300 Accidents Are Predicted
Labor Day Week-End Likely to Produce 5 Traffic Fatalities
Hartford, Aug. 28 — Approximately 300 traffic accidents are anticipated over the coming Labor Day week-end, from Friday to Monday, inclusive, according to an estimate made by William M. O'Connell, Director of the Highway Safety Commission. As a result of this expected experience, about 275 will be injured and, in all probability, five persons will be killed.
The prediction is based on accident experience for the current year recorded through this date, consistently through this year, accidents have held a 40 per cent. increase over 1945 and personal injuries about the same. All interested state agencies are marshalling facilities to ensure maximum accident-free traffic movement over the holiday period when so many vacationists will be returning home to Connecticut and through Connecticut to homes in other states.
The State Police will employ the same extensive program for the Labor Day period as applied over the July Fourth when, according to a statement from the office of the Highway Safety Commission, such excellent results obtained.

Main St. Fire Draws Crowds
A fire in the United States Cleaners store at 826 Main street called out the three east side companies of the South Manchester Fire department at 11:21. When an alarm was turned in from Box 43 at Main and Baswell streets, Company No. 4 was the first to arrive and as the store had been closed at noon time it was necessary to break the glass in the front door to carry the chemical line into the store. A dense smoke cut off view and Chief Foy directed No. 3 Company to the rear of the building to fight the fire with the chemical line through the rear door. The fire being in the heart of the business section, a large crowd gathered. Police directed traffic.
The fire was discovered by a woman who was sitting in an automobile parked in front of the store, who noticed not only smoke but flames in the building. She notified Officer Raymond Griffin, who was nearby, and at the same time Howard Turkington, seeing the fire, turned in the alarm.
The smoke for a time made it difficult for the firemen to locate the fire, which was later found to have started in a drain located in the rear of the partition that divides the store.
Chief Foy said that it appeared as though the fire had been started by a cigarette and as the drain started burning it set fire to papers under the counter and also spread to a pile of clothes that had been left there to be cleaned. He was told by one of the women clerks in the store that following the usual custom they had closed the store at 12 o'clock and the maddest clothing which had been cleaned and on the rack ready for delivery, and also to the clothes that had been left there for cleaning.
The two chemical lines which had been turned in from both ends of the store were responsible for most of the damage which was done to clothing which had been cleaned and on the rack ready for delivery, and also to the clothes that had been left there for cleaning.
The dry cleaners store is located in what is known as the Montgomery Ward Annex and is located just north of the Garden Street entrance. The fire came when there were many people in the restaurant, and had been a few diners, except a few of whom went out to see the fire and then went back to finish their dinners.
