Proposal on Housing Bids for Attention

McConaughy Advocates State Foot Tax Bills For Five Years on Houses Rented Vets

Hartford, Oct. 17.—A Republican proposal that the state foot the tax bills for five years on housing made available at moderate rentals to World War II veterans made a bid for attention today in the Connecticut political campaign.

The plan was advocated by Dr. Jesse L. McConaughy, the G.O.P. gubernatorial nominee, in a radio address last night, while most of the other leading candidates were participating in a political forum at Norwich, which, while unusual in that it brought no many rivals to the same stage, produced little that hadn't been said before.

McConaughy said that under his proposal private enterprise would construct the housing, and the state would pay local tax bills for the years provided the builders or owners pay the tax savings on to the veterans in the form of reduced monthly rentals. He indicated it would cost the state \$20,000 annually for each million dollars worth of construction.

The plan, he said, would "permanently" protect veterans on a rental basis within their means and also stimulate the building industry in the building trades."

He said it would be one of his "most important recommendations to the next Legislature," and, sponsored by the Norwich Town Hall, an association of local business, Democrat, Socialist, and Socialist-Labor tickets.

Gov. Raymond E. Baldwin, the Republican incumbent, announced, developed much of his address to an appeal for unity on foreign policy, and in a brief discussion of domestic affairs, reiterated that the time has passed for "confusion" to be the trademark of the Truman administration.

Security for Greece At Core of Dispute

Extent of Soviet Influence in Bulgaria Major Point of Contention Over Treaty

(Editor's note: This is the second of a series of related articles on the significant sections of proposed treaties between Bulgaria and Greece, which will be discussed in subsequent issues of this newspaper. The first issue was published on Oct. 15.)

For the reason of "Greek security," the western powers fought the Bulgarian frontier, Ambassador J. J. G. C. of the United States said.

"Greek territory east of Salonica is long and narrow and lateral communications are in some places within arbitrary range of the Bulgarian frontier. There is a prohibition against permanent fortifications on the Greek territory which will certainly contribute to Greek security."

No need for fortification, said the conference adopted a clause in the Bulgarian treaty upholding the principles of free navigation on the 1,700-mile long Danube river. This prime European waterway has been almost stagnant since the end of the war, because of the broken bridges and other ravages of war left in the East.

The western powers contend that the waterway has not been restored to its former traffic of nearly four million tons of freight per year because Russia does not want communications passing from the west into territory now occupied by Soviet troops.

The clause in the treaty pertaining to the Danube calls for a conference of the Big Four nations and the states through which the river flows to set within six months after the signature of the peace a permanent commission to study the river and establish a permanent body to control the vital waterway.

Both occupied by Bulgarians, Bulgarian soldiers, British troops were Yugoslavians and Greece because these two countries both were adjudged to have suffered about the same amount of damage.

Armed through Bulgaria, shortly after the Russian occupation returned King George II to his throne, a civil war broke out in the province and the region of the Peace conference remarked publicly that the revolutionaries were being armed through Russian-occupied Bulgaria.

The Peace conference was unable to agree on a new frontier between Bulgaria and Greece. In fact, this argument produced the only walkout of the conference when the Slav bloc got up and strode from a commission meeting when a vote was demanded on a phase of the boundary issue.

These issues were decided:

1. Bulgaria must pay reparations amounting to \$150 million divided equally between Yugoslavia and Greece over a period of six years.
2. Bulgaria must pay United Nations national which interests were destroyed or damaged in the war on a basis of 75 per cent of the total loss.
3. Bulgaria is forbidden to use or experiment with atomic weapons or to operate torpedo boats along her Black sea coastline.
4. Bulgaria will give most favored nation treatment to all the United Nations.
5. Racial discrimination among minority groups—such as Jews—will be avoided.
6. The Danube river will be open to navigation.

Opposed by Slav Bloc

The Slav bloc—Russia, Ukraine, Byelorussia, Czechoslovakia, Poland and Yugoslavia—opposed every one of the above clauses. Otherwise, the Bulgarian treaty was adopted with little argument.

Behind the fight over these six points in the Bulgarian treaty was the conflict over Greece, the last of the Balkan treaties that is outside the Soviet sphere.

The western democracies were determined to bring down the door on dominating Bulgaria, a natural jumping-off place against Greece which had provided a springboard for invasion so many times in the past.

Program Develops Qualities That Make Them Fully Fit for Life

Manchester Girl Scouts, incorporated, offers girls from seven to eighteen years of age, a program that develops in them self-reliance, resourcefulness and initiative. Controls Taken Off Cloth Lame

Washington, Oct. 17.—(AP) Price controls are gone today from metallic cloth lame—the stuff that makes evening clothes glitz, hats, dante and blouses sparkle.

Chasing the lambs from American-made and imported textiles is a luxury "chubby" because the tariffing quality of the metal threads give it short life. OPA said its control action applies to all such cloth containing at least 25 per cent of the metallic yarn.
