

### To Ask Funds For Program Board To Seek Support To Improve Angling And Hunting

Hartford, March 19.—A spokesman said last night that representatives of the State Board of Fisheries and Game will appear before the Legislative council here Wednesday to ask council recommendation that the General Assembly consider a five-year program costing approximately \$1,000,000 for the improvement of hunting and angling conditions in the state.

The proposal was originally made in November, 1944, as part of a state "make-work" program to provide employment for returning veterans and displaced war workers.

In explaining the program, Dr. Russell P. Hunter, state superintendent of fisheries and game, said it is planned as a means of meeting the needs of an "expected" tremendous increase in the number of licensed sportsmen.

Generally, the program would provide for upwards of 100 miles more of trout streams, provision of about 100 miles of trout stocked each year, improvements on about 100 miles of state owned or state regulated trout streams, research, state-owned fishing piers at the Rocky Neck, Hammonasset and Sherwood Island state parks, additional hunting areas and many other improvements.

Latin American Countries Sitting on Fence; All 'Trouble' Started Back in 1944 by Hull

By Norman Carigan Washington, March 10.—The United States doesn't want to see any Nazi-Fascist regime come to full bloom in Argentina.

That's what all the fussing is about now concerning Argentina, and the comparative treatment of enlisted and officer personnel in such matters as housing, clothing, living arrangements and recreational provisions.

The trouble all started back in 1944 when the State department under Cordell Hull cracked down on Argentina.

And the Argentine government was a "traitor to the Allied cause" and had given "positive aid and comfort to the enemies of the United States."

After under Secretary of State Edward R. Stettinius, Jr., and Assistant Secretary Nelson Rockefeller, Hull's policy was toned down.

As a result of action taken at the Mexico City conference last year, Argentina was brought back into the fold and later into the United Nations.

Tough Policy Reapplied. But when James F. Byrnes took over the State department in June, 1945, the tough policy toward Argentina was soon reapplied.

Confronted with all this sort of hiding places in Germany, the State department decided the United States couldn't sign a military alliance with Argentina and still maintain its self-respect.

Consultations Opened. So it asked for a postponement of the Rio conference and opened consultations with the other American republics.

At about this time, Col. Juan Peron resigned as vice president and labor minister of the Argentine government and started campaigning for the presidency.

Peron actually was the "power behind the throne" in Argentina. He's the man this country has its eye on.

Only one month, the State department distributed to the Latin America the information it had on Argentina in the form of a document called the "Blue Book."

Peron and others had "partially" succeeded in setting up a totalitarian regime in Argentina; that with official backing, the Nazis were had had the same kind of economic war machine they once had in Germany.

In effect, the United States ball until the Argentine people give us a government we can confidently deal with.
