

The suggested military treaty is designed to continue in force the Act of Chapultepec, adopted at the Mexico City Inter-American conference last March.

While calling for the peaceful settlement for disputes, the proposal provides for immediate assistance by the American in cases of armed attack either from within or without the hemisphere.

As soon as possible thereafter consultations would be held "to examine measures that may have already been taken in agreeing upon collective measures." A two-thrid's vote would be necessary for agreement.

Avoids Use Of "Aggression"

The proposal, defining armed attack as "invasion of territory by armed forces of any state," carefully avoids use of the word "aggression" which remains undefined under the United Nations charter. The treaty would, however, leave the UNO Security council free to step in at any time under terms of the charter.








