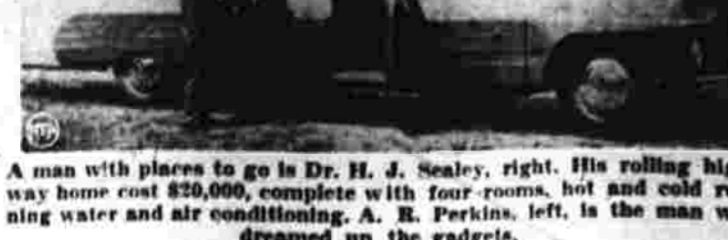

### The Doctor Says:

Acne Results From Clogged Pores

Acne, the common skin disorder of the adolescent and young adult, results almost through the thick oily substance by the sebaceous glands. Pores become clogged and secondary infection results.

Acne is not a disease of the blood nor does it directly result from faulty diet. Acne most often develops at puberty and because of this disturbance in the endocrine glands has been suggested. Treatment with endocrine gland products has not been successful.

Skin treatment in acne is directed toward dissolving and re-cleaning the plugs in the glands. Contrary to popular belief, acne does not develop from dirt. Acne is the result of chemical change in the oil secretion. The black color that is bleached white by chemicals, which rubs out dirt as the cause. The acne face should be washed with hot water and a good white soap three times a day, and rough cloths or a complexion brush should be used. After the night wash, a medicine prescribed by the physician should be applied and allowed to remain overnight.

### V-2 Rockets From Warships

#### Naval Experts Considering New Type of a War Weapon

Washington, Sept. 8.—V-2 type rockets or something like those dread German weapons may provide the main batteries for the atom area battleships Kentucky and Hawaii. Naval experts discussing today the announcement that the 42,000-ton battleship Kentucky and the 27,000-ton battle cruiser Hawaii will be "guided missile" warships, said the two vessels will be used to test a whole series of such instruments of destruction. Naval strategists see a tremendous value in launching robot rocket bombardments from ships reaching the area. Fixed rocket launching sites ashore eventually can be located and bombed from the air. But the ocean-going bases can fire, change their position and fire again and then hide in the remoteness of the open ocean. Construction of the Kentucky and Hawaii was stopped some months ago when their hulls and propulsion machinery were completed. While this leaves a virtually free hand in building top-side structures to handle the rocket-battery installations, naval officers say a multitude of design problems have to be worked out. Use of conventional ramp launchers for such projectiles as the supersonic rockets which takes off under the impulse of a ram-jet engine would not impose great difficulty and a ship launch installation, one ordnance expert said. But he added, if the V-2 type weapon is used the problem becomes much more complex. That missile takes off from a virtually vertical position, with a great blast of flame.

Difficulties in aiming also may be overcome by using radar, television and other electronic devices to track and guide the missile while in flight. Although the destructive power of each salvo fired will be greatly increased—especially when atomic warheads are used—the number of missiles which can be carried by a single ship will be limited. Provisions for stowing, assembling and fueling rockets will require extensive re-organization of the interiors of the big fighting ships, the ordnance officer commented. On the other hand some of the problems arising out of the recall of conventional 16 inch guns and the sheer weight of those big batteries will be eliminated. Rockets have little recoil and their launchers weigh only a fraction of big caliber naval guns.

#### No Need to Drop Bomb Says Halsey

Buffalo, N. Y., Sept. 8.—The dropping of an atomic bomb on Hiroshima was a "mistake" in the opinion of Fleet Admiral William F. (Bull) Halsey. "The first atomic bomb was an unnecessary experiment," he said Saturday night at a news conference. "It was a mistake to ever drop it. Why reveal a weapon like that to the world when it wasn't necessary?" Halsey, who attended yesterday's All-America football conference here between Buffalo and Brooklyn, asserted that the scientists "had this toy and they wanted to try it out so they dropped it." "It killed a lot of Japs, but the Japs had put out a lot of peace feeler through Russia long before," continued Halsey. "We had put out a very rigid blockade (of Japan) before our ships got there and that, with the raids of the fifth and third fleets together with Navy planes and the Army's B-29's, had done considerable damage." Declaring that "we bombarded their coasts with our ships almost at will," he added: "The Jap Navy was put out of commission almost entirely by submarines and fleet-based air power."

#### Military Review Held in Moscow

Moscow, Sept. 8.—Prime Minister Stalin and Russian military leaders reviewed columns of Soviet tanks and self-propelled guns which paraded through Red Square in observance of "Tankmen's Day" yesterday. While Soviet planes roared overhead in an impressive display, Stalin—flanked by Marshal Ivan Konev and General N. Budyonny, members of the politburo and government leaders—stood from Lenin's tomb and watched the parade of armored strength. Members of a Czechoslovak military mission and foreign correspondents were the only foreigners invited to attend.

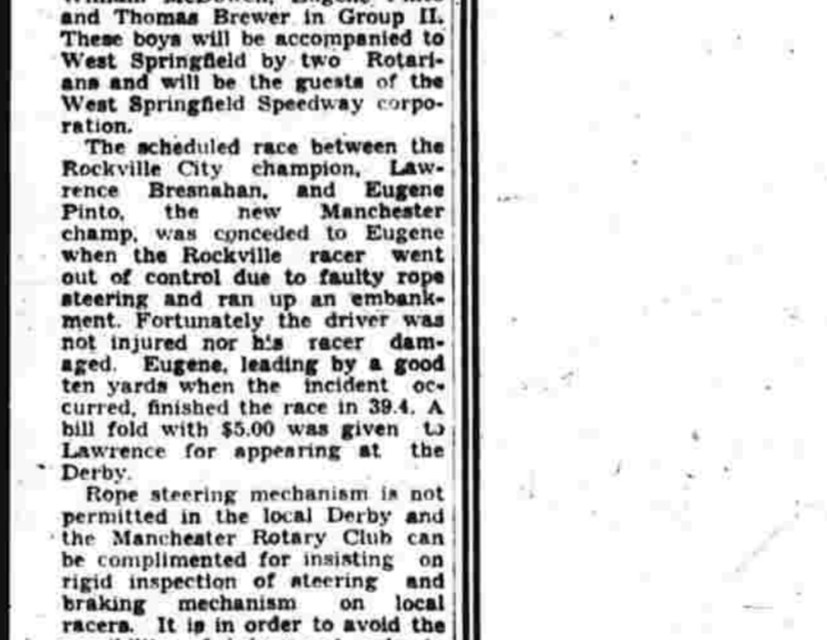
