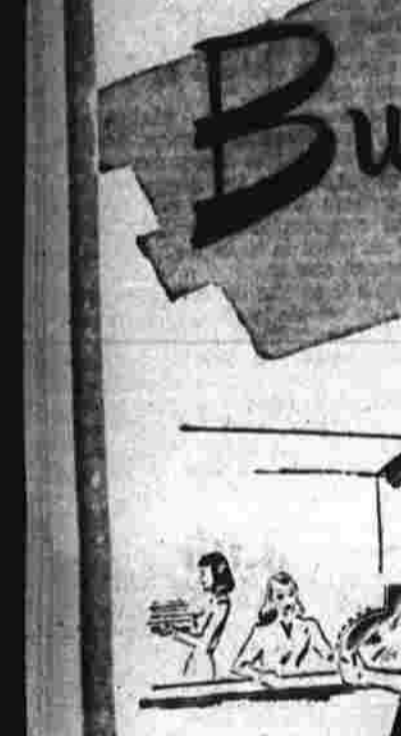

**Church Holds  
Its 50th Fair**

Other Negro Churches  
To Participate in Entertaining Feature

Hartford, Feb. 20.—Fifty years ago, the minister of the Shiloh Baptist church on Albany avenue met with his board of deacons to consider means of raising money for the church. It was decided to hold a church fair. The fair was so successful that it was repeated the next year, and the next.

This week, the Shiloh church is holding its 50th consecutive church fair. In the basement of the church, fully decorated with thousands of yellow streamers, the men and women have erected booths for the sale of food, household articles, aprons, toys, and the other objects traditional at church fairs.

**18 Churches To Participate**  
The other Negro churches in central Connecticut have taken over the entertainment program for every night of the fair, except the last. Thirteen churches in Hartford, Shiloh and New Britain will participate, conducting the programs from last night to Friday night. On Monday, the Shiloh congregation will conduct the current term. Eighteen of them will go to Quantico, Va., for further training, while the remaining 36 will be discharged and commissioned in the Marine Corps Reserve.

**Democratic Leader Dies**  
Salt Lake City, Feb. 20.—James H. Moyle, 57, founder of the Democratic party in Utah and assistant secretary of the Treasury during the Wilson administration, died last night. Prior to his retirement in 1940 Moyle also served as minister to Secretary of the Treasury Henry Morgenthau, Jr. He was U. S. collector of customs for eight years during the administration of the late President Roosevelt.

**Gabriel Appointed  
Visiting Professor**  
New Haven, Feb. 20.—The appointment of Prof. Ralph H. Gabriel of Yale as visiting professor of American history at the University of Sydney, Australia, was announced today.

Professor Gabriel, who will be granted a leave absence by Yale, will leave for Australia in May and plans to return here in December. His appointment to the university was arranged in cooperation with the Office of International Information and Cultural Affairs of the State department.

Professor Gabriel has been serving as director of Yale studies in Europe for several years. President Charles Seymour has appointed the present assistant director, Prof. James F. Mathias, Jr., to succeed him.
