Few people realize the work accomplished by Manchester Chapter of the American Red Cross during the war. In the limited space it is only possible to give the briefest sketch, but the figures will surprise many.

Growth of the Chapter. The Chapter has grown from fifty members in the spring of 1917 to ten thousand members, with two branches, Marlborough and Bolton, and with nineteen auxiliaries, made up of groups in churches, societies or neighborhoods.

Money Raised. During the First War Fund Drive in June, 1917, Manchester people contributed to the Red Cross \$4,767.24.

In the Second War Fund Drive in May, 1918, they contributed \$103,635.37, in both cases outstripping other towns of the same size, and several cities of much larger population.

Chapter Production. During the period of the War there was produced in the workrooms in the Recreation Building and by women working at home

Linen Shower. When the calls came for Linen, Manchester housewives stripped their cupboards bare, it would seem, for they sent to headquarters a total of 10,726 pieces, including sheets, bath towels, etc.

Old Clothes. There have been three calls for old clothes for refugees in Europe and Manchester has sent in all 18,045 lbs.

Influenza. When the epidemic broke out in the fall of 1918, the Red Cross met the emergency promptly. With the cooperation of Cheney Brothers, an Emergency Hospital was opened in Cheney Hall and operated at a high point of efficiency for a month. The opening of this hospital was undoubtedly responsible for the saving of many lives.

At the same time a Community Kitchen was opened in the Franklin School and for about two weeks food was prepared and sent out daily to homes where there was sickness.

When the second epidemic broke out, the Chapter secured a complete roster of the nurses in town and during the height of it, not only employed a visiting nurse, but were on the job day and night to secure nurses and other assistance for sick families.

First Aid Classes. Three First Aid classes have been conducted and about 40 diplomas awarded.

Through its Home Service, Manchester Chapter has extended aid and advice to all the families. By a system of weekly visits, cases of need among soldiers' families have been ascertained at once and help given. Over 29,500 letters have been sent out.

The Home Service Section has loaned to soldiers' families \$2,290.00. This money in most cases was advanced where for one reason or another the government allowance was not received promptly.

The Home Service Section has seen to it that every man's family was fully informed of the provisions of the War Risk Insurance and the man urged to take out the full amount.

The archives of the Home Service Section when complete will contain the name and address and war record of every man in service. The Home Service began to gather this data as soon as we entered the war and it was found of inestimable service in keeping the men in touch with their relatives.

Another privilege which few chapters extended to their men was the foreign shopping service. Through the aid of Doctor Hesselgrave, it was possible to deposit money with the local Home Service section, have it forwarded direct to Doctor Hesselgrave and money or supplies forwarded to the men.



The Army and Navy Clubhouse, which is shown on the next page, was designed by Raymond W. Goslee, and was built by Manchester Chapter, American Red Cross. The work was under the supervision of Mr. Goslee and Emil L. G. Henthal, Jr. Thru the splendid cooperation of several contractors who voluntarily worked without profit, and the local lumber companies, who furnished material at cost, the building has been practically completed.

The building is 90 feet front and 44 feet deep, with a 10 foot porch running the full length of the building. The building is divided into three main parts, the center auditorium being 44 feet by 52 feet, clear of all obstructions, and the ceiling is 15 feet in the clear. At the north end, a reading room 18 by 44 feet is equipped with comfortable chairs and a large fireplace. At the south end, the billiard and card room, the same size as the reading room, is to be equipped with pool tables and card table. The main auditorium can be opened in connection with the two end rooms and furnishes a seating capacity for 700 people. A small stage occupies the center of the auditorium and a sanitary wash-room and storage room extends in the rear.

The Army and Navy Club is an experiment and the land is furnished for a period of two years by Cheney Brothers at the request of the Home Service Committee. Building under certain conditions is to become the property of the Army and Navy Club and management of the Club and all details in connection with running it, rest with the Club members.



THE MANCHESTER MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

The Manchester Memorial Hospital when built will be Manchester's permanent tribute to the men and women who served our town, state and country during the great war that has just closed.

In the vestibule of the main entrance there will be inscribed in prominent letters the entire 1241 names on our honor roll.

Plans for the interior of the hospital were so well thought out by our local physicians as to receive favorable comment from all the architects who submitted competitive sketches. The sketch accepted by the committee is now on exhibition at the War Bureau. It is by Smith & Bassette, architects of Hartford.

The building is designed for practicality while at the same time it has graceful proportions. There are plenty of windows, and sun parlors at either end of two floors, an elevator, a fine operating room, wards for both men and women, a maternity ward and a number of rooms of varying size to meet the needs and preferences of patients.

The building is to stand on the highest point of the hill facing Main Street across the old baseball lot, commanding a magnificent view of the Connecticut Valley to the west and the Bolton Hills to the east. The entrance for visitors will be on this side of the building, approached by a drive and walk. The ground slopes to the rear giving a basement story on the west. A carriage porch in the center of the western front will receive carriages and ambulances bringing patients, who will be taken in on the basement level either directly to the elevator, or in case of accident, into a receiving or first aid room adjoining the elevator.

On either end of the building is an enclosed veranda 12 by 36 feet which may be used for lounging rooms for convalescents or, in case of an epidemic, may be utilized as dormitories in

connection with the wards. The space in the body of the first floor is occupied by the superintendent's office, nurses' and matrons' rooms, stock rooms and bath rooms. The chief feature of the third floor is a fine operating room at the north end. On this floor also are located the nurses' living quarters. Ten nurses, a superintendent and an assistant superintendent can be accommodated. Attractive features on this floor are a large recreation room and a sewing room for the nurses.

In the basement are all the mechanics of the hospital. The boiler room and laundry are located in the north wing with the coal bins under the porch. At the other end of the basement are the kitchen and the nurses' and servants' dining rooms. There is also ample room for storage, an X-Ray and plaster cast room, toilets, etc.

The intention is to build the hospital of red brick with stone foundation and trimmings and slate roof. Safety from fire is insured by 12 inch brick partitions separating the wings from the central part of the building. The hallways and staircases are also protected by brick walls. The basement staircase and the elevator will be of fireproof construction. The size of the building is approximately 90 by 45 feet.

The entire cost of the building is estimated at between \$75,000 and \$80,000. The equipment will cost approximately \$20,000 more and \$50,000 additional will be needed to guarantee expenses for two years, so it is felt that no less than \$150,000 will be needed to warrant beginning construction.

The drive for this amount of money will begin on Monday, the 19th and last for one week.
