Shooting Laid To Jealousy

Husband Kills Waitress Wife and Wounds Five in Crowded Store

Memphis, Tenn., July 31—(AP)—Police Inspector Larry Fox said jealousy apparently touched off the wild shooting at a crowded downtown department store (Loverstein's) yesterday when a shot-gun-wielding husband killed his waitress wife and wounded five bystanders before he was felled by blasts from a police officer's pistol.

Fox said the man was Robert Horner, a 49-year-old barber, and the dead woman was Gertrude (Jerry) Horner, 32.

He said the two had been separated and that Horner was seeking a reconciliation. Horner left a note, the officer said, indicating he planned to kill his wife and then himself.

Fox said a part of the note read: "Please bury me together, regardless of what the old folks say."

Horner, with three bullets wounds in his chest, was near death early this morning.

Fox gave this version of the multiple shooting:

Horner pushed his way through lunch hour throngs to the store's crowded basement lunch counter where his wife was a waitress.

With his automatic shotgun he fired a blast at his wife and she fell mortally wounded, while her two-year-old daughter was killed.

Traffic Officer C. R. Love was summoned by spectators who rushed into the street.

As Love ordered Horner to drop the gun, Horner turned and fired another shot into the crowd. Five persons were wounded, one seriously.

Love then dropped Horner with three bullets in the chest. Horner had turned the gun on the officer when the latter fired.

Storm Water Stirs Trouble

Storm waters are again causing troubles in town.

Last night the Selectmen received a notice from a resident of Lenox street who lives at number 245, complaining about the overflow from Bigelow brook. Another letter received from Attorney James Rubbinow who is representing Samuel Rankin of 108 North Elm street, says that Rankin's property is being run over by storm water which is being carried in several places, and he claims that it is due to the town using the culvert to dispose of more service water than it was originally built for.

In a Live Brook Several of the Selectmen appear to be familiar with this condition and claim that it is a live brook and not a storm water condition. The letter from Mr. Rubbinow was turned over to Judge Hyde so that he may defend the town in any action started against them.

The Board also discovered last night in checking the proposed layout of the Village Homes tract which lays between North Main street and Tollard Turnpike, the presence of another live brook, and has voted to call attention to this to the town planning commission so that they might act before approving the final layout of this tract and take some action to have it properly enclosed.

Court Makes Annual Report

Over 900 Parking Violations Disposed of During the Fiscal Year

A total of 901 parking violations were disposed of during the past year and 899 cases on the criminal side of the Manchester Town Court were tried during the year, according to the annual report of the Clerk of the Court, Aldo Pagan, filed today.

During the period from July 1, 1947 to June 30, 1948, a total of 282 civil cases were heard of 442 cases pending at the beginning of the period and 110 returned during that time. Cases on the civil side pending as of June 30, 1948 were 170.

Total receipts for the court for the past fiscal year were \$8,137.10 which amount \$1,006.86 was remitted to the State Motor Vehicle department and \$9,530.24 to the town.

Defeated Solons Can Get Pension Benefits

Almost All Who Lose This Year Will Be Eligible for New Congressional Pension

Washington, July 31—(AP)—Almost all the senators and representatives defeated for re-election this year can get a congressional pension.

Two-and-one-half per cent for any year from August 1, 1950 to June 30, 1952; then 3 1/2 per cent from July 1, 1952 to June 30, 1954; and 5 per cent from July 1, 1954 until President Truman signs this system into law, which may be this year. After it becomes law members of Congress will have to pay 2 per cent on their yearly salary into the pension fund; if they want a pension — or at least for five years of the years served after this all becomes law.

Part of Bill Just Passed The pension system is part of a bill which Congress has just passed, a bill to reorganize Congress. President Truman will soon sign it into law.

But a member wants a pension, he must do these two things:

1. He must say he wants a pension. He just doesn't get it automatically even though he's served 10 years and is 65 years old.
2. He must contribute to the pension fund a percentage of his yearly salary of \$10,000 for at least five years of his congressional service.

The smallest payment a congressman can make to the pension fund for those five years of service is \$2,716.

How Pension Plan Works Here's an example of how it works:

Senator Jones, elected to a 6-year term in 1946, was defeated for re-election this year. He served six years.

He leaves Congress when his term ends next Jan. 3. He goes into private business, never goes back to Congress.

But he's only 50 years old and he wants a pension for those six years he served.

To be eligible that \$2,716 for five of his six years in Congress and waits till he's 62.

Suppose a member of Congress had served more than six years and leaves Congress he could do one of two things:

1. He could pay into the pension fund \$2,716—the necessary percentage of his \$10,000 salary for the past five years.

When he finishes out his term next January 3—provided he's not elected in the final election—and retired to private life, he can start drawing a pension. It would be \$4,909 a year.

But suppose Wheeler wanted to pay into the fund a percentage of his salary for the 20 years he served. He'd have to pay \$18,456. Then his pension would be \$8,833.

But for Shipstead's Higher Senator Shipstead, Minnesota Republican who has been defeated in the primary election in his state, he's 64 years old and has served 24 years in Congress. He could do the same as Wheeler but his pension, because he's one

Feed Shortage End Now Seen

Poultrymen Told Crop Prospects Indicate Good 1946 Harvest

Storia, July 31—(AP)—Daniel Polky of Norwich, president of the Connecticut Grain Dealers association, says that thanks to favorable weather the end of what he described as the most extreme feed shortage in history is in sight.

Polky addressed 100 Connecticut poultrymen yesterday at the opening season of Farms and Home week at the University of Connecticut, asserting that feed crop prospects indicated a bountiful 1946 harvest.

He added, however, that poultrymen probably could not expect low feed prices for another two years, although he said that the price trend should be downward from now on.

Some Effects Felt For Years He predicted that the effects of the feed shortage which forced many poultrymen to reduce the size of their flocks, would be felt for many years.

About 600 farmers and home-makers attended yesterday's session of Farms and Home week, returning to a three-day program for the first time since before the war. Dairy and livestock men and their families were scheduled to hold sessions today.

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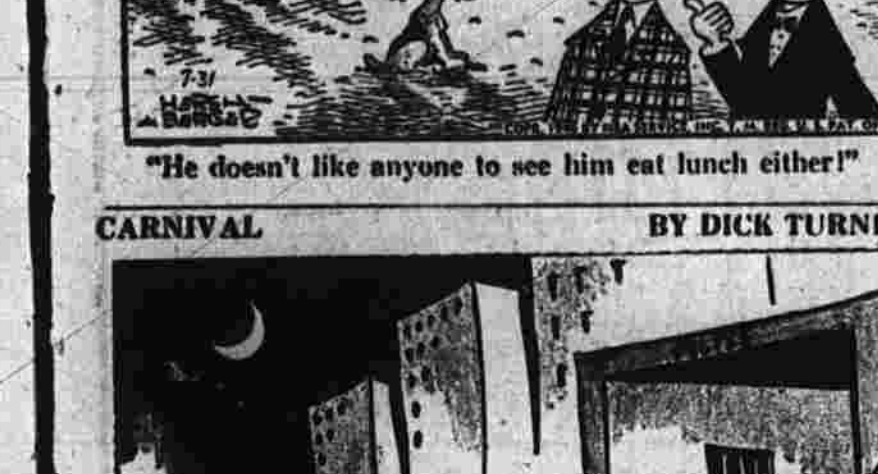
