Zero Hour Comes Today for Showdown On Government Operation of Railroads

Assembly Passes All of Emergency Measures Slated

Several Matters Not on Agenda Also Acted On Before Adjournment Early Today; Legislators Thanked by Baldwin for Work

State Capitol, May 18.—(P)—The special session of the General Assembly, the second in two successive off years, was at an end today as legislators passed all of the emergency measures written into statutes and several matters not on the agenda acted upon.

Adopt Compromise Bill The assembly adjourned at 1:11 (e.d.t.) this morning. A bill which appropriated \$3,400,000 to increase the pay of approximately 14,000 state employees was worked out by a committee of conference after the Senate and House had been unable to agree.
