Unable to get the two out of Poland legally, Mrs. Dmochowska testified, she tried in vain to get them jobs as embassy chauffeurs and then to procure them embassy uniforms.

Gerald Keith, U. S. charge d'affaires here, would not comment on her testimony. He said he would give the State department a full report on the trial.

United States citizen who has admitted plotting the escape of two confessed Polish political assassins, is expected to end here Friday.

The prosecution has indicated that the military tribunal trying her and five Polish men may give its verdict the same day. The trial, begun Monday, grew out of a fatal shooting in London last December of Boleslaw Sobolewski, secretary general of Vice Premier Stanislaw Mikolajczyk's opposition Polish peasant party.

Free To Facilitate Escape Mrs. Dmochowska, tall, 34-year-old one-time Chicago, said on witness stand that she used her translator's job in the U. S. embassy here to try to help the escape from Poland of Wieslaw Pionki and Boleslaw Panski, accused and admitted participants in the killing of other defendants are Waldemar Caspriski and Wladyslaw Kotowski.

"I was swayed by sentiment and by love of humanity," Mrs. Dmochowska explained. She said she was sorry for what she had done.

Mrs. Dmochowska said a school director she knew sent Pionki, Panski and others to her home here, where they told of the killing and she talked over their troubles with an embassy telephone operator, Mrs. Sophie Urban, sister of Casimir Zedko of Chicago.
