Police Force of Town Is Now Fully Manned

Twenty Regulars and Ten Supernumeraries Sufficient to Run Department Efficiently

Chief of Police Samuel G. Gordon last night stated that the present personnel of the Manchester Police Department was sufficient for the operation of the department.

He stated that there are now ten supernumeraries on the register which he considers sufficient so to meet the application of Joseph Bassett, 28, of 54 Denning street as a supernumerary.

At the present time the force has 30 regular policemen and ten supernumeraries. Police practice in towns of the size of Manchester calls for a regular police force, according to the latest estimated population, has one policeman for every 1,000 residents, which means a regular staff of 30 for every 30,000 population, which is the local estimate.

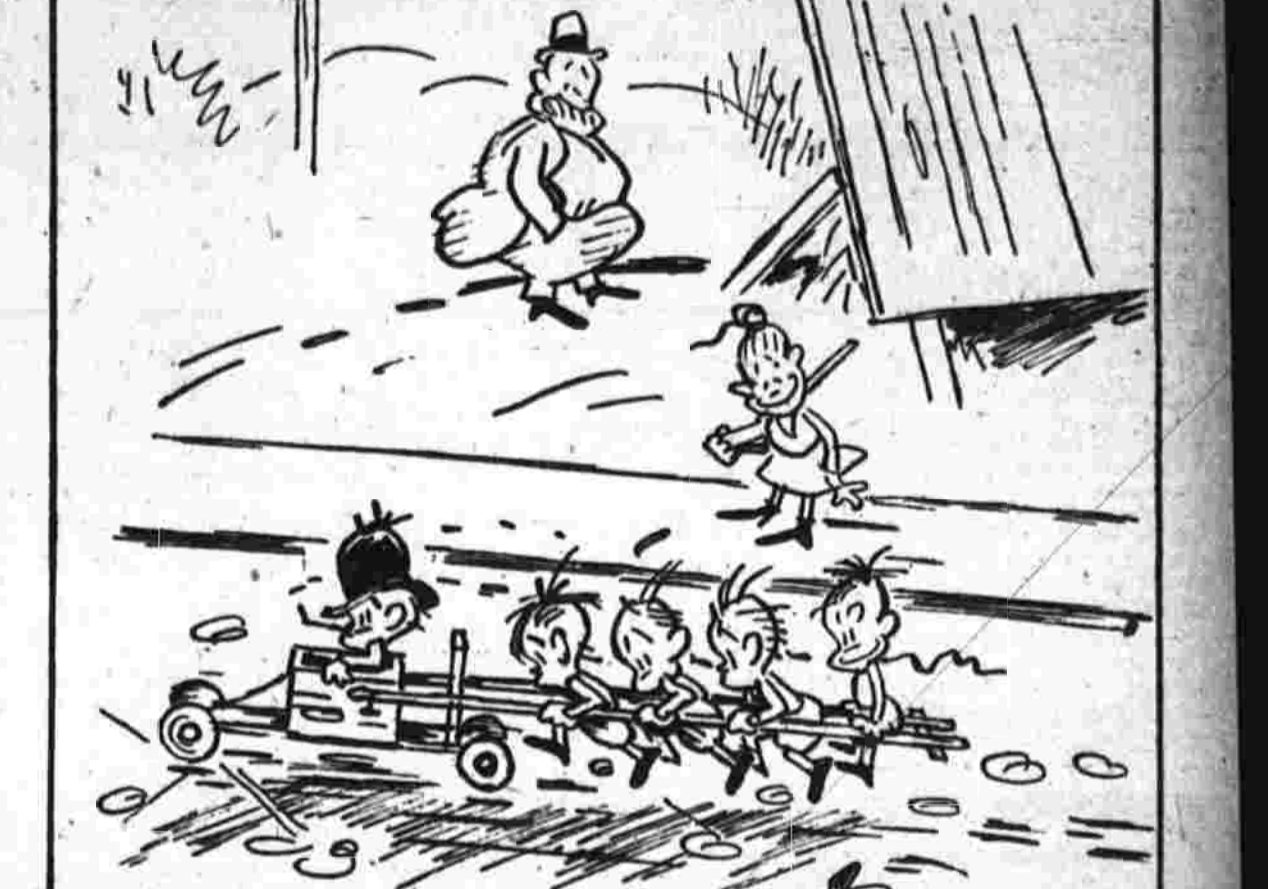

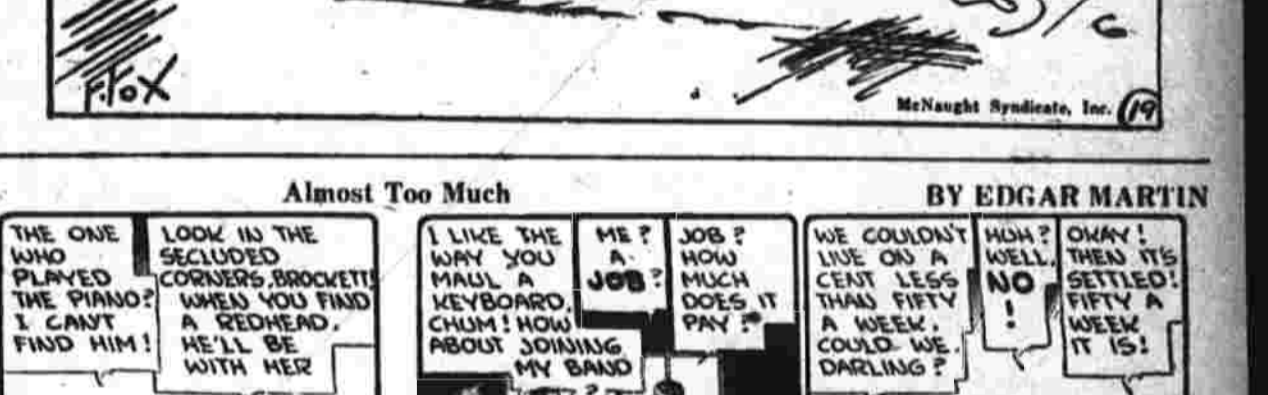

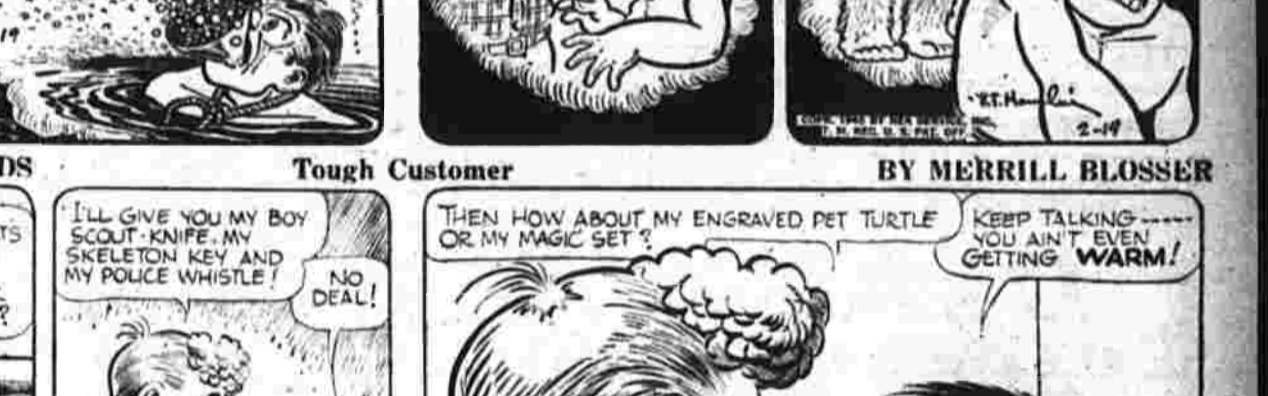
