Hope to Start Bonus Action

Growing Group of Legislators Pressing for Special Session
Hartford, July 11.—(P)—Advocates of a state bonus for World War II veterans were represented today as hopeful that Governor Balow would call a special session of the General Assembly to enact state rent control legislation, a session at which they could attempt to put forward their proposal.
The governor said on July 3 that he would call a special session if Congress did not take Federal rent control action in 1946. Since Rep. Thomas Supina, Hartford Democrat, began circulating petitions urging bonus legislation, a growing group of General Assembly members has been pressing the governor to call a special session to consider a constitutional amendment permitting payment of a bonus.
The governor has said, however, that he did not consider the situation constituted an emergency, and that he was empowered to special sessions only to deal with emergencies.
Advocates of the action started a bonus advocates are said to be anxious to get action on a constitutional amendment this year. Amendments must receive preliminary approval in the House, approval at a subsequent session by both the House and Senate, and finally approval by the electorate at a referendum.
Bonus proponents widely have the House approval an amendment at a special session this year, put the issue before the House and Senate in the regular session next year, immediately call a special session at which the voters could register their approval or disapproval and if the amendment were adopted, introduce bonus legislation before the 1947 Assembly session ends.
In the regular course of events, without special sessions or a special election, it would be impossible to amend the constitution and bring a bonus bill up for consideration earlier than the 1951 legislative session.
No Discussion of Strategy
Although the bonus advocates have been pressing the governor hoping for a special session, there has been no discussion of what they would employ to force consideration of a constitutional amendment should the governor, in calling a special session, limit the agenda to the question of rent control only.
At the special session held in May this year, Democratic attempts to force consideration of matters not on the agenda were ruled out of order by the speaker of the House with the Republican majority in that chamber upholding the ruling.

Arrested Six Minutes After Alarm Sent Out

Walter Thompson, of Hamlock, street, parolee of the State Prison, was arrested within six minutes yesterday afternoon after an alarm was sent out from the State Prison office through the State Police warning system, that the Manchester youth was wanted as a parole violator.
State Policeman Edward J. Dooley, on duty in the vicinity of the village of Scantic, East Windsor, hastened to the alarm and almost as soon as he heard the warning he noticed a man behind a Scantic church. He stopped his car and went behind the church and arrested Thompson at 3:34 p. m.
The alarm had been broadcast at 3:28 p. m.
Prison officials said that Thompson had been serving a term in the State Prison for breaking and entering and automobile theft and had been released for good behavior and had apparently been cooperating with the parole department, which had been assisting him to get established in Manchester. Then the prison officials learned that Thompson had intended to leave the state for California and he was on his way out of the state when he was arrested yesterday.

Work Started On New Road

Owner Excavates On His Land to Secure Humus Deposit
Operations have been started by the state to construct the new Wilbur-Cross Highway through the land on McNeil street, owned and operated as a humus deposit by Gustave J. Schaller of 252 Woodland street. The land from which Mr. Schaller has been extracting humus was known to residents of Manchester as Bogy Stew. The swamp was drained some years ago and the land was purchased by Schaller about three years ago. Last year he started to dig out the soil on the land to be used as humus, which is especially good for tobacco top beds.
Previous to the opening of this business local tobacco farmers had to go to New Jersey to get humus of the quality which is provided by the Schaller beds.
When the Wilbur-Cross Highway was planned, it was routed directly through the center of the humus deposits. Mr. Schaller arranged with the state to excavate the deposits which would be under the road and throw them up in either side of the route. The deposits are at the deepest only twelve feet and the state readily agreed to do so in constructing a solid foundation for the highway.
At present several hundred loads of the soil have been excavated and are piled up to one side drying out.

Courts on Employers' Side for 100 Years

Only in Recent Years Government Has Begun to Aid Unions Under New Laws
(Editor's Note: This is the fourth of six stories explaining the government's attitude toward unions and how, after a year of strikes, it emerges almost unscathed by restrictive legislation.)

Washington, July 11.—(P)—For more than 100 years organized labor has fought the courts on its side.
The government's relation to labor has gone through three main phases: crushing unions, tolerating unions, helping unions.
There are, and there were, almost no Federal laws restricting union activities but judges for years took the place of Congress in making decisions that put a halter on unions, year after year.
Early court decisions in this country were based on the English law theory that when workers combined to raise wages it was a conspiracy to hurt trade and, therefore, the public interest.
Frustrated by this theory, Congress started around 1905, a number of unions which demanded wage increases were brought to court by employers and found guilty of conspiracy.
It wasn't until 1942—and then only by a court decision, not by statute—that the right of a union to exist at all was established.
Employers, of course, were free to refuse to bargain with a union or to try to prevent their workers from forming one.
Despite the 1942 decision, unions continued to be harassed by courts until the 1930s. After that date injunctions began to take the place of conspiracy charges.
An injunction is an order issued by a court forbidding someone to do something. In this case it would forbid a union to strike or picket a plant.
Viewed as Property Right
Viewed as a property right in labor disputes came through the courts view that the right to do business is a property right. When means a union is interfering with the business of a company where there is a labor dispute. Pickets are union members placed around such a business place for these purposes:
To persuade the public or other union members not to do business with the company or to prevent non-union workers from taking the jobs of striking union workers.
In 1890 Congress passed the Sherman anti-trust act to curb business monopolies and prevent their interfering with trade. Corporations had begun to be big and fat and often ugly by then.
Although this act was aimed at corporations, Federal judges began to use it against unions, through injunctions. The grounds that some union activities, like the boycott, interfered with trade.
Organized labor fought to wipe out this interpretation by the courts and in 1914 Congress passed the Clayton act to amend the Sherman act and protect unions from it.
But the Supreme court ruled that the Clayton act did not exempt labor from the anti-trust provisions of the Sherman act. So injunctions against unions continued to be issued by Federal courts.
Finally, in 1932, Congress passed the Norris-LaGuardia act which put a limit on the use of Federal courts to make of injunctions in labor disputes. Thereafter the injunction ceased to be the powerful anti-union weapon it had been for 40 years.
In 1933 Congress decided to give unions a strong helping hand. This was the start of President Roosevelt's administration which was trying to get the nation out of the depression.
Congress passed the National Industrial Recovery act giving unions the right to bargain for workers and forbidding employers to interfere with efforts to organize workers.
Wagner Act Passed in 1935
This law was knocked out by the Supreme court but Congress in 1935 passed the National Labor Relations act—the Wagner act—which, in effect, said:
Workers have the right to form unions; when a majority of the workers in a plant form such a union, the boss must bargain with it although he doesn't have to agree to its demands.
This same law set up a government board—the National Labor Relations board—to prevent what the board might consider to be unfair labor practices by an employer.
This story has dealt entirely with Federal legislation and court rulings. The states have laws of their own affecting union activities and they vary from state to state.
No attempt has been made here to cover the special legislation passed by Congress to cover the railroad unions which have been treated by the government as a special class of workers. There are about 500,000 of them.

Courts Upholds Death Penalty

Board of Pardons Last Hope for Trio Doomed to Die July 29
Hartford, July 11.—(P)—The State Board of Pardons represented at the last hope today for three men doomed to die July 29 in Connecticut's first triple execution.
The State Supreme court yesterday upheld the Superior Court conviction of Raymond Egan, 18, of New Britain, James J. McCarthy, 20, of Danbury and Arthur Tommaselli, 25, of New Haven of first degree murder for slaying a prison guard in an escape attempt March 5, 1944.
Death in the electric chair is the mandatory penalty for first degree murder, but Public Defender Benjamin L. Gidycz who represented all three said after the Supreme court's opinion was released that he would ask Governor Balow today to call a special session of the Board of Pardons to hear pleas for a commutation of the sentence to life imprisonment.
Does Not Denote Clemency
Lewis, originally sent to prison for killing a New Britain grocer in a robbery attempt when he was 17, on record as having said he did not desire clemency.
On the witness stand while he and his fellow inmates were on trial for the slaying of Guard Herbert O. Parsell, Lewis shouted: "I want to burn."
Parsell was fatally bludgeoned as he sought to restrain the three escape-bound men making their way through a prison work shop.
The Supreme court, in reviewing the case, said that from the evidence presented a jury reasonably could have found that the escape attempt failed because the three did not, indeed Parsell as easily as they had expected to, and because other prisoners came to his assistance.
McCarty, like Lewis, was serving a life term for second degree murder at the time of the escape attempt, having fatally knifed a Danbury grocer in a holdup attempt, and Tommaselli was serving a term for burglary and escape from the New Haven county jail.

Woman Dies After Crash

Husband and Son Injured in Dead Man's Hill Accident
Wallingford, July 11.—(P)—Traffic on Dead Man's Hill on the heavily traveled New Haven-Hartford highway claimed another victim late last night when Mrs. Catherine VonAu, 40, of Meriden was killed and her husband and son injured.
State police said the car driver was VonAu, 44, rammed into a bank, having veered across the highway after striking the back of a slowly moving truck. The accident occurred about 11:30 p. m.
Welder Severely Burned
Danbury, July 11.—(P)—Ben Miller, about 35, a welder, was severely burned on the head and arms yesterday, and the interior of an automobile repair shop was damaged when a gas tank exploded.
Miller was set fire to the gasoline tank of a bus, causing an explosion.

Driver Arrested On Local Charge

James Forto, 54, of 60 Barbour street, Hartford, was arrested yesterday in Hartford on a warrant issued here by Prosecutor Raymond A. Johnson, charging him with evading responsibility in connection with an accident which occurred on South Main street, in the vicinity of the Manchester Country Club, on Saturday, June 29.
Forte allegedly left the scene of an accident on South Main street after a collision with another car. Forte posted bond of \$100 for his appearance in Town Court tomorrow morning.
Former Pupils Buys School
Clyde, N. Y.—(P)—Louis Conkles has gone back to school. Conkles purchased a three-story brick schoolhouse, which he once attended, for use as a laundry and dry cleaning establishment. The building was abandoned as a school in 1940.

Late President's Daughter To Direct Radio Program

(Eastern Standard—Add One Hour for Daylight).
New York, July 11.—Eleanor Wilson McCauley, daughter of the late President Wilson, is joining CBS as a regular broadcaster. Beginning next Monday afternoon she becomes chairman of the women's club program, Monday through-Friday, series designed as a radio adaptation of the lecture platform.
She takes over from Isabel Leighton, who has been conducting the program since its introduction on May 15. In that time it has presented a number of lectures on discussions of cultural and intellectual subjects dealing with women's interests in world affairs.
Mrs. McCauley goes into the program with a background as a lecturer and an author. At the time of the first United Nations meeting in San Francisco she was heard in a number of commentary broadcasts.

New London Firm Buys Ohio Plant

Balcock Printing Press Corporation of New London, Conn., has purchased a factory in Canton, Ohio, where it plans to employ between 800 and 1,200 persons manufacturing printing presses and equipment for producing folding cartons.

In the Minnesota primary, as in the Nebraska primary, the vote was split, but the result was apparent—the isolationism was apparent—the isolationism of indifference to the international issue the rest of the nation considered to be involved. Stassen backed the party organization which was supporting the isolationist Senator Butler, in Minnesota, his home state, he had the party organization in back of his own internationalist cause and candidates. And, although the vote may actually have been for certain personal candidates, the result is a public service rather than directly for one side or another of international issues, it can at least be said that a good result was fortunate in having good men.

Because the internationalist cause had such good men in Minnesota, it is now able to register in the election in the nation as a whole, and the crude reading of the Minnesota verdict is that, no, the mid-west is not yet turning back to an isolationist attitude to that after the first World War. And one of these Minnesota good men, Mr. Stassen himself, is now very much alive again as a presidential prospect. His wife had been dead if he had lost; having won, he is now in a position to continue his campaign for nomination.

That is, as has been noted before, a most unusual campaign. Not only is he practicing candidate, but he is operating by methods which most ordinary candidates would consider downright dangerous. He is in a word, campaigning for the presidency by discussing issues. More than that, in his discussion of issues he is talking the standard that the Republican party must develop positive, dynamic, appealing policies of its own. This is in direct contrast to the creed of the Republican party which believes that the way for the Republican party to win in 1948 is to wait and pray for the Democratic party to die itself.

Whether he is ever nominated or not, Mr. Stassen, like Wendell Willkie before him, has a great public service to perform. For that, he has the courage, but perhaps one asset Mr. Willkie did not have—an understanding of the political game as such. And there is enough ability to conduct his drive along organizational as well as issue lines.

If he is nominated, he will win. And we would not make any such flat prediction for any other Republican prospect now on the scene.
