Caution on Loophole For Veto Advocated On Atomic Proposal

All Atomic Energy From Two Metals Not Even Slight Prospect of Extension; Limit Will Prevent Any Surprise Attacks

St. Louis, March 29.—(AP)—The big fact on which scientists rely to prevent atomic attacks—namely, that all atomic energy is limited strictly to two natural metals, without even a slight prospect of extension—came out here today at the meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Both Secrecy and Controllability The metals are uranium and thorium, both scarce and controllable at mines and in powerhouses so that scientists believe no nation will be able to prepare an atomic bomb without automatically giving the world advance warning of 18 months to several years.

Appropriations Task Without Excitement

One of the most important jobs of government is going on now without much excitement. Congress is deciding how much the appropriations will be for the government departments.

That is, it is deciding how much money each government department and agency will be allowed to spend in the fiscal year of 1947. The government's fiscal year begins July 1 of one year and ends June 30 the next year.

Probably few Americans ever try very carefully to follow the long-drawn out rigmarole on appropriations because they are so full of figures.

It happens every year that way. But what the department do, or are permitted to do, depends upon how much money Congress allows them. It goes like this:

Every autumn the department estimate how much money they'll need the next fiscal year. The House and the Senate then divide up into small sub-committees and begin examining the estimates for the various departments, one at a time.

Thus one subcommittee may check on the War department, another on the Navy, another on the Interior department.

The department heads are then called before the subcommittee to explain why they want this or that.

Usually the subcommittee decides a department can get along with less money than the Budget bureau thought was necessary. Having made up its mind on how

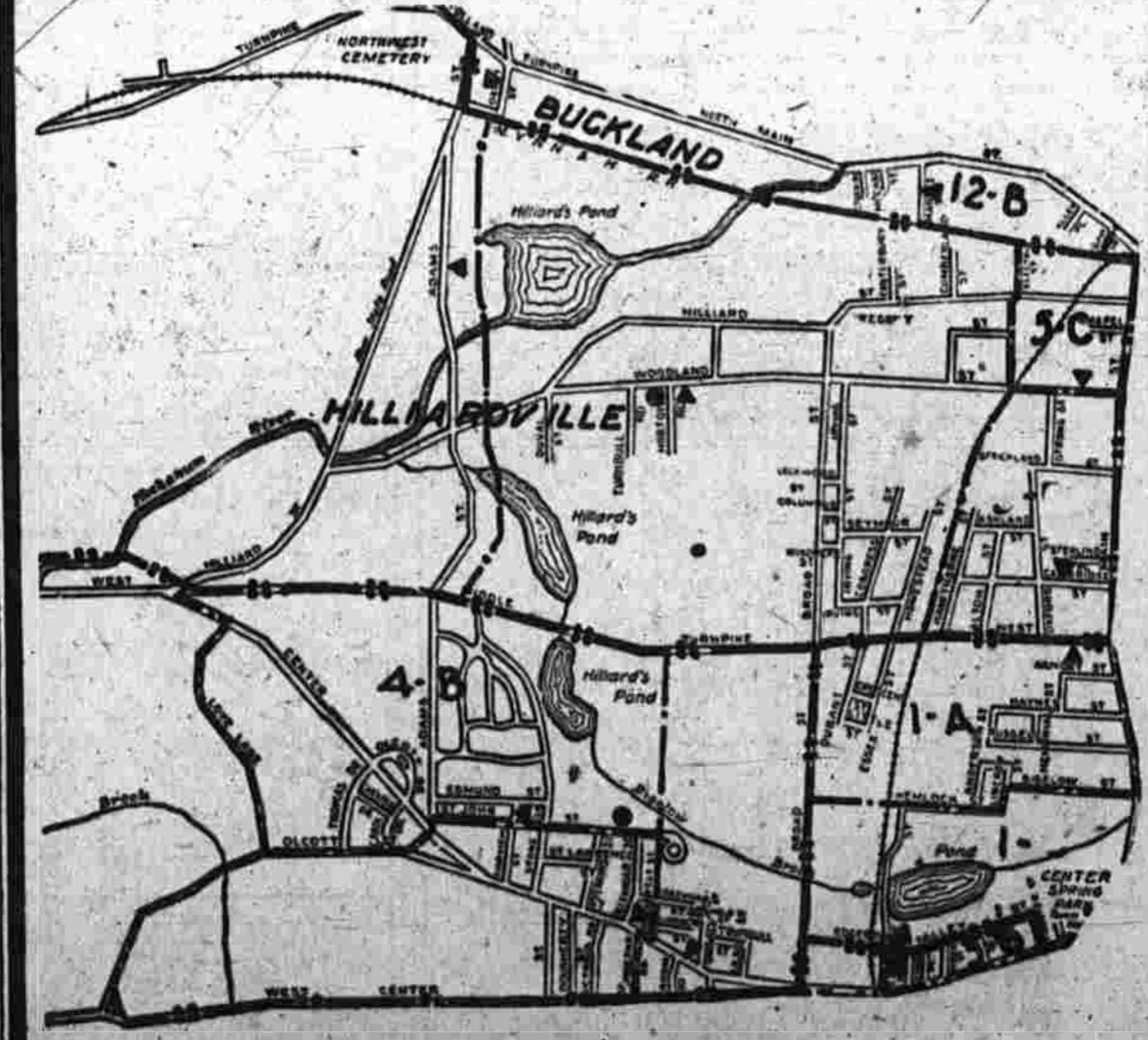
