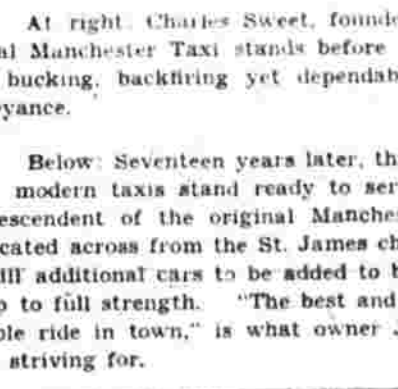

Since that time, 17 years ago, the town's taxi business has been expanding throughout the years in order to accommodate the town's increasing population.

As a business venture, the taxi business in town was at first an uncertain one, to say the least. After the death of Mr. Sweet, various local business men bought up the Manchester Taxi, only to drop it quickly, chalking it up as a poor investment.

Joe Ortelli Takes Over In February, 1946, the Manchester Taxi acquired a new owner, Joseph Ortelli, who bought it up, lock, stock, and barrel. He worked hard and diligently at the game believing wholeheartedly that there was a spot in Manchester for a taxi service. The Manchester Taxi and City Cab was established as one enterprise and located on Purnell Place. Gradually Mr. Ortelli got Manchester cab-contractors and just as it became apparent that he was firmly established, he was recalled into the U. S. Marine Corps in 1941, turning the business over to his sister, Ida Ortelli.
