 About 800,000 Japanese troops are in the Red Army Manchuria and northern Korea. Task falls to British to speed up the return of the Japanese in southeast Asia to the British Territory in that area. General MacArthur's headquarters is responsible for the shipping for repatriation. Bearing directly on the reported speed-up decision is the breakdown in negotiations between Russia and MacArthur's representatives earlier this year over the estimated 800,000 Japanese troops held by Soviet forces. Ambassador George Acheson, chief of MacArthur's diplomatic section, told several news agencies ago that he had informed Gen. Kusan Dorey, Soviet member of the Allied council, that shipping was available for re-
