ByRNES BY A K.O.

Henry Wallace has finally been
 freed out of the cabinet. This
 President Truman did in an effort
 to make it clear that he was
 not all question, to all observers,
 both at home and abroad, that
 the Wallace speech did not indi-
 cate any present change in Amer-
 ican foreign policy as it being
 conducted by Secretary of State
 ByRNES. It was clear that
 Wallace would get the point now.

As a result of this episode, Mr.
 ByRNES emerges much stronger
 than he was before. It is because
 the President has followed his
 wishes for a complete purge of
 Wallace, but because Wallace him-
 self succeeded in accomplishing
 the exact opposite of what he
 himself intended. He intended to
 create an opposition to the ByRNES
 policies. But because it was Wal-
 lace, the individual whom Amer-
 ica has come to know, and
 Wallace, the scatterbrain Amer-
 ican, who proposed this opposi-
 tion, the result was to drive the Amer-
 ican people into a new unity be-
 hind ByRNES, a unity not based
 in many cases on a full and
 intelligent appraisal of what Mr.
 ByRNES stands for, but purely on rejection
 of Mr. Wallace and his theories.

The situation now is that Mr.
 ByRNES stands for, but purely on rejection
 of Mr. Wallace's beneficial oppo-
 sition, that Mr. ByRNES and his pol-
 itics, whatever they may be, are
 stronger than ever before. If
 Mr. ByRNES is right, that is good.
 If he and his policies are wrong,
 it is a sad business. And the in-
 teresting question is that of what
 Mr. ByRNES is going to do now, is
 he going to continue to see if he
 can't do it, or is he going to
 "know that he has been
 "nowed," does America pro-
 ceed to throw its diplomatic and
 its military weight against the
 more prominently than before?
 Or does Mr. ByRNES actually pos-
 sess a policy which intends even-
 tually to bring about a new
 "seems?" Is this American policy
 of toughness a policy which we
 are capable of limiting, or is it
 one which is certain to be carried
 with us? Do we, from now on,
 just keep getting tougher and
 tougher until we get the last act
 of toughness, or is there a
 superstitious mind, would seem
 to be what the events of the past
 week have authorized Mr. ByRNES
 to do. To that our tale.

One hopes not. One hopes that
 Mr. ByRNES, even though he has
 now been supported in his policy
 of toughness, will remember that
 such toughness can only have
 worth while purpose, which would
 be to create the opportunity for
 fair dealing and full understand-
 ing between nations. We hope the
 mutual toughness between Russia
 and America will not progress
 to the hopeless stage where both
 are bound into until the disas-
 trous end of both.

We hope Mr. ByRNES is cogni-
 zant of the fact that as a nation
 it is for us to be firm, and we hope
 it is for us in his mind for real-
 ization of the fact that a nation
 which purports to preach peace
 cannot practice militaristic expan-
 sionism without making its
 preaching seem false. We hope
 that Mr. ByRNES will be matched
 against the Dardanelles, and the
 atomic bomb against the commu-
 nist fifth column, and America's
 proposed bases looking down the
 throats of both Europe and Asia
 be balanced against Russian
 spheres of military influence in
 Asia Europe.

That is the full kind of settle-
 ment, the abandonment of all
 these mutual efforts at domina-
 tion, which we must have if we
