Dutch Lad Describes Brutal Nazi Tortures

Theodore Vissers of Rotterdam, Holland, escaped from slave labor camp; visits here

The past year has produced many thrilling stories of inhumanity, brutality, sorrow, pain and misery, but none sadder than that of a young Dutch lad—Theodore Vissers of Rotterdam, Holland, who has a checked life through as thrilling a series of experiences as any 18-year-old ever passed.

Young Vissers is here today as the one told yesterday by the one who told it. He is a young man, 18 years old, and his name is Theodore Vissers of Rotterdam, Holland, who has a checked life through as thrilling a series of experiences as any 18-year-old ever passed.

Theodore Vissers was born on Feb. 2, 1928 in Paterson, N. J., the youngest of three children of John W. Vissers, then living in Paterson. At the age of 27 months he was taken to Rotterdam, Holland, and to Rotterdam.

His father, Theodore, was a degree what was to be the fate of the men and women of the Lowland country a little more than a decade afterward, they would have probably been in the boat before boarding the ship to the old country.

The "Black Devils" held Rotterdam safely in this first invasion by air, the youngster said, but more was in store for the Rotterdam natives.

Rotterdam surrendered. In an effort to save the people of the city the Germans threatened the city's water supply. The whole center of the city was flooded and the water supply cut off. The Germans began all over and the air brigades tried to put out the flames but the German bombers coming in from the German side in dress and strafed the streets of the city. The beautiful city of Rotterdam, which had previously surrendered to the Germans, later rested in the ruins and in death uncounted.
