Says Potsdam China's Greatest Need Is Faith of America

Dr. McConaughy in Address Here Says Virtues Must Be Recognized as Well as Faults

Not least among China's had breaks has been the tendency of America, potentially the nation China would like to have as its best friend, first to over-estimate China's virtues and then to suffer disillusionment, because all Chinese do not prove to be perfect.

Dr. James L. McConaughy, head of
United China Relief, told the Manchester Rotary Club at the Sheridan Restaurant last night. Members of the Kiwanis and Exchange clubs were special guests for the occasion.
Dr. McConaughy, who before his

present position was lieutenant Dr. James L. McConaughy governor of Connecticut and president of Wesleyan University, and who now resides in Cornwall, urged his hearers to make a fair and realistic appraisal of China.

It would be easy to find a heavy score for China in the errors column, he said, but China's hits and runs should also be considered.
