More Lumber Is Available

Gradual Increase in Production Makes Enough For Essential Needs

Apparently we are going to produce enough lumber this calendar year to meet essential requirements, including the veterans housing needs; but there will be much left over for general stock in the local lumber yards.

Lumber production is going to be expected, according to the Civilian Production Administration, and it looks as though we are going to produce the thirty-three billion board feet called for last January to meet essential needs. In addition we are expected to produce about a billion feet this year.

August production was nearly 3 1/2 billion board feet, a record for the fourth month in succession that production exceeded three billion feet. But, although considerable lumbering is done through the winter months in the north, timber falls off over the country when cold weather from the north sends a long way from the more than forty billion feet level estimated to meet all needs and it will be several years before supply catches up with demand.

Our forests just aren't in condition to supply the full requirements needed right now. The lumber, trucks and saw teeth which are still in short supply.

Some added production is already beginning to come from National Forests and other public lands as a result of the access roads recently built into formerly inaccessible pockets of good old timber like we use to have. But there is a limit here, too. The roads for the immediate future is not summed up by the Civilian Production Administration.

It says that this year's 26 billion feet and imported lumber will meet essential needs, but it will not provide replacements to fill the great void in the lumber trade.

Sharp Warning Seen in Fight

Fuller Declares People Must Destroy Frankenstein of License

Hartford, Nov. 28 — (AP)—Alfred C. Fuller, president of the Manufacturers Association of Connecticut, today declared that "the present coal strike is more than a fight between John L. Lewis and the government."

It is another sharp warning to the people of this country," he asserted in a statement, "that they must destroy the Frankenstein of legislative license their representatives made available to unscrupulous labor leaders, or watch their economic freedom vanish in a few years."

"People To Blame For Cleavage" Much as I disapprove of Mr. Lewis' utter disregard for public welfare when it collides with his own selfish interests," continued Fuller, "it was the American people whose representatives created the mantle of legislative license which can be worn by any labor racketeer at will, who are to blame for the present class cleavage that will wreck our free economy sooner than we think."

Fuller said that the majority of the American people through their elected representatives created the Wagner labor relations act and the National Labor Relations board "in their zeal to rectify some of the claimed injustices" in the labor-management field.

"They thought they had created an equitable instrument of justice and justice for labor," he stated. "Since passage of the Wagner act in 1935, however, he said, "we have had the greatest plague of strikes ever known in the history of this country, with each year's strikes becoming more and more threatening to the whole economy and progressively more destructive to our living standards."

Fuller declared that "actually the Wagner act is one of private coal strike is more than a fight between John L. Lewis and the government."

"Government by Labor Leaders" "In effect," he continued, "we have had government by labor leaders representing small minority groups rather than by and for the people."

With legislative enactment giving license to excesses beyond the moral law," Fuller went on, "and with sympathetic govern-

ment administrators encouraging those excesses, and with the courts handing down decisions determined, not by the acts themselves but by what economic classes performed them, there is little opportunity for justice in labor disputes with large unions."

Fuller declared that "the effect of the courts to accept and literally apply the language of these later (labor) statutes without regard to established constitutional limitations has created a large body of legal nonsense which has driven clarity, simplicity and candor from the halls of justice."

Declaring that the problem of the people today "is to provide for large scale operations of work with freedom to the individual worker, Fuller asserted that "it is my honest conviction" that the following should be undertaken: repeal of the Norris-LaGuardia anti-injunction act; revise the Federal act to provide equal responsibility for both employers and unions; amend the anti-trust and anti-monopoly laws by with-

drawing exemptions now provided for unions prohibit industry-wide bargaining; and provide new procedures for dealing with labor disputes in public utilities and other basic industries which affect public health and safety.

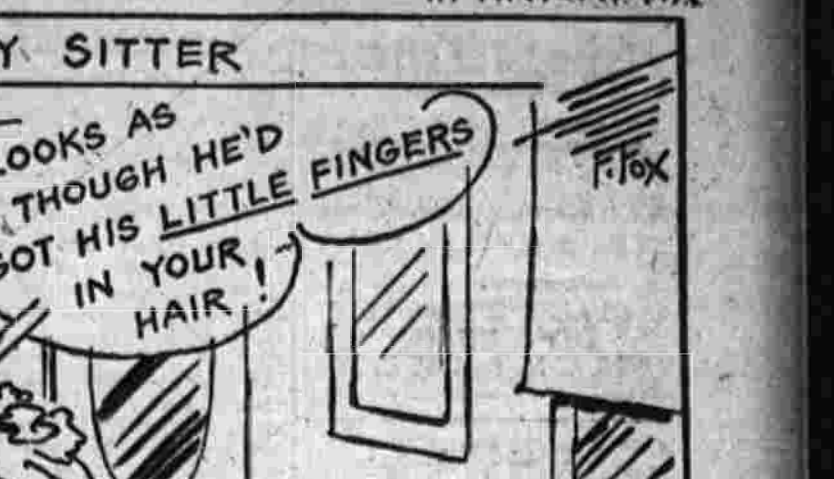
