# State Industries Take Well Deserved Rest

## Employment Is Now Near War Time Peak; Prepare for Capacity Production This Fall

Industry in Connecticut, which proved to be the most productive of any state in the country during the war, took a slight pause to catch its breath during the early part of the year, but is now preparing to resume full and unprecedented peacetime production for the last half of this year. With practically all major industries presently at one state strike or another, the state is expected to resume full production by the first half of July, much in the manner of a man who spits on his hands and wipes on his pants preparatory to taking a tough job. The tough job for industry in the state is production, for it is agreed by all shades of opinion that this country needs more of the goods that it produces than it can consume.

Employers used this period to give both men and machines a much needed rest, to accumulate supplies or at least to reduce their stockpiles, and to make minor changes in production.

Private non-agricultural employment increased by 13,000 workers from May 15 and 16, 1946, to July 15, 1946. The total number of workers employed in the state is now 1,100,000. The increase in employment is due to the return to work of 100,000 strikers. Employment since the middle of June is uncertain due to the large number of vacation leave-offs. Preliminary reports indicate a small increase in July, but many employers have forecasted hiring new workers until after the vacation period.

The strike picture was much improved in June with only the Niles, Bennett, Ford strike continuing from May. Strikers at the American Bryant Electric and the O. Canfield Company returned to work during the last half of May. The only significant strike occurring since mid-June was the one at Hamilton Standard Propeller.

With conversion to peacetime production about complete and with the supply of raw materials more plentiful, there is little that can stop production from exceeding that of the first half of this year and, in many lines, exceeding peacetime levels.

July Employment Equals That of Prior To End of War

Manufacturing employment in Connecticut, which dropped about 60,000 workers at the end of the war, has now increased back to about its pre-war level. Most of the former war production industries are back to levels of employment prevailing during the war, except for the aircraft and shipbuilding industries which employ now only about half of the 50,000 employed a year ago. The drop in this industry has been largely offset by increased employment in consumer goods industries, principally textiles and apparel. The number of women employed in the state is now 400,000.
