As to the Supreme court Under Virginia law Negroes riing in buses-whethey they cross the state line or operate entirely within the state-must ride b hind white passengers.

Refused to Move to Back

A Negro woman, riding an terstate bus in Virginia, was told by the driver to move to the back to make room for white passengers. She refused, was arrested, convicted, and finally appealed to the Supreme court. The court quoted that part of the nstitution which says Congress has power to regulate commerce

among states. This is the famous clause giving the Federal government power to regulate interstate commerce but leaving states free to regulate commerce conducted entirely within states. Going on from there, the court said the Federal government, not a state government, is the auhority for preventing "burdens on interstate commerce."
Entitled to Profection

Then the court reasoned that the Negro woman was entitled to pro-tection from a burden on interstate commerce. And it said that being forced to changed her seat was a burden since she or any other Negro could be forced under Virginia law to change seats So the court limited itself to interatate commerce.
