There may be no need henceforth for immense bombing planes capable of carrying gigantic loads. A small plane the size of today's fighter will be



able to carry one atomic bomb, packing the punch of an entire squadron of the past war's

(3) Radar and television are now being used to flight-test jet fighters. Controlled from the ground or from a "mother" plane, the craft can maneuvered beyond the limits of safety applicable when a human pilot is carried Latest navigation sids include a radar device which pictures the surrounding country on a screen when the ground is obscured by clouds from the pilot. A wartime development, it aided omber, crews in finding their targets. Air liners will soon make use of similar devices
