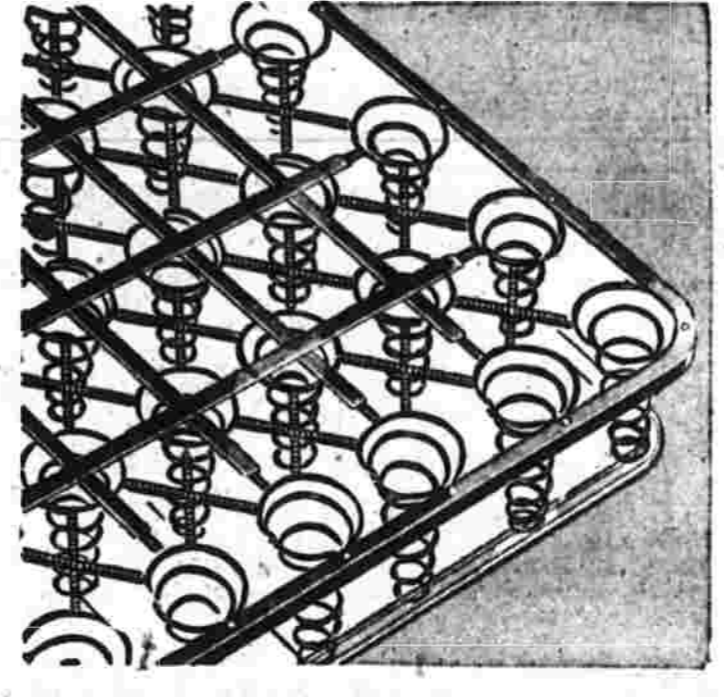
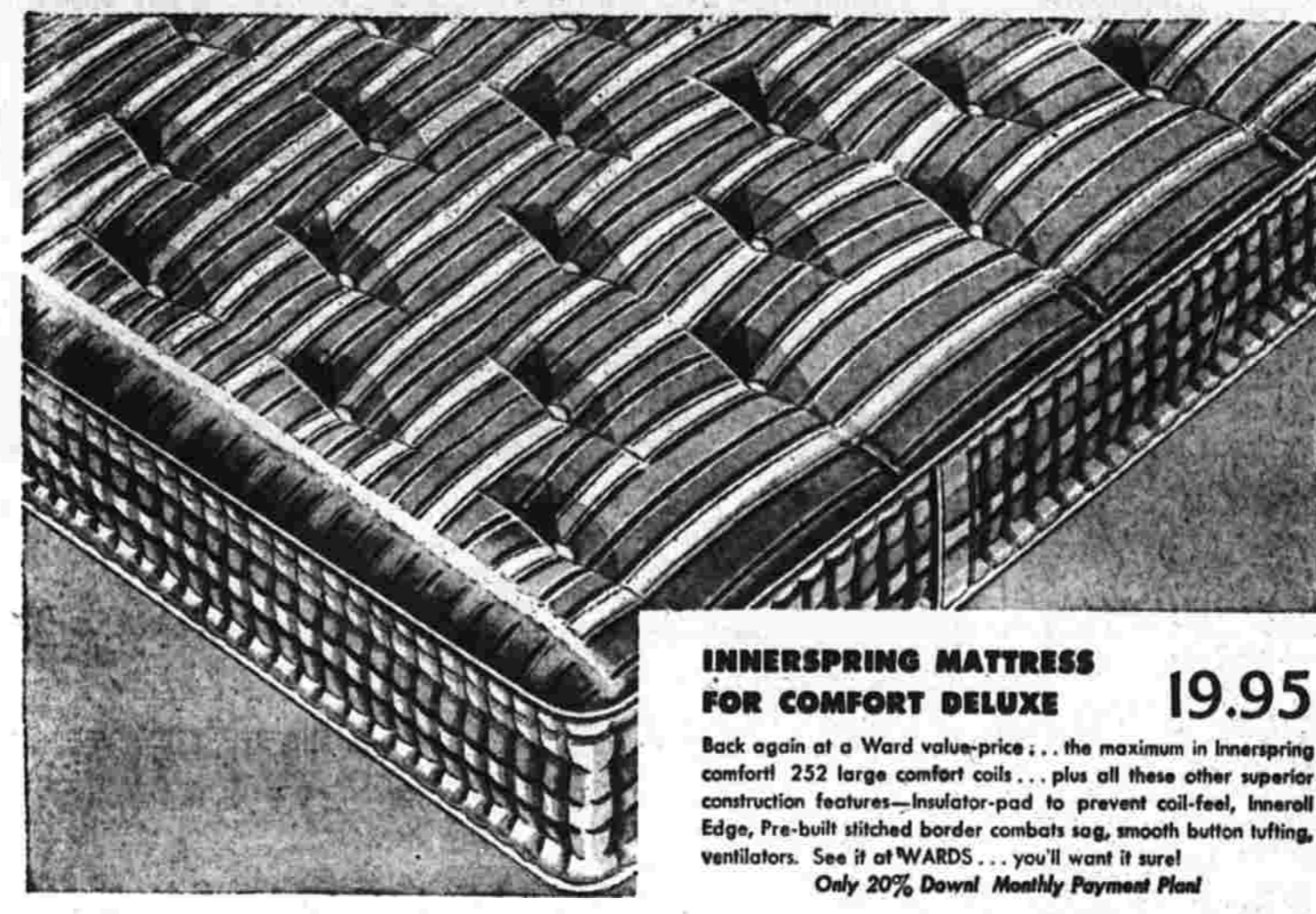
Trio Will Face Murder Charges

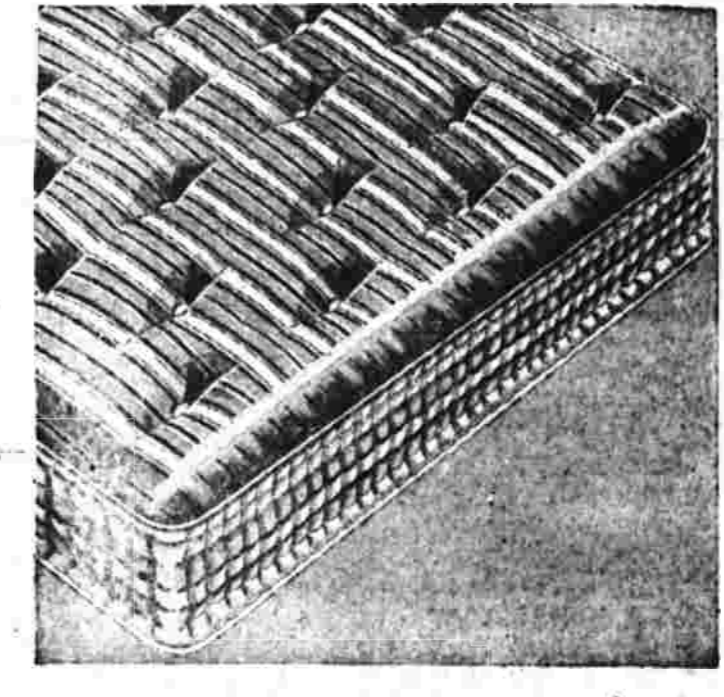

Christianity Divided

Some weeks ago, we commented at length on a statement on Russian-American relations issued by the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America.

This statement had several salient and important points, which we welcomed and approved. First, although it admitted the differences of belief between Russia and the western world, differences which it found to be aggravated by more practical clashes in the field of power politics, it contended that we should not merely concern ourselves with what Russia should do in order to end such clashes, but should also "judge" the "harder" and "Christian" way of thinking first of what ourselves can do. Our effort, it said, "should be to create for Russia our own national political features which cannot be morally or intellectually justified."

Second, the Federal Council statement said that "change is not of itself evil" and warned that American policy, no matter how much it might and should condemn those Russian policies which have offended "political, intellectual and religious liberty," should nevertheless be careful not to "cloak a selfish desire on the part of those who want peace to be a static condition to bear down on all who seek change."

Third, the Federal Council statement noted that both Russia and the United States are still thinking in terms of geographical security and seeking such security in ever-widening spheres which interlap to make the defensive measures of each seem offensive to the other. The Federal Council recommended, therefore, that "the United States should set an example by renouncing the acquisition of new military bases so far distant from the continental United States and so close to the Soviet Union."

Fourth, the Federal Council statement pleaded for real world disarmament.

In other sections of its statement, the Federal Council noted that neither the United States nor Russia has yet achieved a perfect economic system, that in Russia, individual freedom, while ours fails to guarantee steady employment, "no economic system that now exists," said the statement, "can properly be treated as wholly the expression of wholly the negation of Christian principles."

Finally, the Federal Council recommended the end of intolerance between conflicting beliefs, the elimination from United States policy of "certain prejudices and practices which unnecessarily create tensions," the cooperation of the American and Russian peoples at the "scientific, economic, cultural and religious levels," and "demonstration that democratic institutions which reflect the Christian doctrine of the sacredness of the individual personality can be made so vigorous and life-giving that all peoples will want them."

We have made this long summary of the statement of the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America because this statement, although made several weeks ago, belongs alongside a new statement on the Russian problem, this one issued last week and by the Catholic Bishops of the United States.

This latter statement is interesting and significant, and the comparison between the two statements is doubly so. Where the Federal Council statement discussed many issues, making them all, some tolerant, self-analytical routes toward international growth in the direction of

Understanding and mutual respect which leads to the mass for peace. The other division of Christianity believes that there can be no mutual respect between anything like Russia and Christian democracy. Unless those who bear the responsibility of world leadership are in basic agreement on what man is, there is no way of justifying and conflict which block the road to real peace. Clashes on the question of boundaries, national security, minority safeguards, free movement of trade, easy access to raw materials, progressive disarmament and the control of the atomic bomb, important as these are, take a second place to the need of unity in protecting man in the enjoyment of his God-given native rights.

Compromise might be possible, say the Catholic Bishops, "if the fate of man, as man, did not hang in the balance." And on this issue on the "question of man," the Bishops believe "there can be no compromise."

On this issue, that of the same "Christian doctrine of the sacredness of the individual personality" which the Federal Council states so vigorously that all peoples would come to respect it and want it, the statement of the Catholic Bishops stakes everything. Nothing can happen right, there can be no solution of the world's problem, the Catholic Bishops contend, unless there is basic agreement on this basic issue.

What the Catholic Bishops are asking, then, is that Russia accept the same definition of man, and of his rights, as that held by the United States. This seems to be the only basis for peace offered in the statement of the Catholic Bishops.

If there is, in the whole statement, no suggestion of just how this is to come about, or no indication of how Americans may work toward it, that is perhaps one way of admitting that it is not going to take place.

Nor is it going to take place unless the communist concept of man, however much we may hate it, however repugnant it may be to us, is as deeply rooted in certain philosophies as is our own belief in the precious and sacred freedom and rights of man. It is in the concept of man and not in their faith, black though we may think that faith to be, any more than that of the Catholic Bishops, that the Russian is to make this one world religiously and philosophically.

Suppose we should say that the peace of the world does depend upon the conversion to our Christian point of view of these hundreds of millions of Moslems? Would we then consider peace possible on that basis?

The answer is, of course, that we would consider peace impossible, and war is inevitable. We are afraid that in the answer which is involved when the Catholic Bishops see peace possible only when Russia and the Christian world agree upon the nature and the rights of man, if peace depends upon such a philosophical agreement, peace is impossible, and war is inevitable.

It may be that the Catholic Bishops are wiser than their Protestant counterparts in the Federal Council of Churches, and that it is the truth that war is inevitable. It may be that the Catholic Bishops are correct in their assumption that such opposing political and religious philosophies cannot live peacefully in the same world, and the Federal Council mistaken in its theory that they can learn to live together, and often their differences in the process.

But what is here in view in these two statements, very clearly and not in the open, as the very important and the very serious cleavage between Protestant and Catholic thought on the subject of Russia. It is the sober and disheartening fact that Christianity is itself divided on the issue of communism. If communism is to be based upon averting the world, that division in the ranks of Christianity is an advantage beyond the wildest dreams of any Kremlin plotters.

Claims Drop For October

Biggest Decrease in Those Filed by Veterans of State

Hartford, Nov. 20.—(AP)—Claims for unemployment compensation decreased 3.7 per cent during October, as compared with the previous month, with the biggest decrease shown in those filed by veterans of the State Labor department reported today.

For the first time since December, 1945, the amount paid in unemployment benefits was less than that received by the State Labor department during October when it was \$1,811,990. Initial claims, which are filed at the start of new spells of unemployment, increased slightly to 11,502 from 11,304 in September.

The average size of payment for non-veterans was \$29.09 while the weekly amount paid veterans for total unemployment is fixed at \$20.

The number of unemployed claims filed during the last week in October was 15,004 of whom 8,135 were ex-servicemen. New Haven led the state with 2,774, followed by Hartford with 2,714 and Bridgeport with 2,374. Hartford had the greatest number of unemployed veterans with 1,526.

The biggest drop in claims were those filed by veterans, indicating that many are finding jobs. The October readjustment allowances compared with \$1,451,938 in September. Only 43 exhausted their maximum allowance, which is 92 weeks in most areas.

Of the 204,058 Connecticut men and women discharged from the armed forces by Nov. 1, 104,001 applied for readjustment allowances and 80,011 received one or more checks. Of this number only 441 used up their maximum allowance.

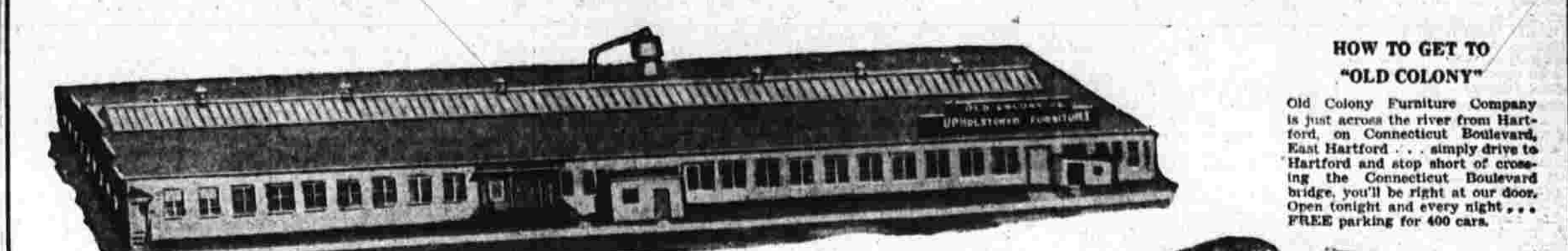
