(By using the veto, any of the big bowers can block the Security council—and therefore the United Nations—from taking military action or any action against it, the big power, in time of trouble.)

The General Assembly also is expected to consider a plan to create a world health organization with full international exchange of medical knowledge.

This mesting of the Assembly may weaken or strengthen U. N. That will depend upon the way the nations vote.
