Fire Destroys Hartland Shop

Lumber and Closets Lost; Home Threatened by Blaze
Hartland, March 22.—A fire which started in a furnace used for drying out new clothespins destroyed the woodworking shop of First Selectman Nathaniel Emmons in East Hartland Thursday night, consuming 13,000 feet of lumber awaiting processing and about \$1,000 worth of finished

pins. Emmons estimated his loss at \$10,000.
Threatened by the blaze was the Emmons home which houses the village post office. Mail and post office records were saved from the home by neighbors as others formed a bucket brigade and poured water on the roof of the shop. The Lost Acres Volunteer Fire department from nearby Granby was summoned and arrived after a 10-mile run to prevent spread of the fire.
Second Serious Fire in Week
Presmen from Simsbury, Taftville and the Connecticut Forestry department forest fire station also assisted in controlling the fire, the second serious one of the week in this rural region of Connecticut. On Monday three tobacco sheds of the American Sumatra Tobacco company in Granby were destroyed with a loss of \$20,000 and the Lost Acres company made a run of eight miles.
Firemen were forced to lay 3,000 feet of hose to combat last night's blaze using two dry engines as pumping stations to force the water more than half a mile.

All Stimson Diary Asked

Brewster Demands Full Document After Excerpts Are Disclosed
Washington, March 22.—The peak of the Pearl Harbor committee got at former Secretary of War Stimson's diary brought a demand from Senator Brewster (R-Maine) today for the full document.
Brewster told reporters the diary excerpts which Stimson sent to the Senate-House Investigating committee contained "highly interesting and heretofore undisclosed" information.
"Should Have Full Diary"
"Understand they are the parts he considers relevant to the inquiry," the senator added. "No judicial body ever allowed a witness to determine what was relevant and what was not. We should have the full diary."

Earlier on Nov. 7, Mr. Roosevelt pulled his cabinet and received the unanimous opinion that the American people would back the government if it stepped in to halt Japanese aggression against British or Dutch possessions.

Both Brewster and Senator Ferguson (R-Mich.), also a committee member, said they did not consider the documents supplied by Stimson as closing the evidence from him.

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3,000 Vets Attend State High Schools

Nearly 3,000 veterans of World War II now are attending special veterans' high schools throughout Connecticut, according to Francis J. Bassett, consultant on veterans' affairs for the State Department of Education.
Some 800 of these, he said, are attending day high schools in Hartford, Greenwich, Waterbury and New Haven. More than 2,000 other veterans are attending evening schools.
Mr. Bassett reported that plans were being made for 16 veterans' summer schools. Meriden and Hartford already are preparing for schools of six-weeks duration during July and August.
Growth will be increasingly rapid in regional high schools for veterans, Mr. Bassett predicted.
"With the continued separation from the armed forces," he said, "the demand will continue to grow, and as has been indicated already, this is a need that Connecticut is determined to meet."

New Haven, March 22.—The Yale student body has been asked by members of the Yale chapter, the American Veterans association, to vote on a proposal to go without deserts so that the money thus saved may be given to UNRRA.
The student body voted 2-1 in favor of the proposal. The resolution was adopted by the chapter.

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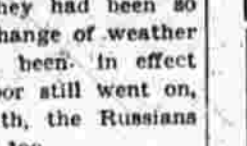
