Court Gets Water Fight

Attorney General Seeks Judgment on South Coventry Water Purity

Hartford, March 8.—The state has taken to the Superior court its 10-year fight to get for South Coventry drinking water it considers up to health standards. The action has been filed by Attorney General William J. Higgins and its seeks a court judgment to force the South Coventry Water Supply company to furnish to its subscribers water that will meet state requirements. The state alleges that State Health department and Public Utilities commission tests have shown the bacterial content of the water to be a "serious hazard to health."

As early as 1935, the state claims, the State Health department made overtures to the company to bring its water supply up to health standards.

French Land In Indo-China

Occupation Forces Go Ashore Without Firing Chinese Troops

Saigon, Indo China, March 8.—First elements of French occupation forces have landed in Tonkin province of northern Indo China, without further opposition from Chinese troops ashore. The French high command said today. General Lu Han, commander of Chinese troops in northern Indo China, ordered the Chinese fighting units to cease unauthorized hostilities against the French, who reported 10 soldiers were killed in a clash Wednesday when Chinese artillery fire damaged the French light cruiser Trompant which returned to the shore.

General Lu had just returned to Tonkin province from Chungking, Szechwan, where he had served in the French command during the Sino-Japanese war.

Churches of Christ Report

The Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America, meeting in Columbus, Ohio, last week, representing a good segment of the religious allegiance of this country, has adopted a report on the subject, "The Churches and World Order."

Ordinarily, let us confess it, many thinkers on world affairs and many men of action and policy on world affairs, would automatically reject the application of Christian ideals to world affairs.

But these are not ordinary times. The situation of the world today, the new and terrible power in the possession of mankind, make Christian ideals a practical salvation of the world.

Practical men can no longer scoff at these ideas as something reserved for polite attention on Sundays. If practical men wish to survive, they must make their attention to and their practice of these ideas a seven days a week proposition.

The Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, in our opinion, does a masterful job in outlining those principles which should govern America's conduct in the world today.

It points out that man today has two choices.

"The one course," the report says, "is competition for new weapons, strategic weapons, spheres of economic and political influence. The other is the organization of peace through international cooperation."

In the hope that the United States may do its part in making mankind's choice the second choice, the report recommends a specific policy for this nation to adopt.

It recommends that the representatives of the United States in the UNO should immediately seek agreement on a comprehensive plan for the progressive reduction of military armaments.

It charges that in the initial use and continued production of atomic bombs, the United States has given, and is giving, sanction to these weapons of mass annihilation. We believe this policy must be continued.

Noting that the American delegation to the UNO meeting in London urged colonial powers to make definite guarantees to the aspirations for freedom of colonial peoples, the Council report recommends:

"In order that the United States may conform its own conduct to what it has urged upon others, we call upon our Government to commit itself at an early date to apply the principles of trusteeship to such areas as may be detached from Japan, including the areas heretofore held by Japan under League of Nations mandate."

Facing the special, but all important issue of our relations with Russia, the Council report makes the following statement:

"The problem of world order is complicated by the fact that nations differ in their religious, social, economic and political patterns. This is particularly true in the case of the Soviet Union and the Western democracies. We cannot ignore the tensions which arise from these differences. 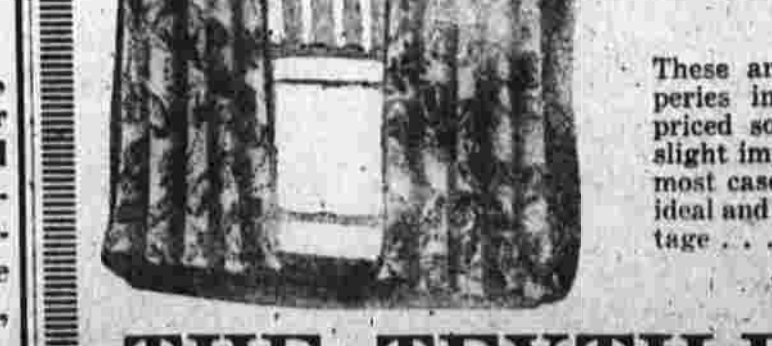

No Major Railroad Strike Since 1926

Labor Act Passed in That Year Probably Will Forestall Any Walkout Next Monday

By James Marlow Washington, March 8.—(Special)—One of the bloodiest chapters in American labor history was that of the railroads and their workers. But there has been no major railroad strike since 1926. Why?

Now the White House has announced the president will appoint a fact-finding board. As explained, this will delay the strike 60 days. Also, as explained, neither the companies nor the unions have to accept the fact-finder's report. The union still can strike at the end of 60 days. But it isn't likely to do so.

President Truman has sought to have Congress pass a law setting up fact-finding boards in other lines of industrial labor disputes — with a prohibition on strikes while the fact-finders worked — but Congress has kicked his plan around. Labor generally — outside the railroad unions — is opposed to the idea.

Suppose a union refuses to submit its case to an arbitration board. What then? It decides to strike. In that case, the mediation board decides whether the strike will interfere with interstate commerce. If the mediation board so decides, it notifies the president. Then appoints a fact-finding board to inquire into the dispute and report to him.

Have to Report Within 30 Days The fact-finders have to report to the president within 30 days. During that time there can be no strike. For Congress has a strike for 30 days after the board reports. Thus a strike is banned for 60 days.

Dispute Started Last Summer The present dispute started last summer. The non-operating unions — such as clerks and maintenance men — asked for a wage increase of 30 cents an hour and changes in their working conditions.

The operating unions — such as engineers and firemen and conductors — asked for \$2.50 a day more and changes in their working conditions. The unions served upon the
