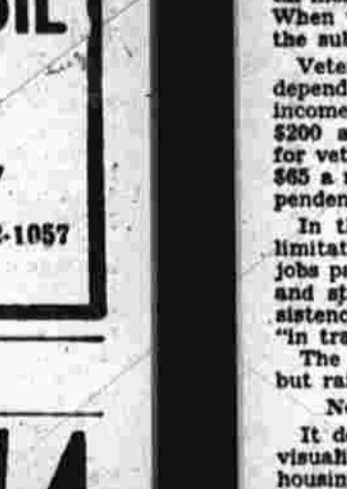

Labor Unions Condemn Klan

AF of L and CIO Urge Revenue Collector to Sue the Organization

Atlanta, Sept. 12.—Organized labor, represented by the Georgia Legislative Council, today urged U. S. Internal Revenue collector Marion Allen to get on with the business of collecting available assets of the Ku Klux Klan to satisfy a federal tax lien of \$685,000.

The council, which represents the American Federation of Labor, the Congress for Industrial Organization and independent unions, submitted a letter to Allen declaring that the "Operating Klan" and the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., against which the lien was returned, are the same.

Allen filed suit against the Klan May 29 to recover the government taxes which the income charged was due. The suit was filed in Fulton (Atlanta) Superior Court. The council asked Allen to attach to the lien a list of the Klan's assets which it listed in documentary and photographic form attached to the letter.

Has 60,000 Members—The council estimated the Klan's membership figure of 60,000 and noted that the income for the year ended June 30 was \$1,000,000. It also pointed out that "the Klan has signed a contract with a Georgia newspaper to publish material. The robes are made by members of the Klan and are sold through the grand dragon's office."

Another point the council observed "the various Klan posts have bank accounts in their own names. The council attached a list of Klan banks operating as of this date in Georgia. Five were listed in Atlanta and seven in other cities."
