E. Hathaway, as executor. Sister's Estate The will was drawn Sept. 1924, or shortly after the death of his sister, Miss Netta McCaw, who in her will, left her entire estate to William L. P. McCaw, amounting at that time to about \$70,000, mostly in bank deposits. Mr. McCaw, as a young man, worked in W. H. Cheney's store at the corner of Main and Charter Oak streets, as did his brother Daniel McCaw. About 1895, both left Manchester and took up residence at Livingston, Montana, where Daniel McCaw remained until his death. 
