





Plan Vastly Complicated Because the plan is vastly com olicated and has to be worked out detail; step by step. Here's the plan: The United Nations would agree. binding themselves by treaties, to outlaw the atomic bomb as a wea-

They'd agree to set up a board. alled the Atomic Development authority, with more power than any international board ever had. It would check the whole world or deposits of raw materials which ould be used for making atomic explosives. It would control them. Wherever they were found, the nation owning them would have to turn over control to the authority. Then the authority would say

This would make it tough for any nation which, violating its agreement, wanted to sneak off he materials to make bombs se-Could License and Inspect Plants

The authority could issue censes to plants which wanted to use atomic energy for peaceful purposes, and could inspect them. When the authority had gone through the necessary preliminary work, and the necessary agreements had been made, this country would turn over its atomic

ecrets to the authority. It is willing to do more: When that time comes it is willing to destroy its supply of atomic bombs. But Baruch didn't say our atomic bombs would have to be destroyed. He said they could be 'disposed of" according to the terms of the agreements. So if the authority wanted to nation which broke the treaties,

What does this mean? It means the authority would stay abreast of atomic science developments. By keeping up to date on how plosives could be made, it would know when any country was trying sneakily to make one in a new perhaps innocent-looking, And if any nation had made a

supply of bombs secretly the authority, because of its own research, could turn out bombs fast to use against the treaty-breaker. mplication Certainly Plain (This was not stated in the American plan, but the implication certainly is plain.) How could a nation break its greement? By illegally possessing bomb, having in its possession naterial which could be used in a bomb, seizing any plant or other property owned or licensed by the authority, or wilfully interfering with the authority's work.

For example: If some nation, in whose territory the authority had

an explosive-research plant, seiz-

ed that plant, it could be regarded by the other nations as an attempt make bombs and therefore at act of war.
This outline of the American plan is given here with a reminder: It may seem all right to us. Other nations may pick holes in it or, because they distrust us or refuse to play ball with the United Nations, turn it down.
