been watching the airliner speed as it fell. "The wings were along the fuselage, it came down and fell in flames."

The main body of the wreckage was a burning ball of fire, 10 miles southeast of Las Vegas. The site is about 10 miles from where actress Carole Lombard and other stars were killed in a 1942 plane crash. The F100 went down about five miles from the airliner.

Brig. Gen. James H. McChesney, commander of Nelles, said investigation "revealed one pilot ejected, apparently too late for the chute to open."

Penn-Texas Slate Bucked By Local Pair

Manchester Attorneys George C. Lesner and John A. G. Hartigan have announced their support of the Penn-Texas Corp. management slate in the upcoming proxy fight for seats on the company's board of directors.

Lesner and Hartigan had themselves been dissident stockholders until the management, in an unprecedented move, named them as advisory committee to the firm's board of directors.

This appointment followed the success of a group of four dissident directors in ousting three board members who were supporters of Leopold D. Silberstein, an industrial company president.

In announcing their support of the management slate, Rottner said that he and Lesner had met with the slate's "former" and "new" directors and discussed their views and objectives they have supported.

These four directors are Robert C. Finkelshtein, Wallace S. Whitaker, Altona Landa and Geneva C. T. Latham. Also on the management slate is Aaron Jacoby, who has served as board chairman since Silberstein's resignation.

71 Unions Merge
